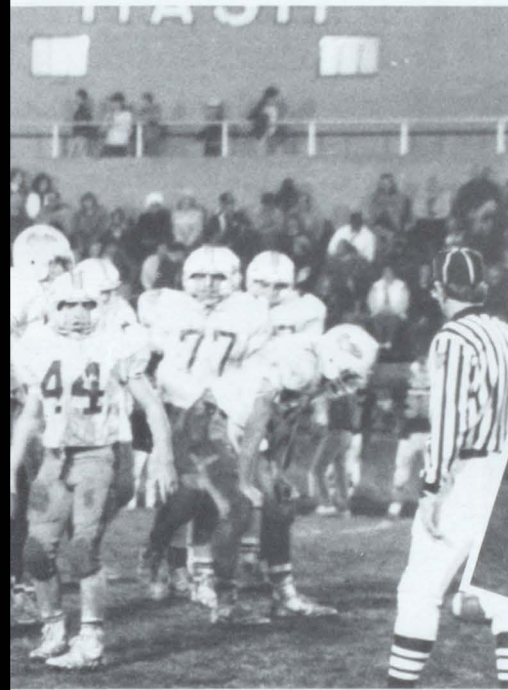

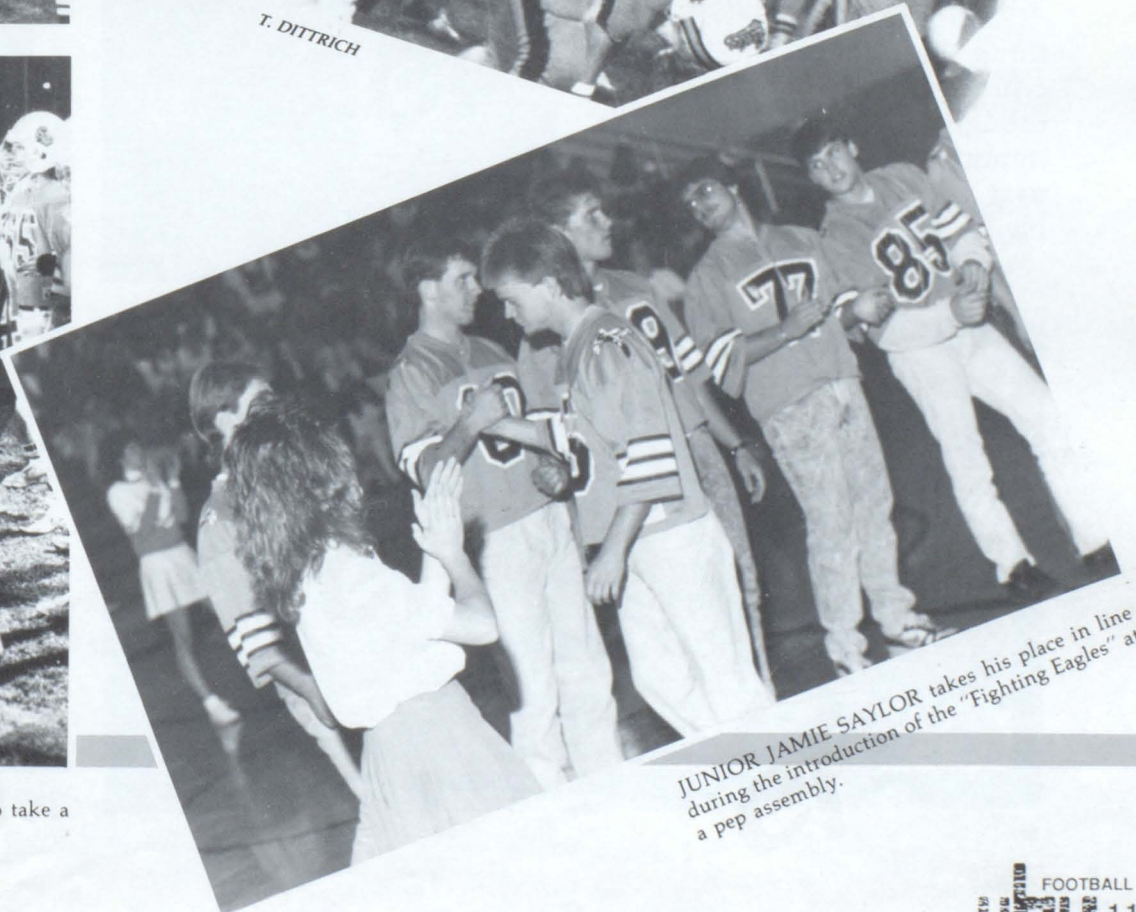

