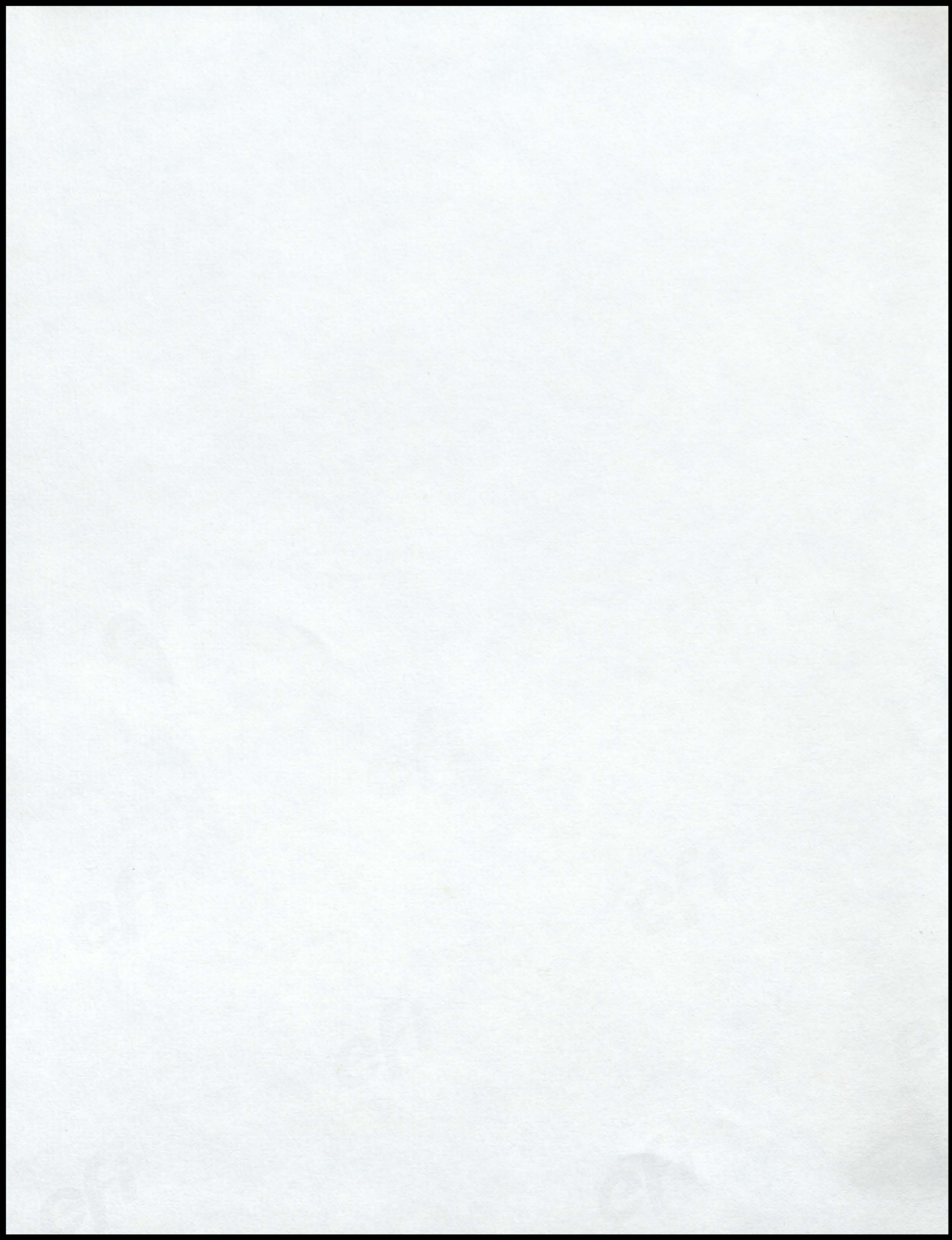

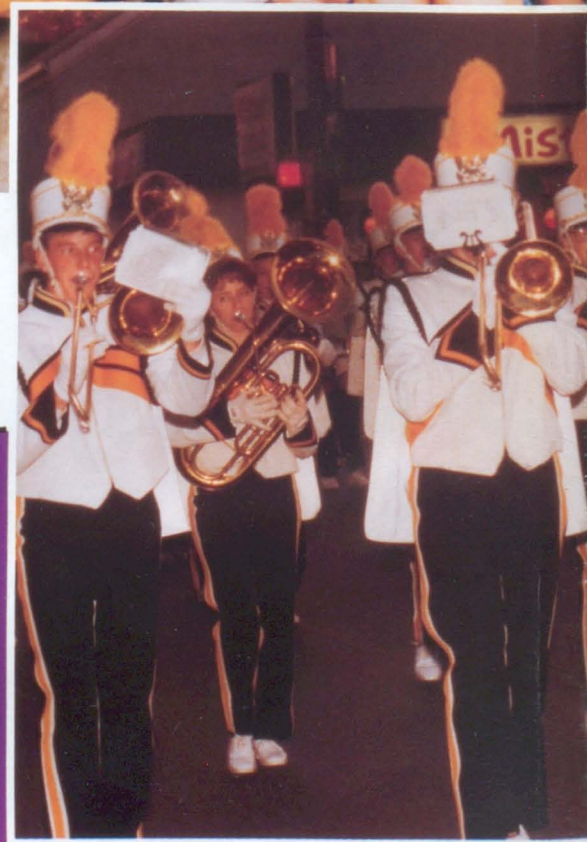

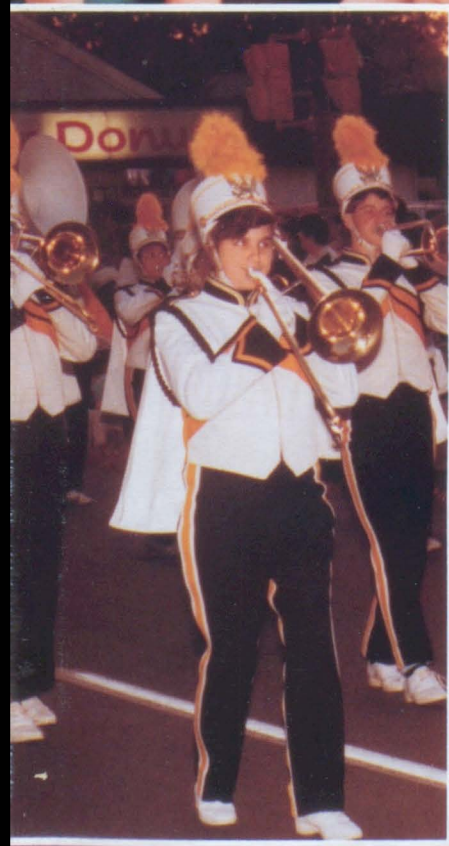






Full Of Smiles this group participated with the Garfield Jubilee Organization where they painted and fixed up homes for the poor.

