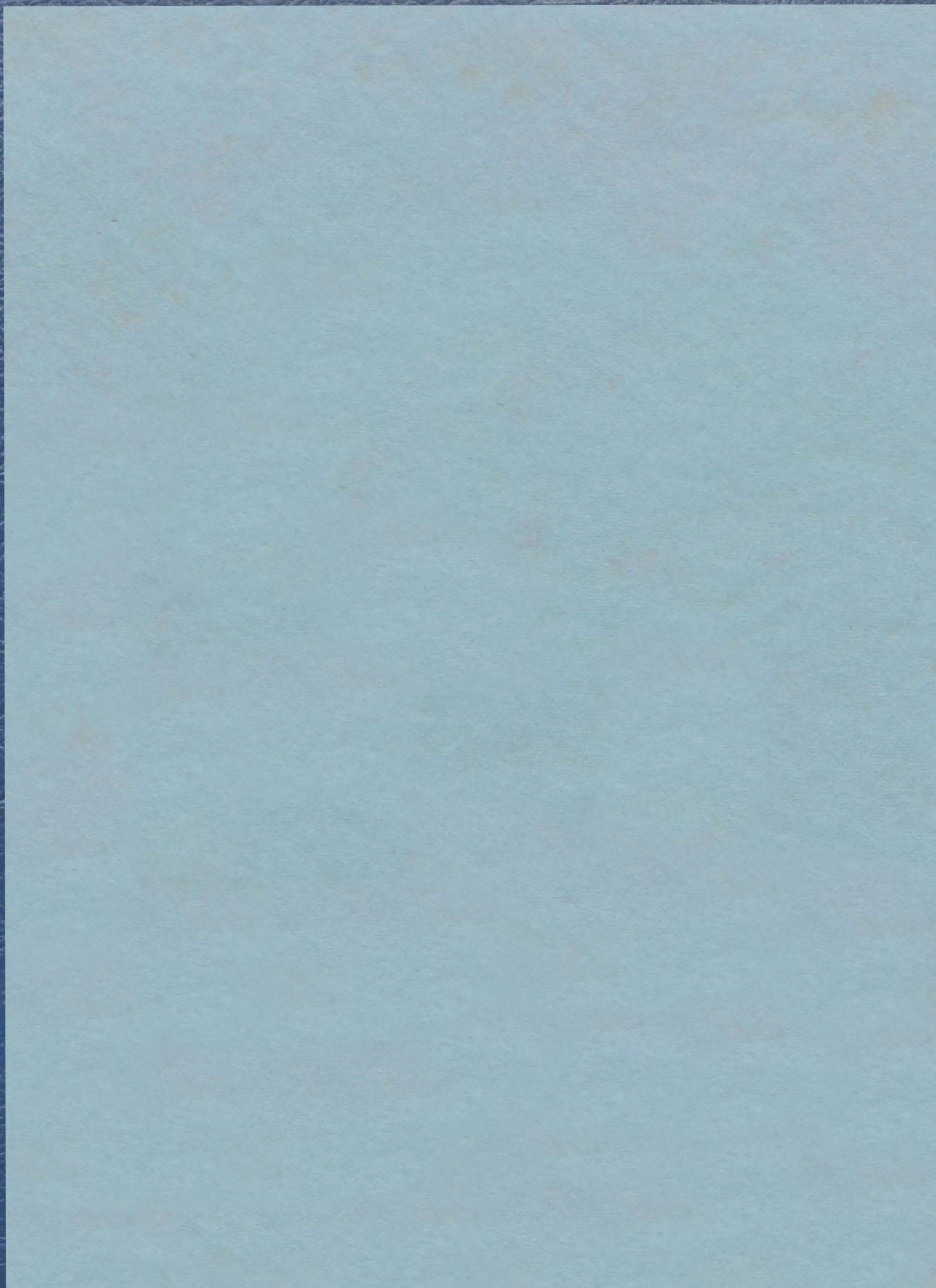

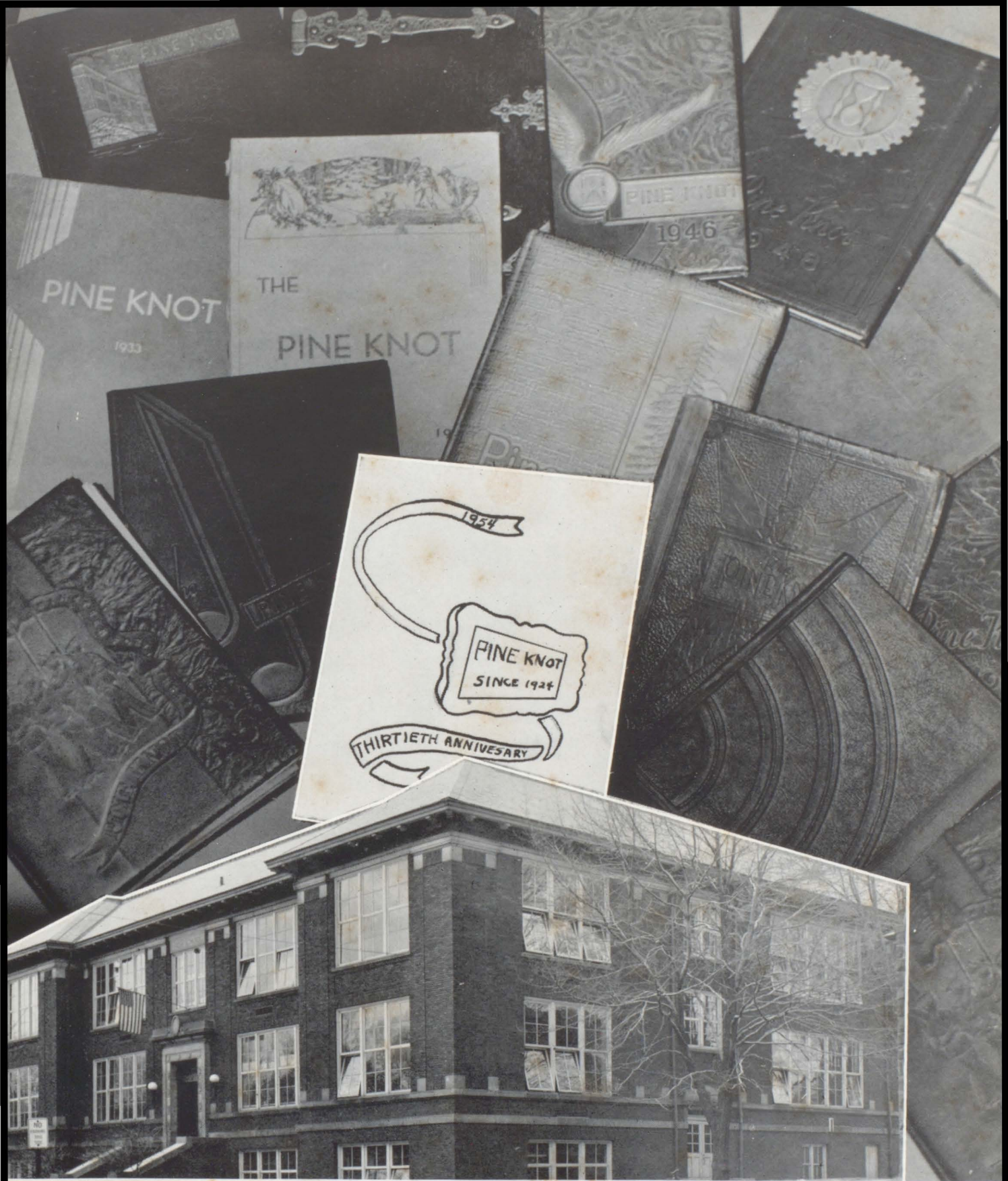

We have tried to picture for you the progress that has been made during these thirty years both in the curriculum and in the extra-curricular activities available to the students.