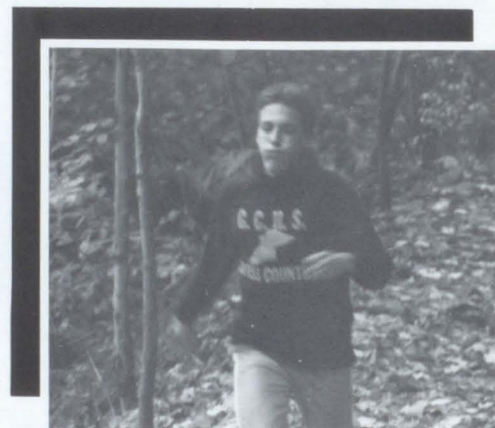
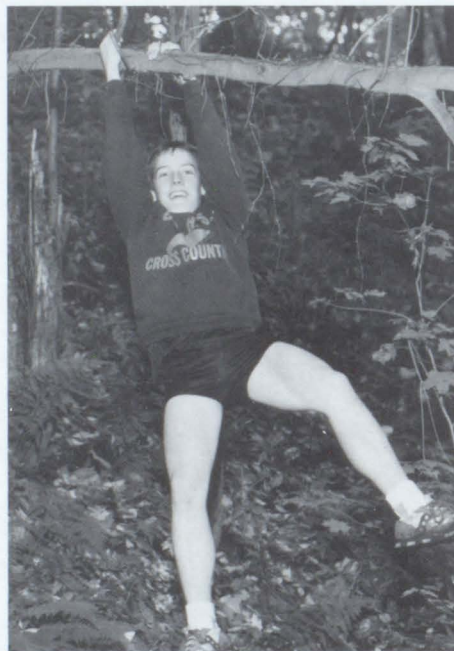
Undefeated Champs