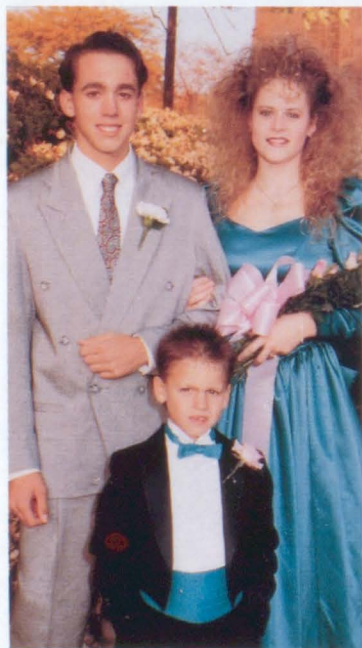

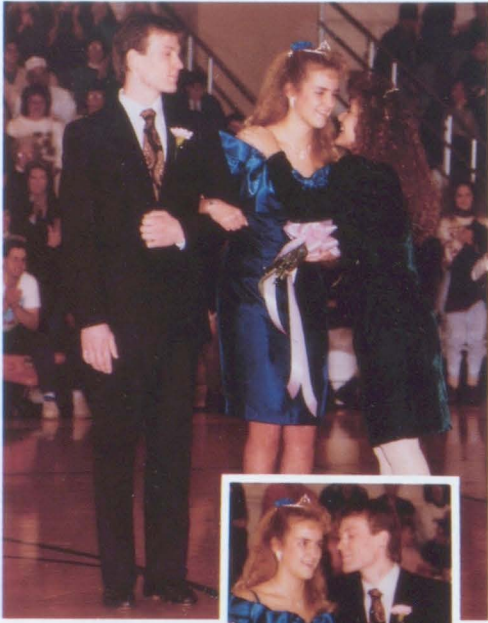

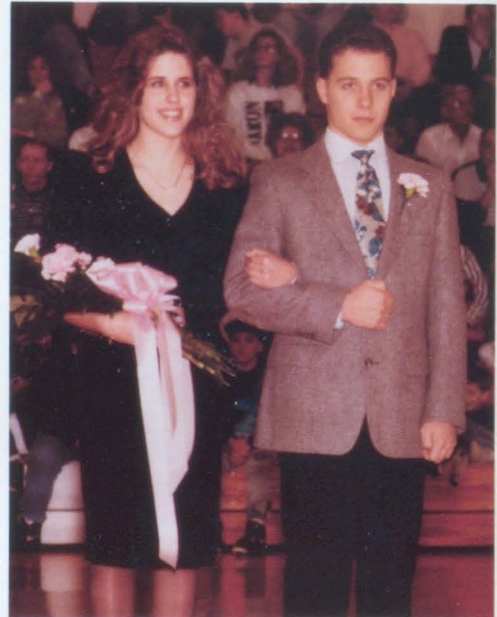

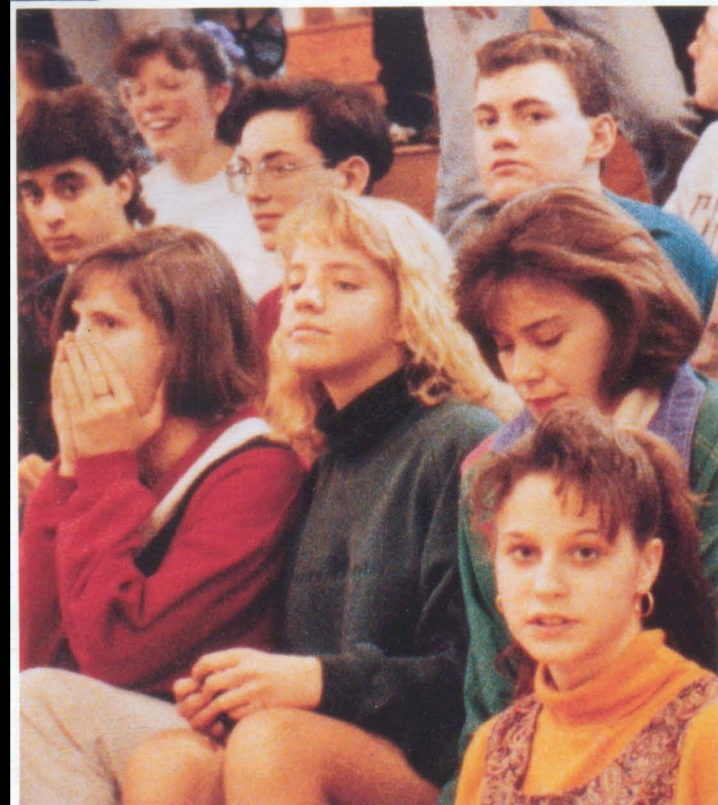
# EAGLE PRIDE STAYS ALIVE

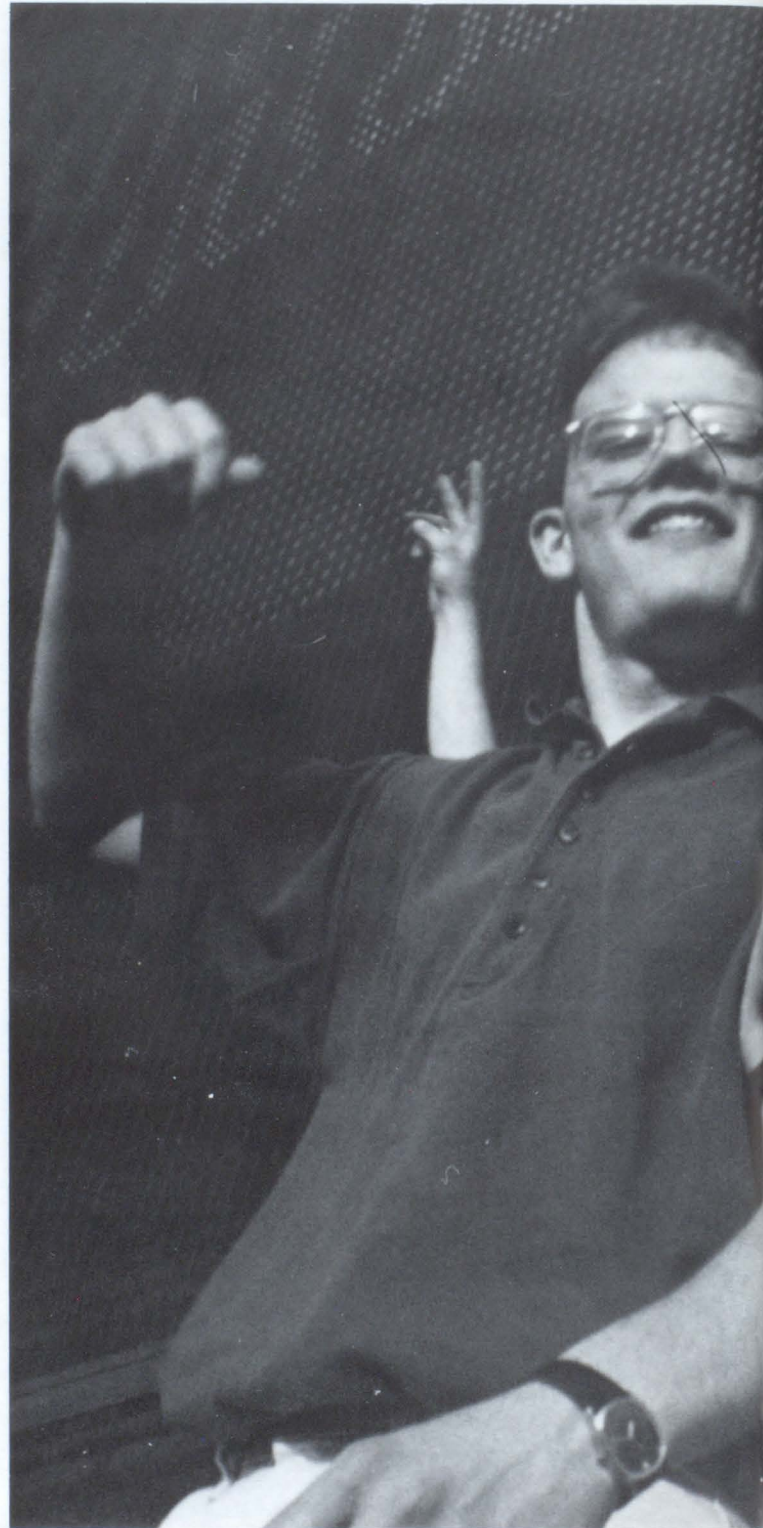




# What's Going On

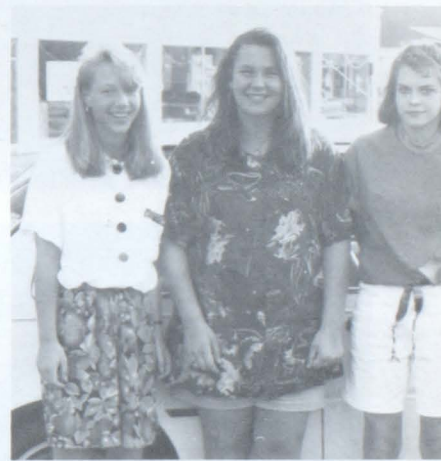

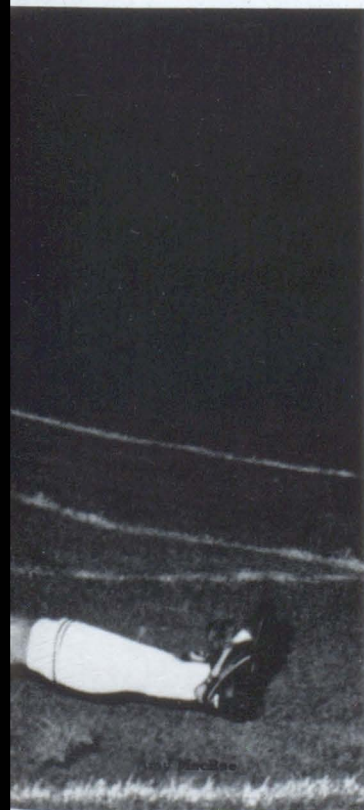

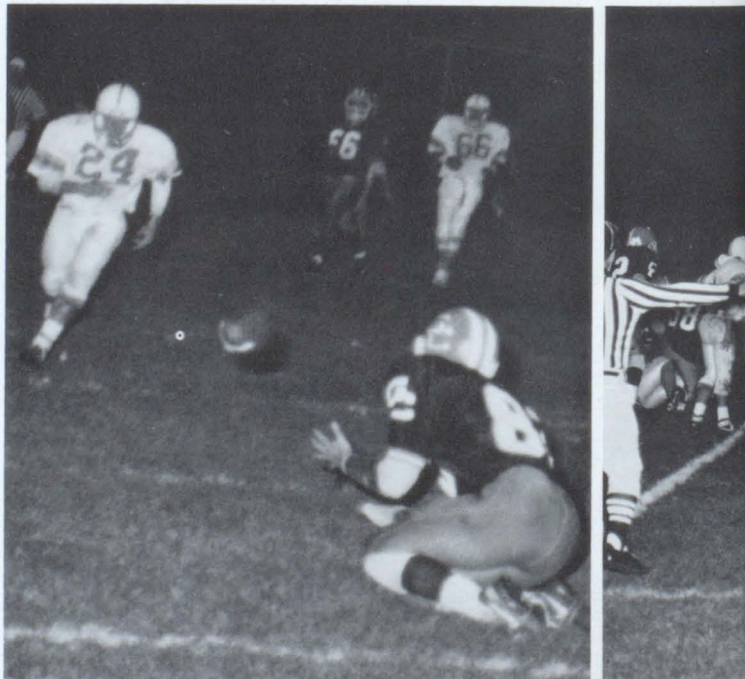

Junior quarterback, Brain Cavanaugh broke the school's record for a total of 1444 passing yards. Another outstanding Junior, Matt Walters had 566 yards on the ground and caught 11 of the 12 touch-down passes. Senior Steve Hensel led the team in tackles with a total of 112. Another exceptional Senior, Chuck Timmons had 29 catches and caught for 422 yards.