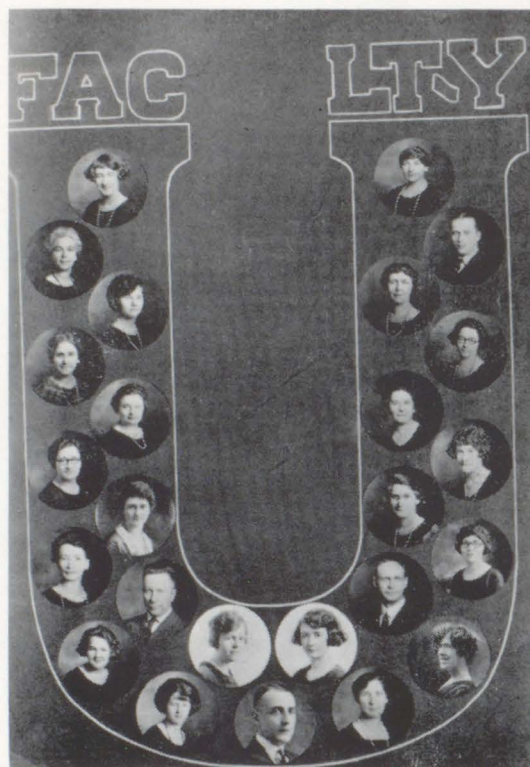

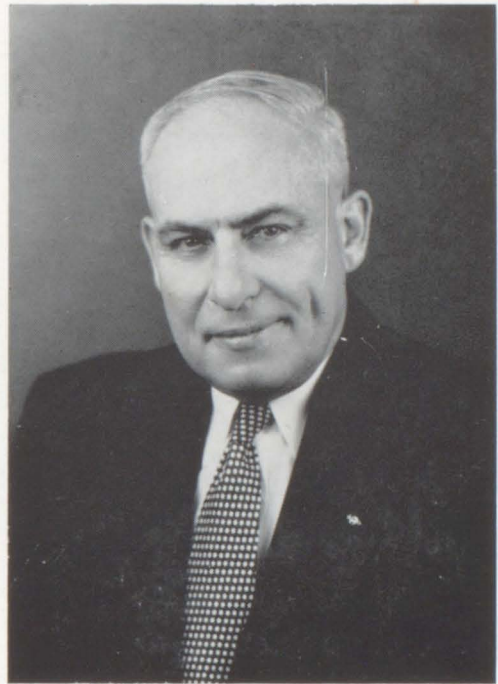

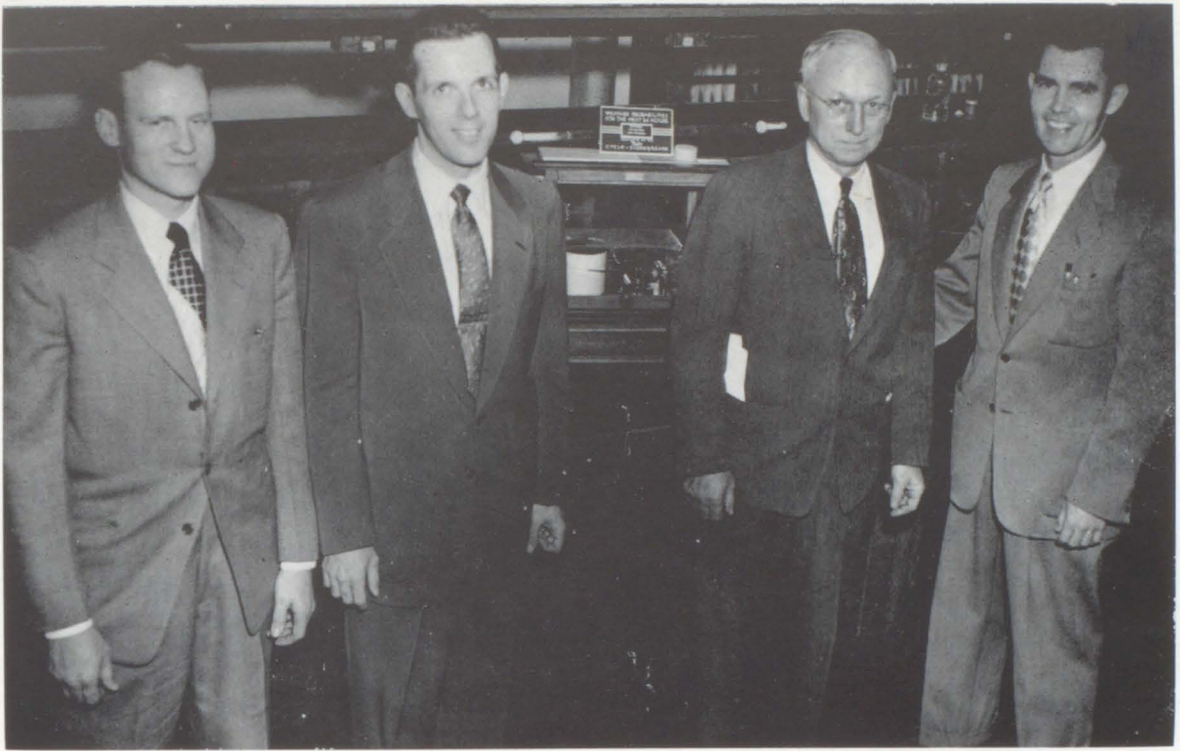

Delores Bain, Lee Clever, and Delores Aiman are trying to show their World History class the location on the wall map of the places they are now studying.