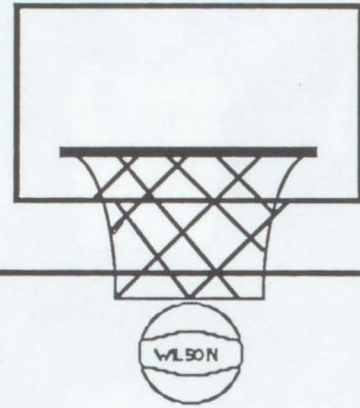

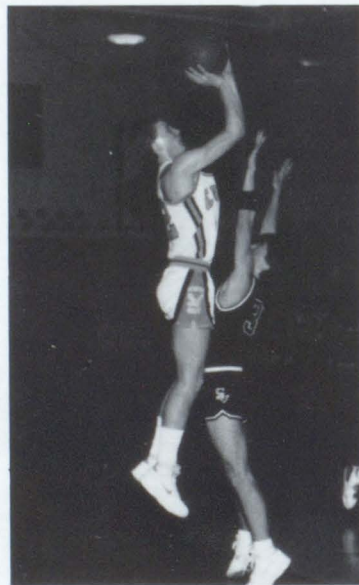

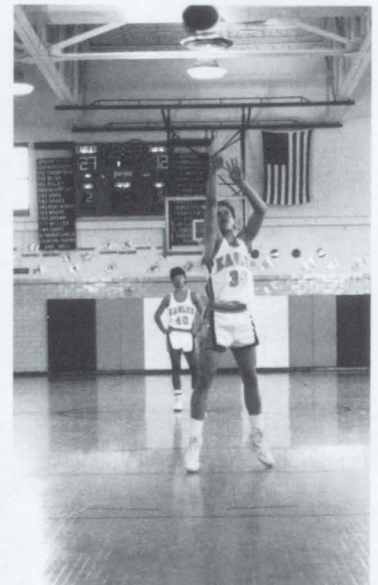