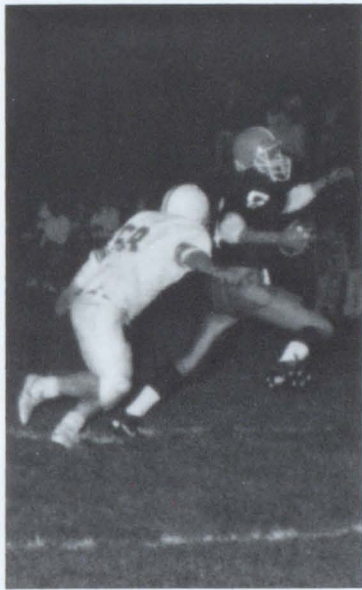

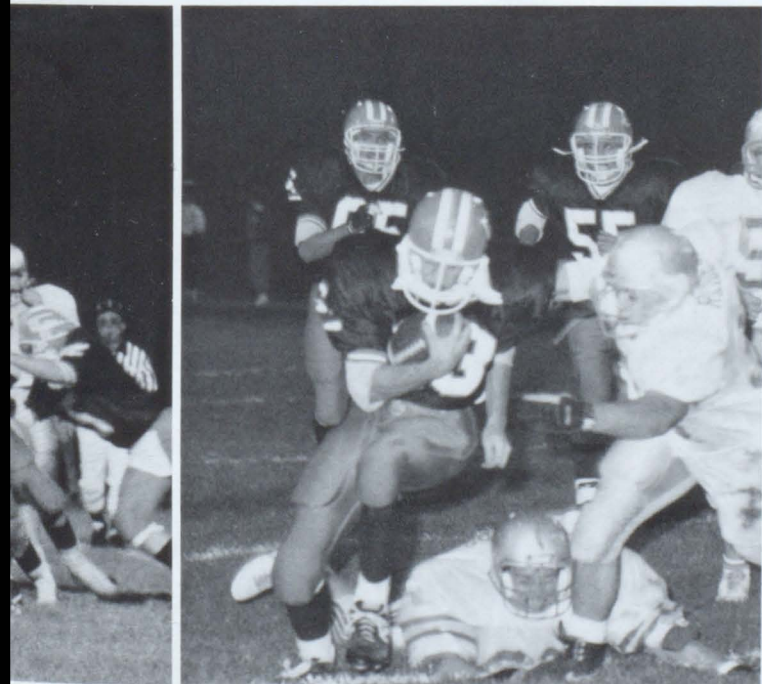

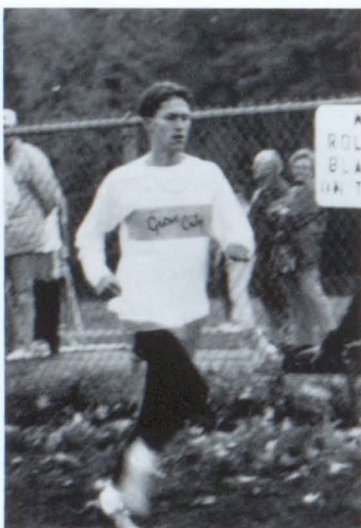

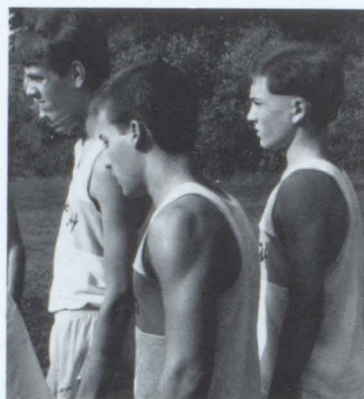