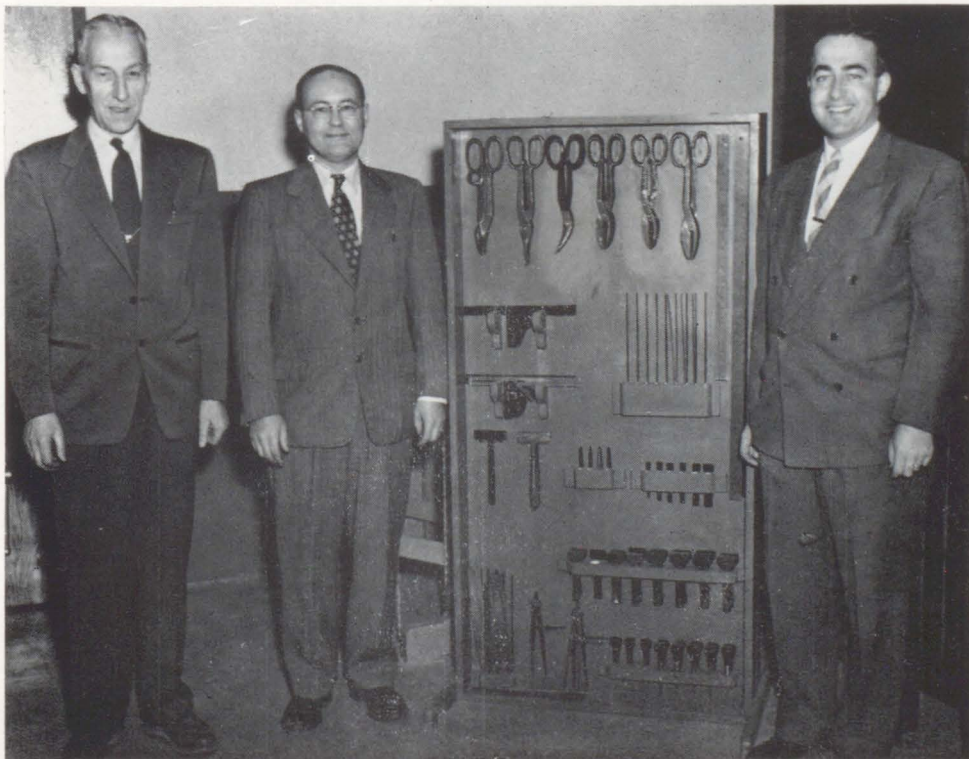

Our vocational department is headed by Mr. Glenn Miller, Mr. Paul Yoder, and Mr. Oscar Paden.

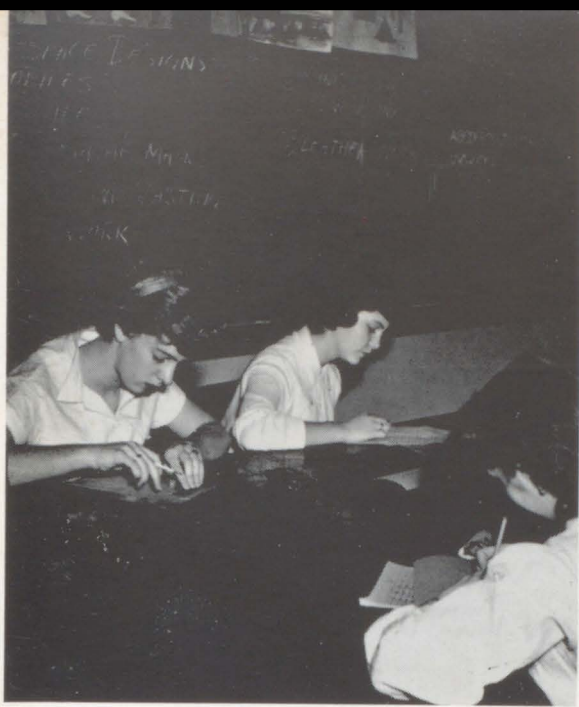

Mary Filer and Patty Dunmire in art class.