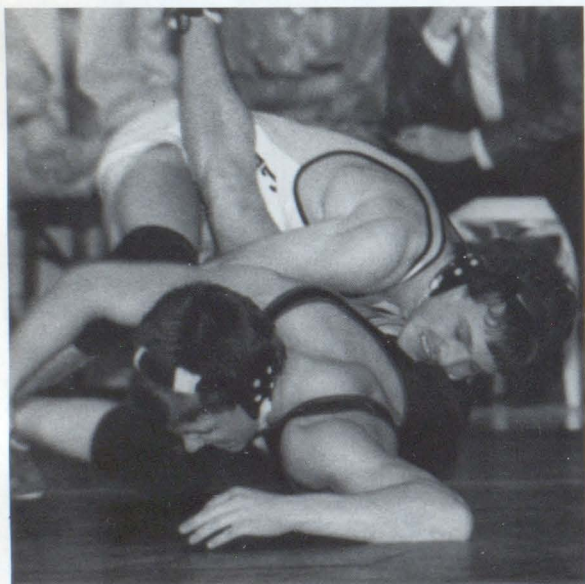

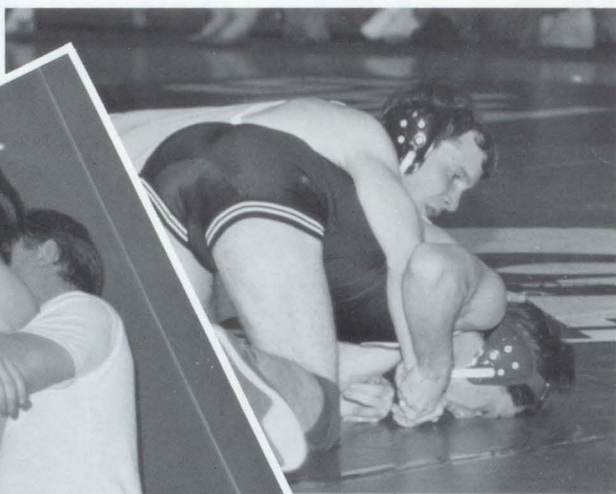

Guts and Determination