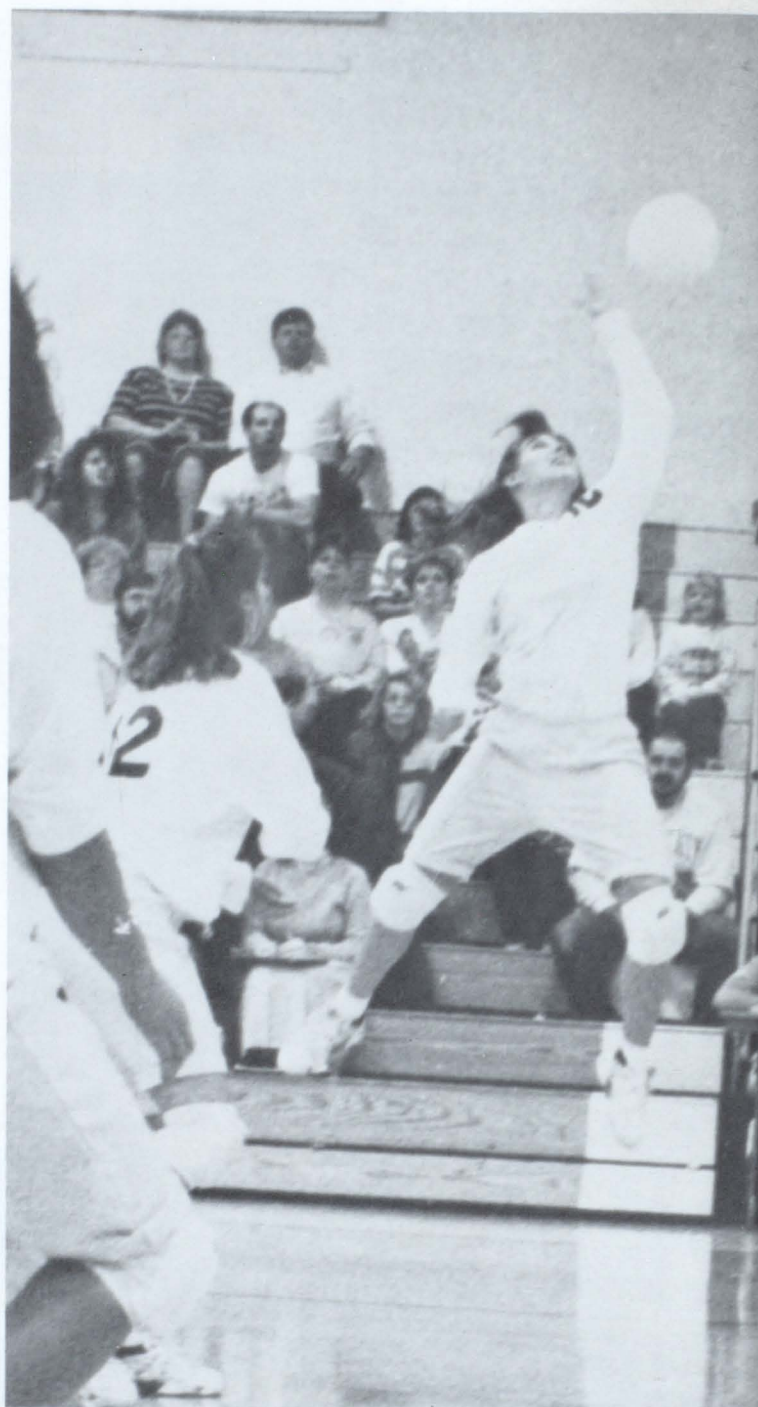

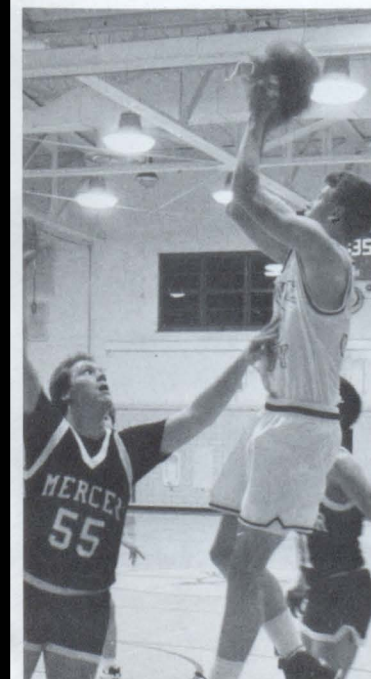

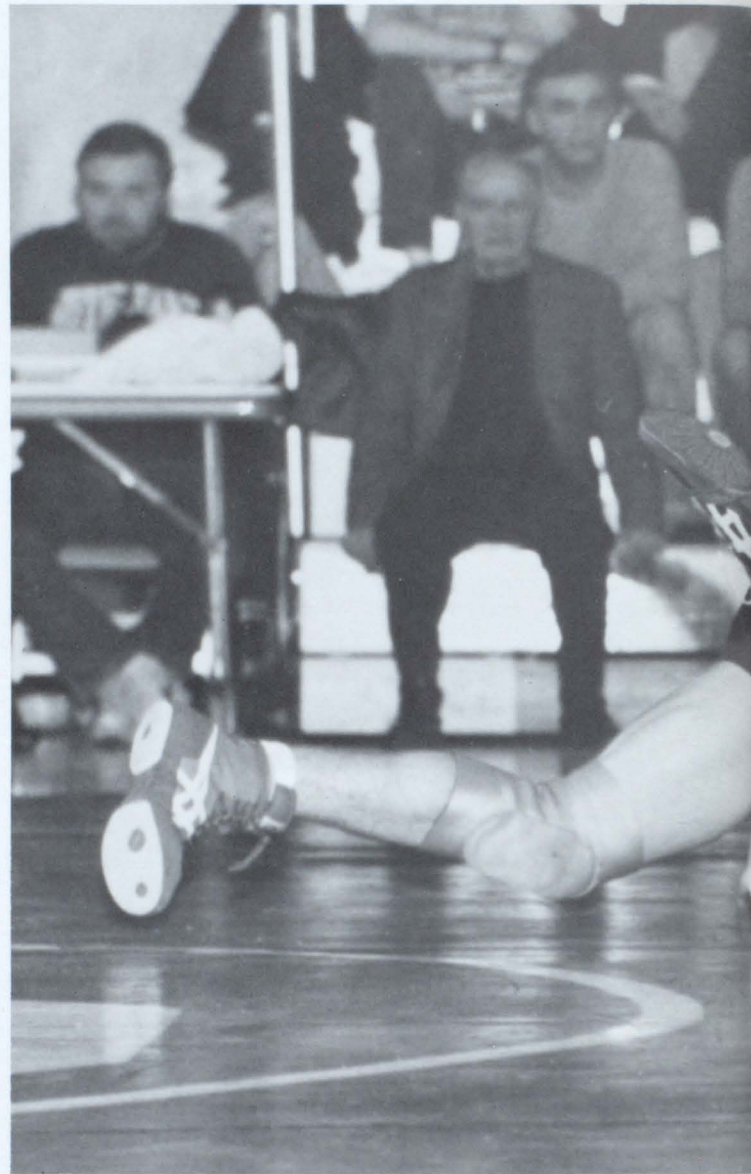

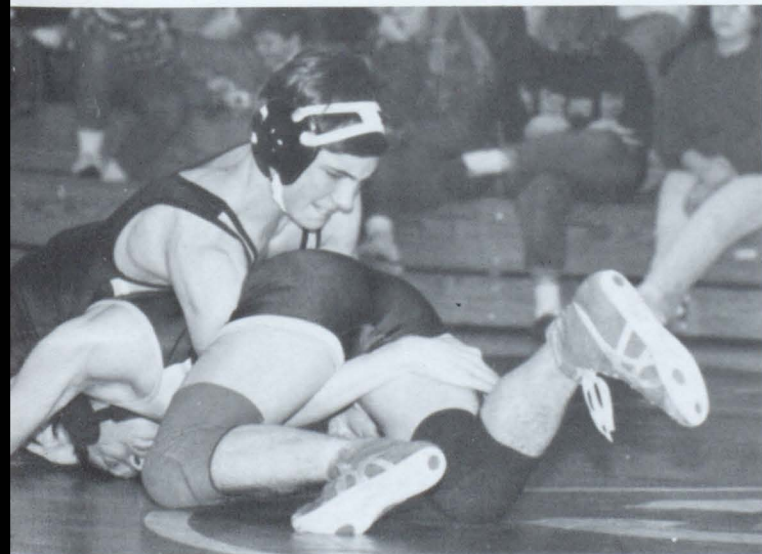
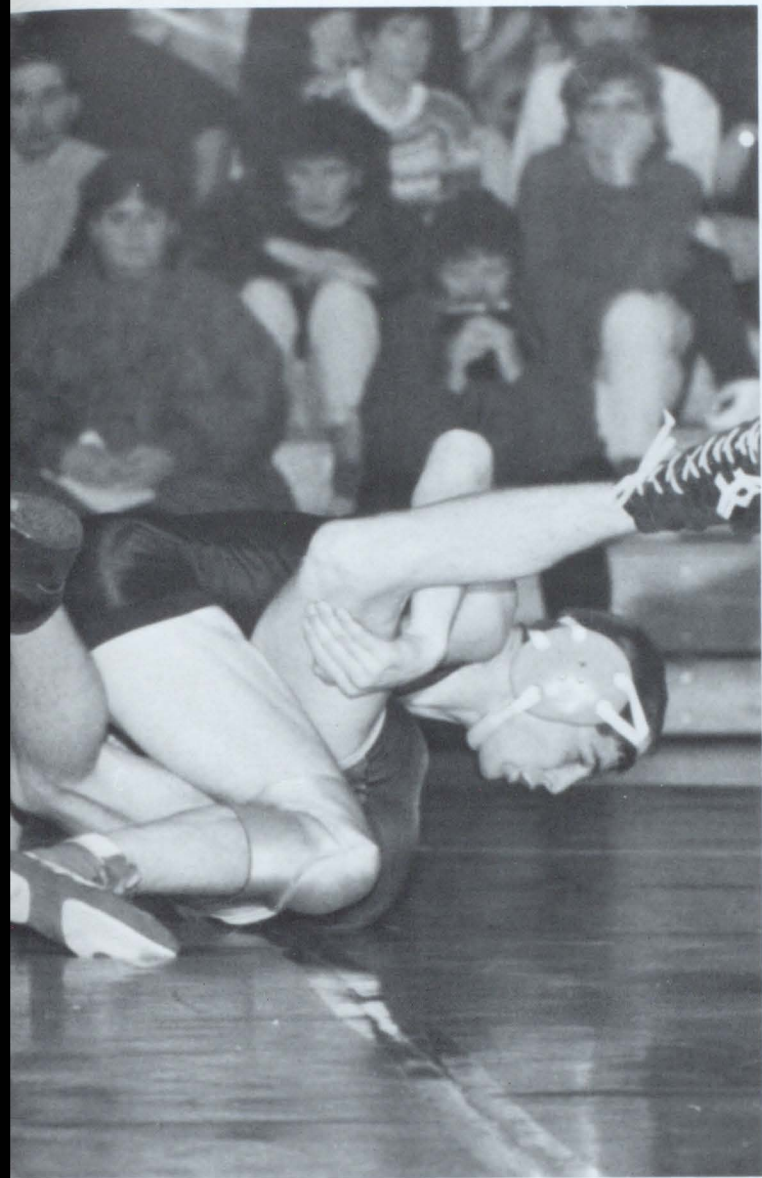
## AGAINST THE ODDS

This year the Eagle Matmen finished the season with an 8-5-1 record. The team was at a disadvantage because many starters were young and inexperienced.

