- (2) Erin called the meeting to order at 6:34 p.m.

- (4) Treasurer's Report: Erin noted there is \$78,932 in bank account. She and Scott paid some routine bills by check. Probably won't see any significant bills until April. Erin also noted she has sent an email to board members with the investment statements pertaining to all documented activity over the last five years.
- (5) Library Director's Report (from Scott):