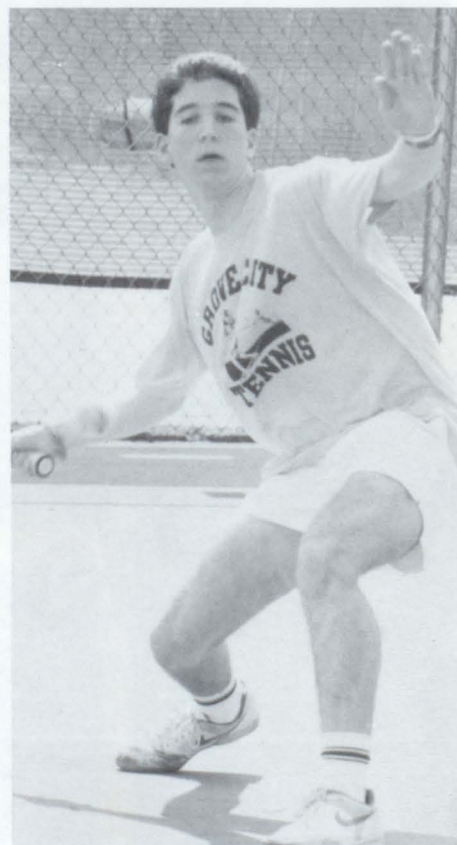

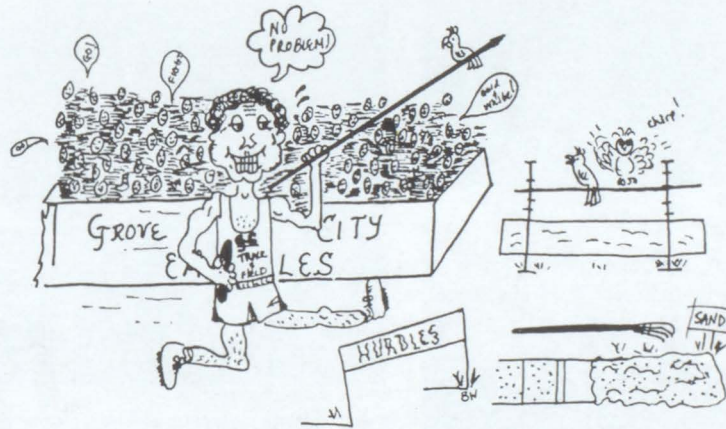

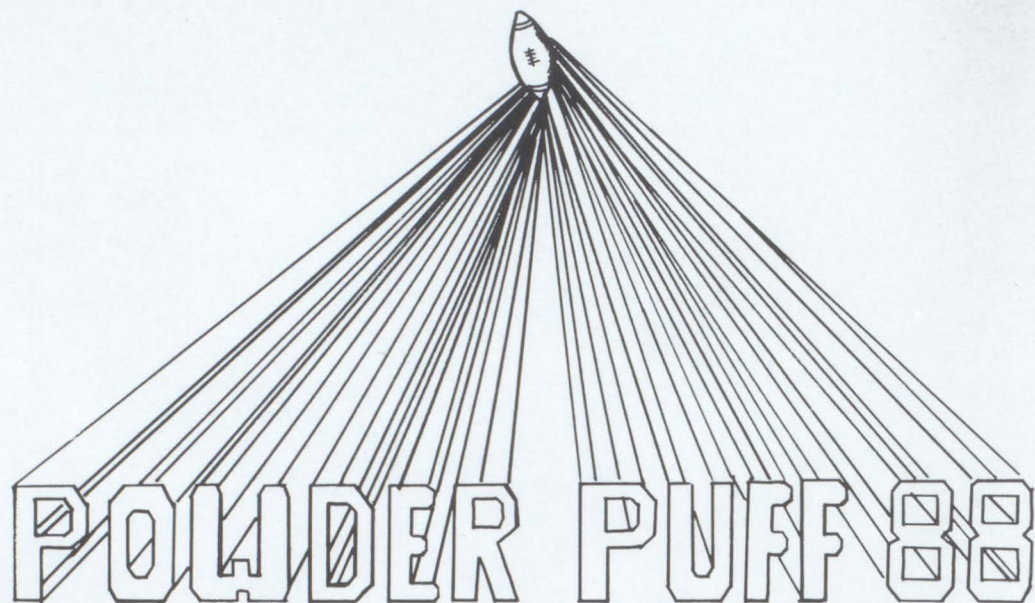