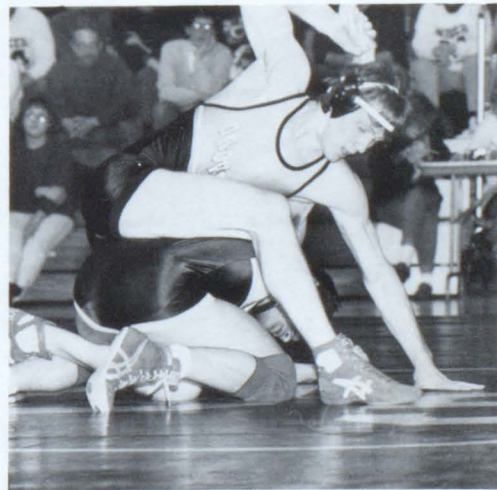

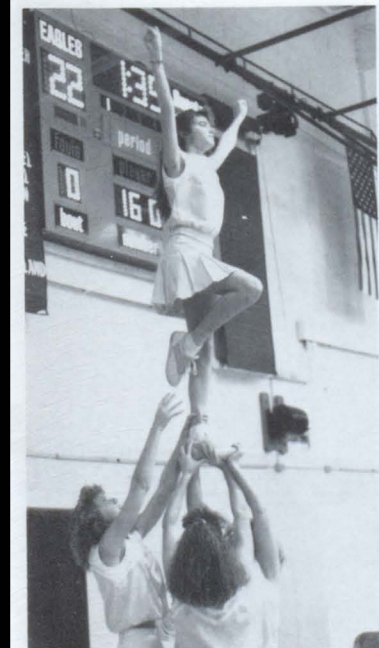

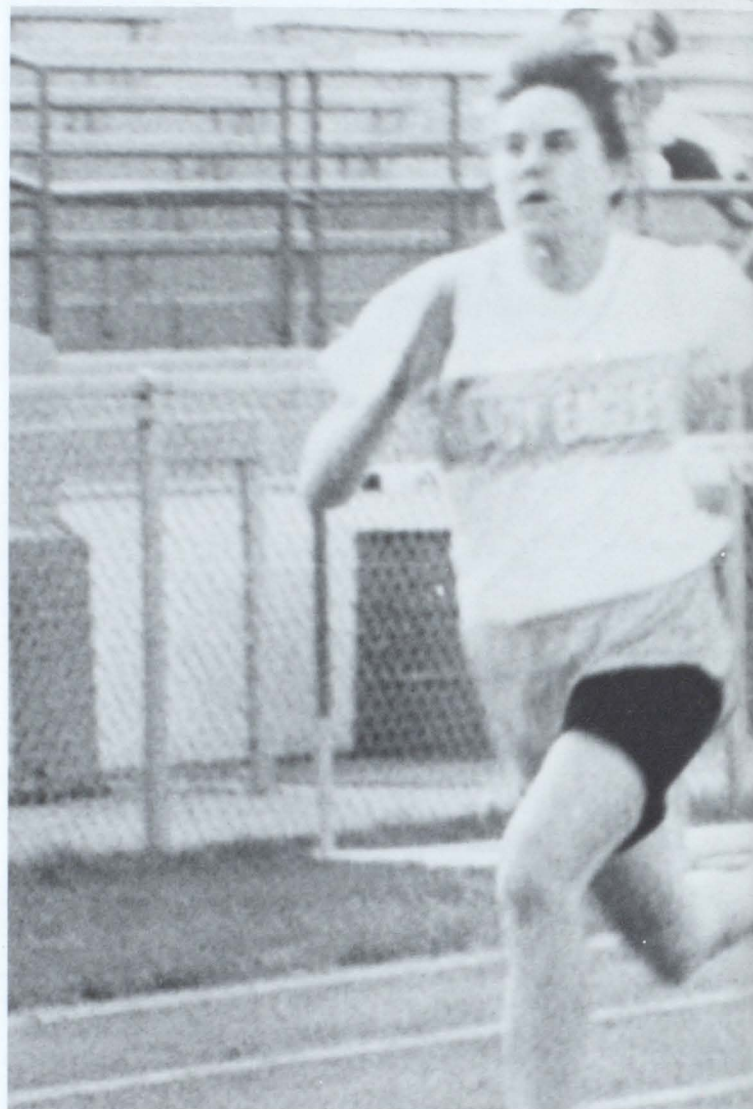


## BACK FOR THE ATTACK

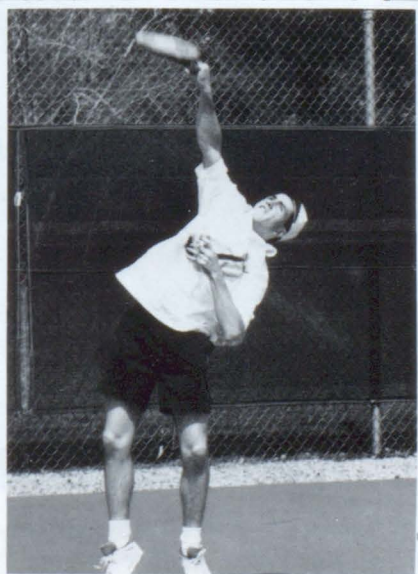

# LESSONS TO BE LEARNED

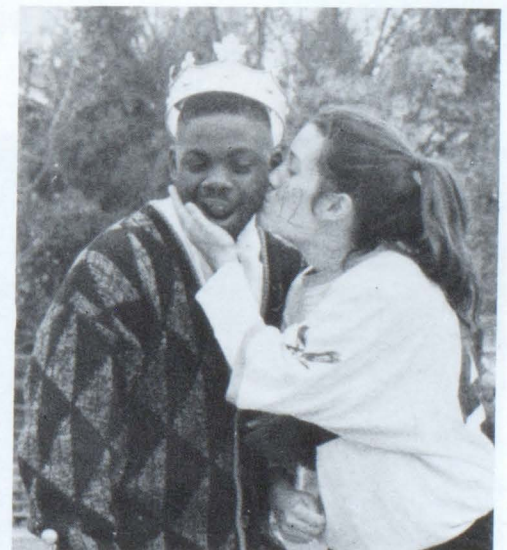
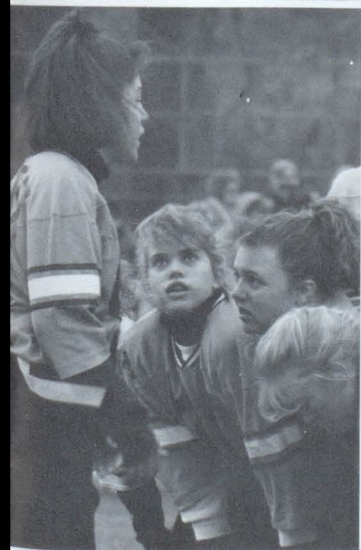