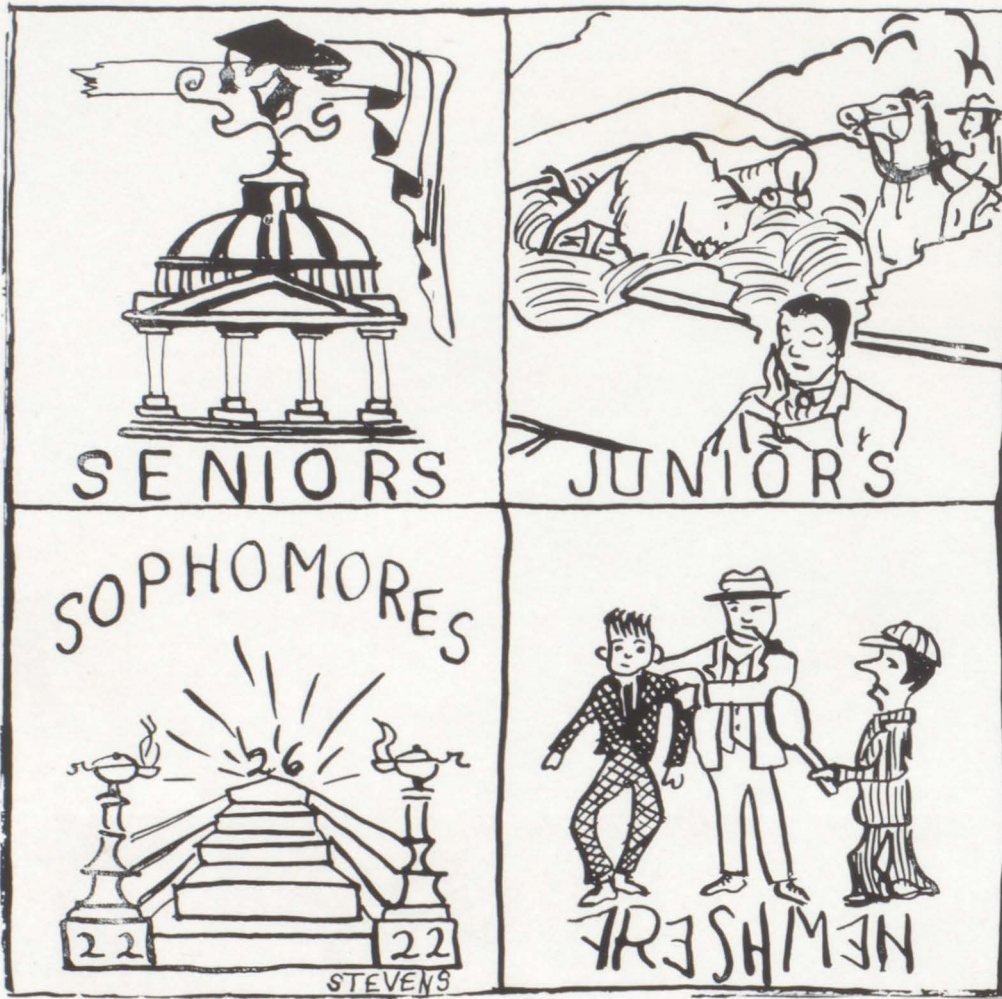

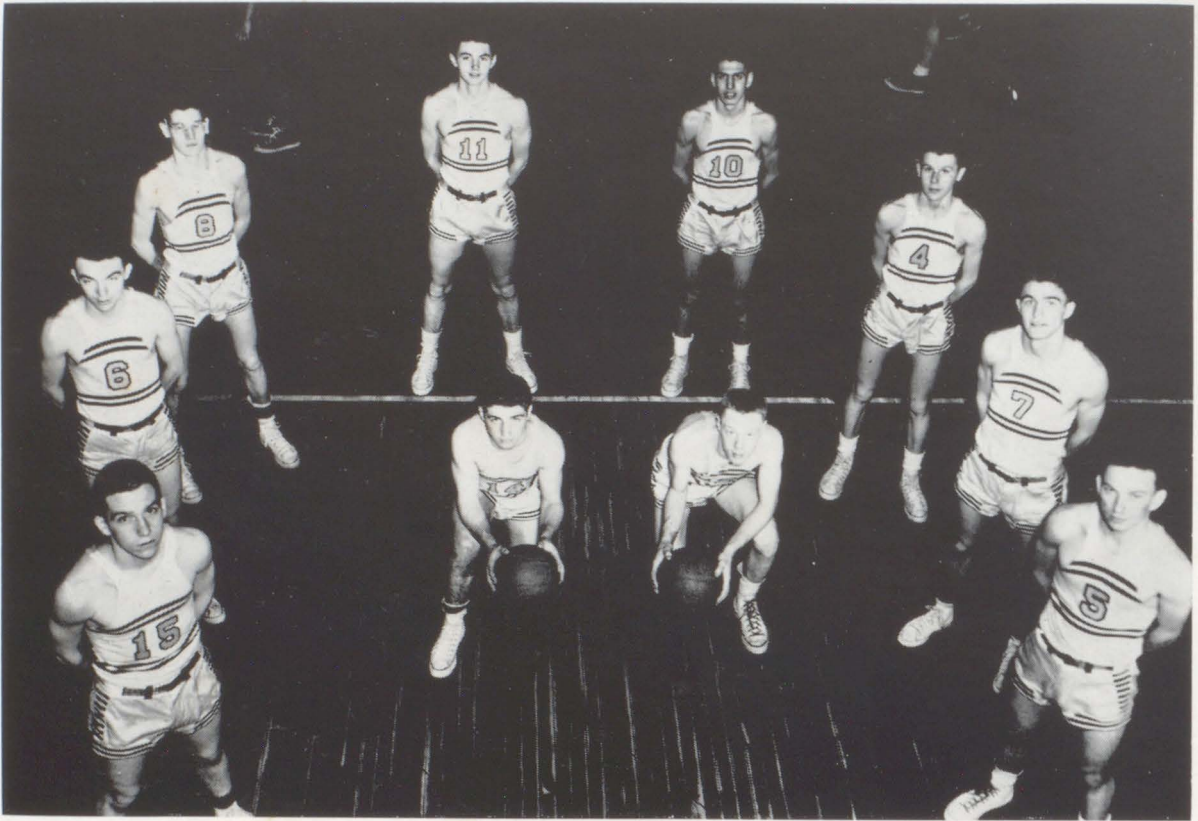

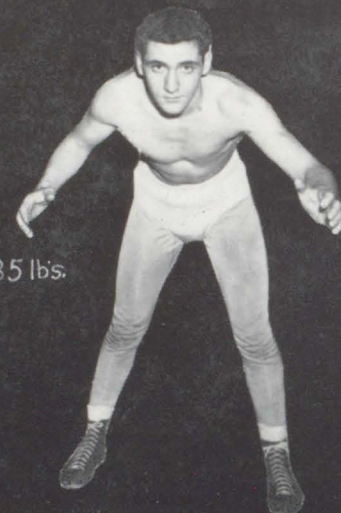

On February 28 Bob