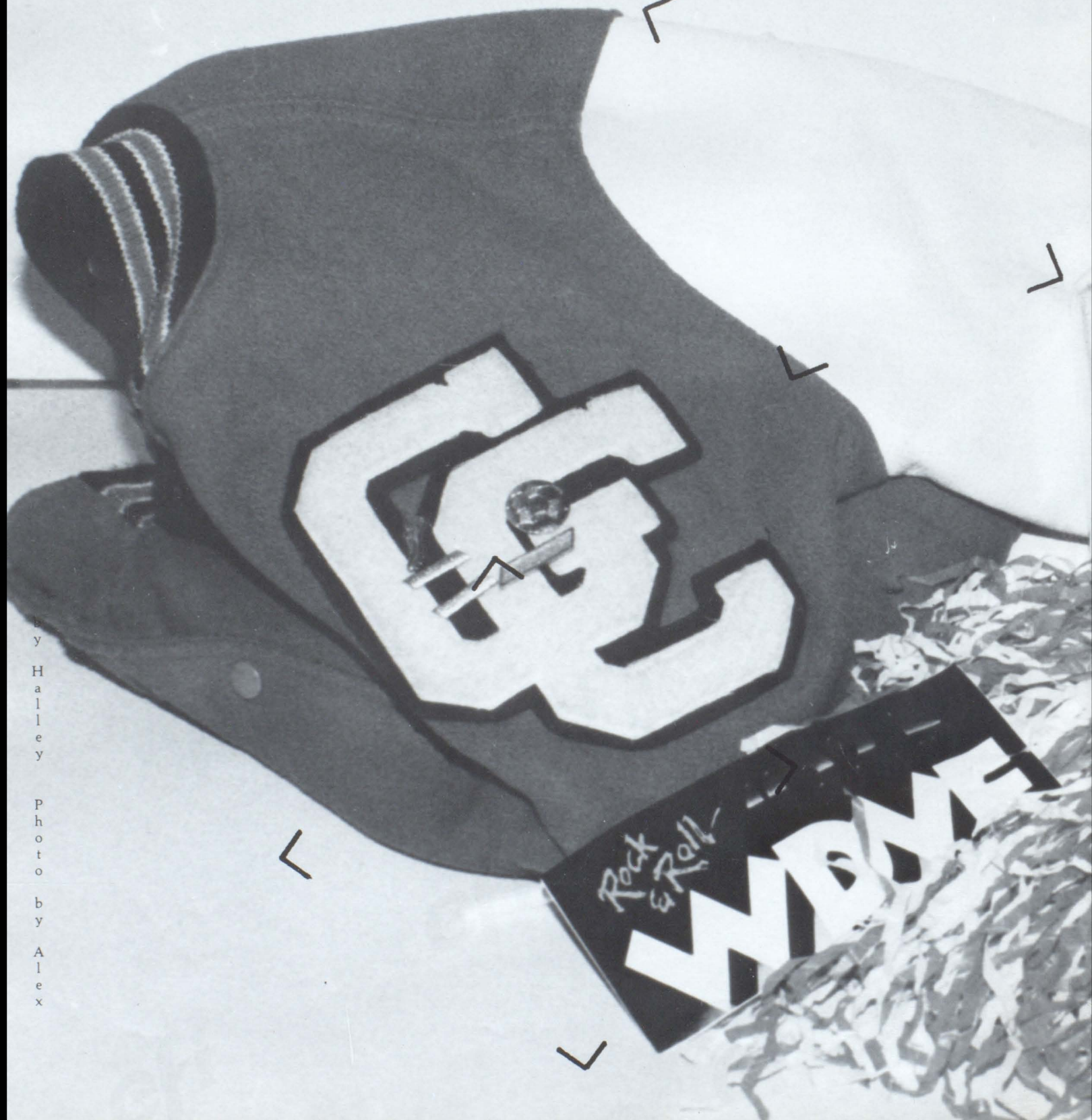

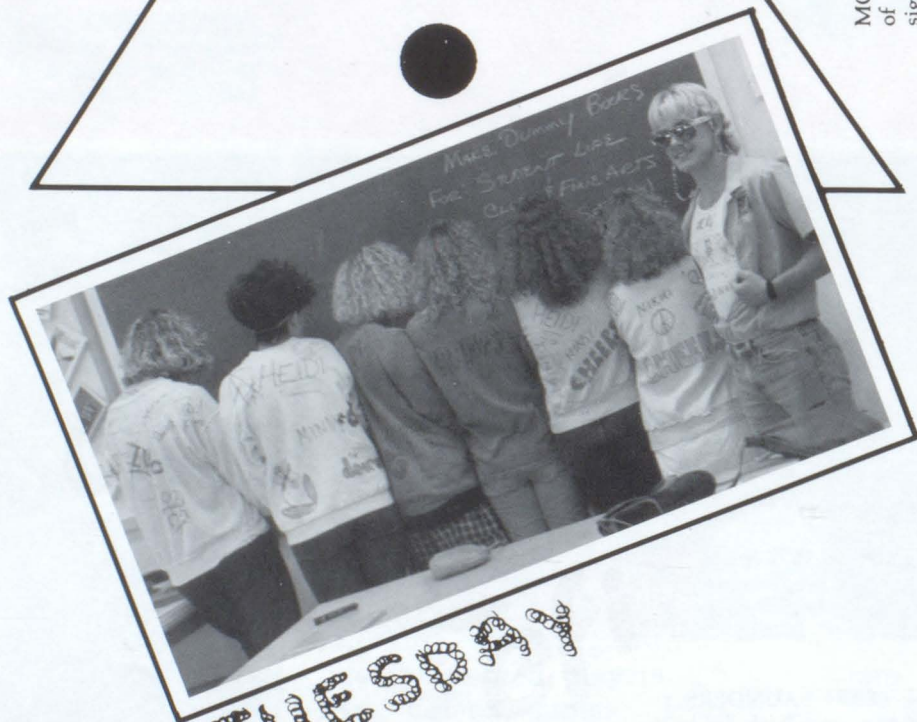

