
New OverDrive partnerships give you more titles!

The New Castle Library District has partnered with the Erie Public Library and Crawford County Federated Library System, allowing readers to access a much greater selection of ebooks and audiobooks.

To access the collections of the partnering libraries, look for "partner libraries" links on the <u>LAMB OverDrive Website</u>, in the Libby app, or in the classic OverDrive app.



You can sign in to the partner collections with your existing library card, and any items you check out will appear on your existing digital bookshelf. The number of items you can check out, the length of loan, and the number of holds you can place are based on the guidelines for the library from which you are borrowing the item.

Feature: The Girls of Atomic City by Denise Kiernan

"At the height of World War II, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, was home to 75,000 residents, and consumed more electricity than New York City, yet it was shrouded in such secrecy that it did not appear on any map. Thousands of civilians, many of them young women from small towns across the U.S., were recruited to this secret city, enticed by the promise of solid wages and war-ending work. What were they actually doing there? Very few knew. The purpose of this mysterious government project was kept a secret from the outside world and from the majority of the residents themselves. Some wondered why, despite the con-

stant work and round-the-clock activity in this makeshift town, did no tangible product of any kind ever seem to leave its guarded gates? The women who kept this town running would find out at the end of the war, when Oak Ridge's secret was revealed and changed the world forever. Drawing from the voices and experiences of the women who lived and worked in Oak Ridge, The Girls of Atomic City rescues a remarkable, forgotten chapter of World War II from obscurity. Denise Kiernan captures the spirit of the times through these women: their pluck, their desire to contribute, and their enduring courage. A recent <u>REALM</u> study shows that after six days of quarantine the SARS-CoV-2 virus is detectable on stacked library materials. In response to these new findings, GCCL will now quarantine most items for seven days. Items that have known holds on them will be quarantined, unstacked, for 3 days.

Returned items will remain checked out on your library card during the quarantine. You will not be assessed any overdue fines during these days. When the quarantine ends, staff will begin working with the materials to get them checked-in and back on the shelves, knowing that the risk of infection has passed for both staff and future users.

All items must be returned in the book drop. Please do not bring returned items into the library or hand them to library staff.

Upcoming Security and Device Support Changes for OverDrive



OverDrive On October 30, 2020, OverDrive is making necessary security upgrades to protect the privacy of user data. These updates mean certain devices with older operating systems will lose access to the OverDrive app and OverDrive websites.

HOW CAN I KEEP ACCESSING THE DIGITAL LIBRARY ON MY DEVICE?

ON MOBILE DEVICES

If possible, update your operating system to at least Android 5 (see Google's steps for updating your Android version) or iOS 5 (see Apple's steps for updating your iOS version). Please note that when you update your operating system, there's always a risk of losing access to other apps that may not be available for newer operating system versions.

Note: If your device uses a different operating system (other than Android or iOS), check the device settings or contact the manufacturer to see if a system update is available.


If you can't update your device's operating system, the OverDrive app and OverDrive websites will no longer work on that device after October 30.

However, if your device is an early Kindle Fire or other ereader, you'll still be able to read library ebooks that are delivered or transferred to it from a supported device.


ON WINDOWS 7 COMPUTERS

If you see the message about losing digital library access on a Windows 7 computer, you may need to install Windows updates and/or update your browser to the latest version to continue using OverDrive on that computer after October 30.

EXPORTING READING DATA

Along with sharing titles, the new Libby update allows users to export their reading data, including:

- Titles in a specific tag
- Their activity timeline
- A title's Reading Journey, which includes bookmarks, notes, and highlights

Readers can select how to export their data and use it how they'd like, whether that's posting a favorite tag to Twitter, graphing their 2020 reading stats, or revisiting notes & highlights for a book club.

Due to budget issues at the state level, the following ILL policies are in place:




- Two (2) items may be requested OR borrowed by a patron at one time.