Richardson won the District 10 Tournament Championship, and Carlo DeMario was runner-up in the same Tournament.

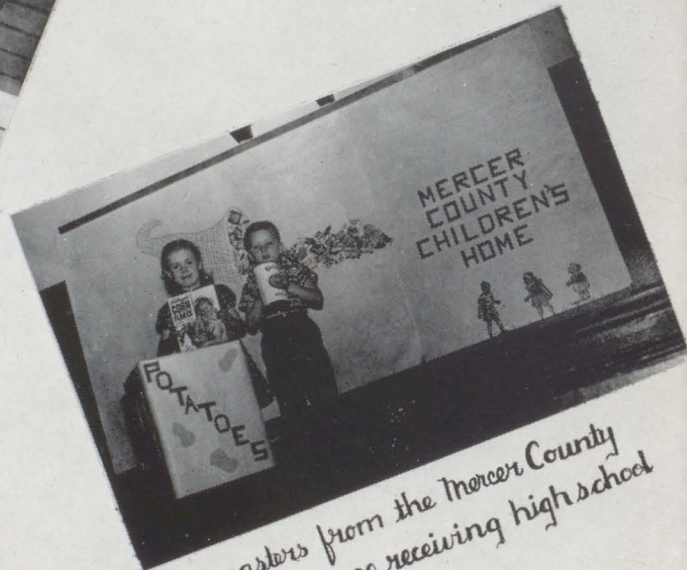