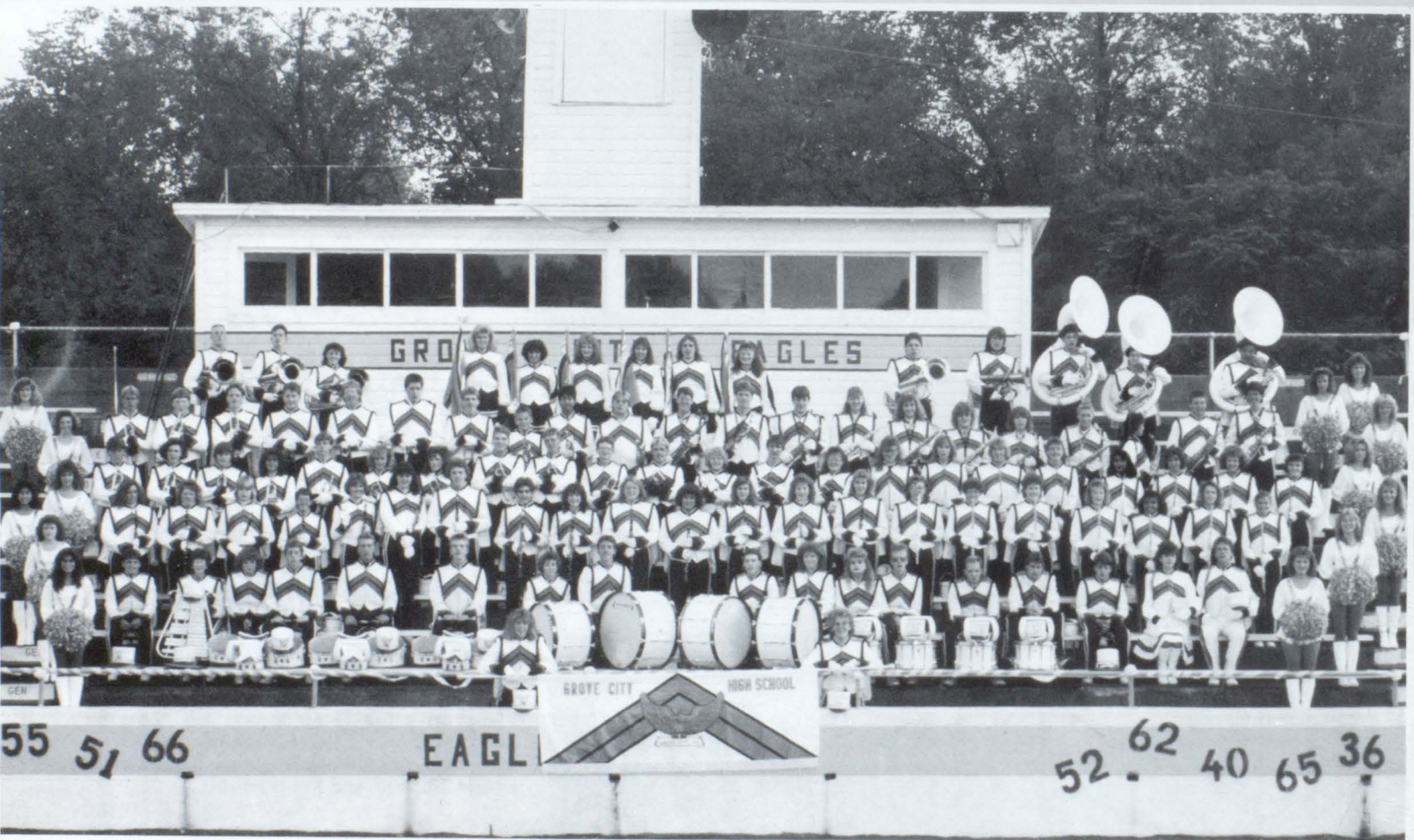

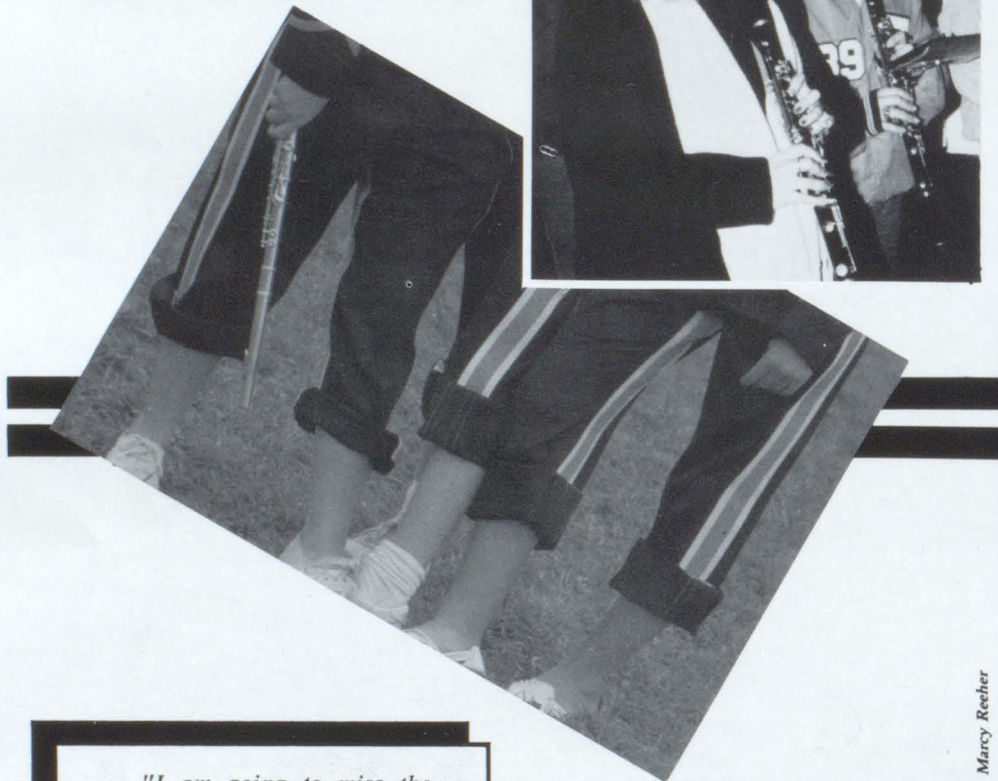

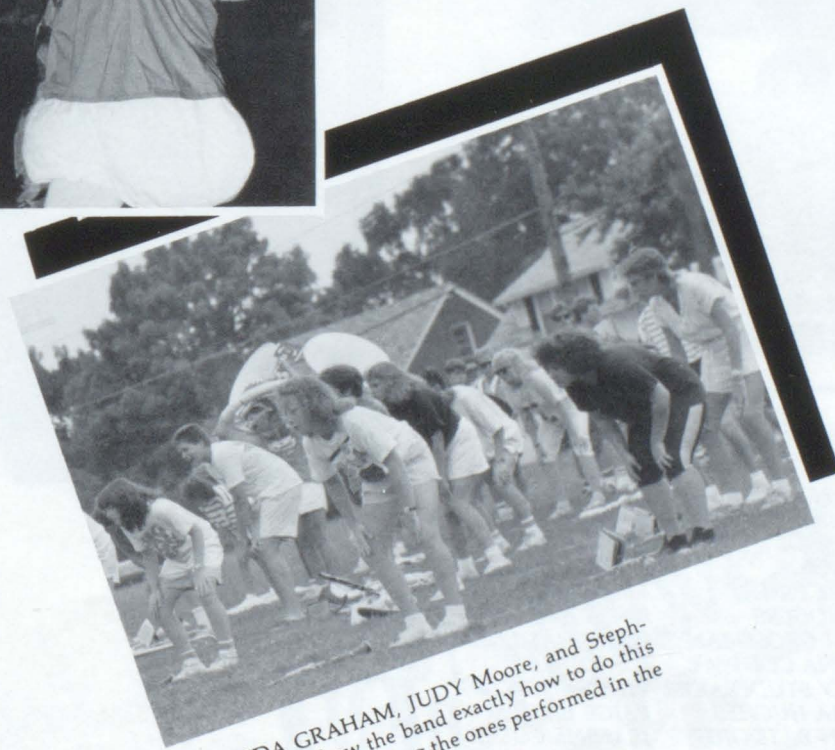