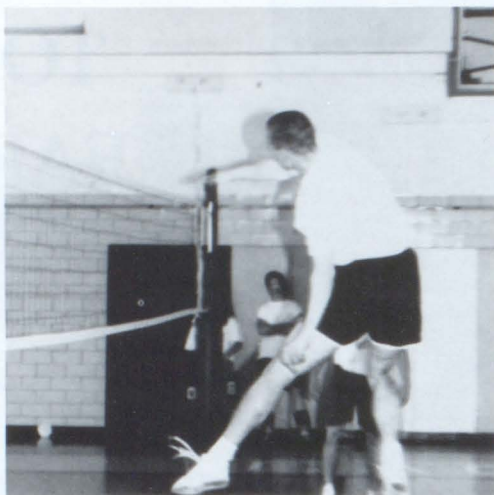

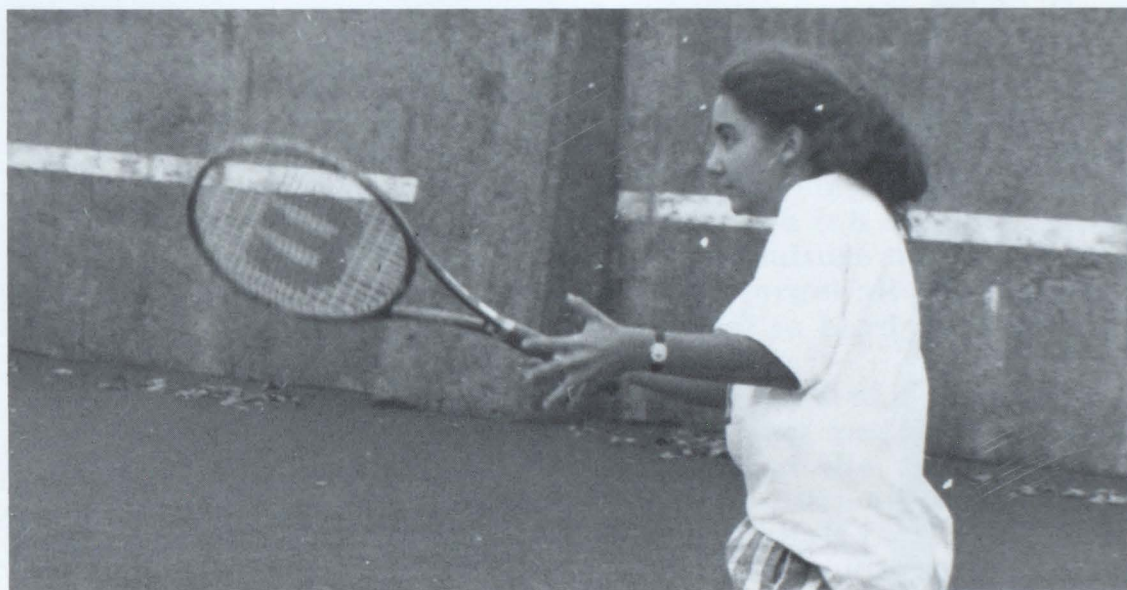


## Just For The Fun Of It!

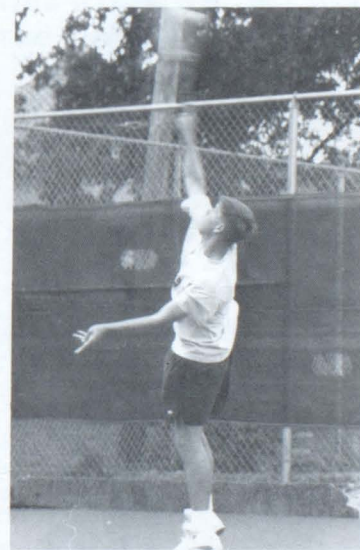


Preparing to strut her stuff, Sharna Fabiano tenses to return the serve.

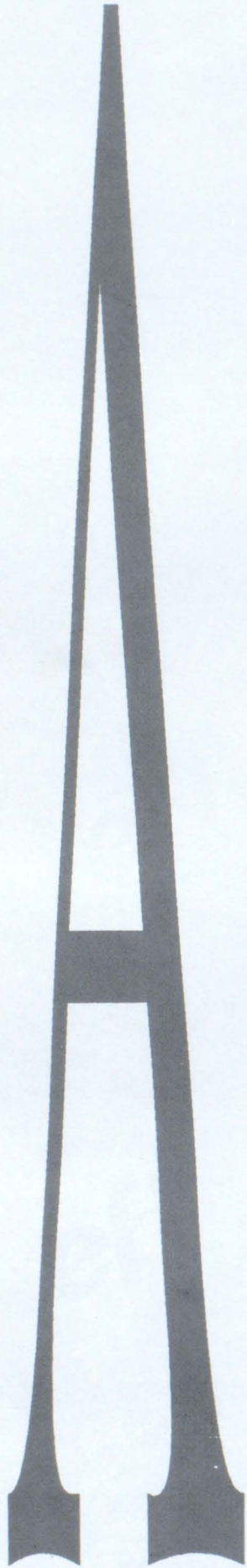

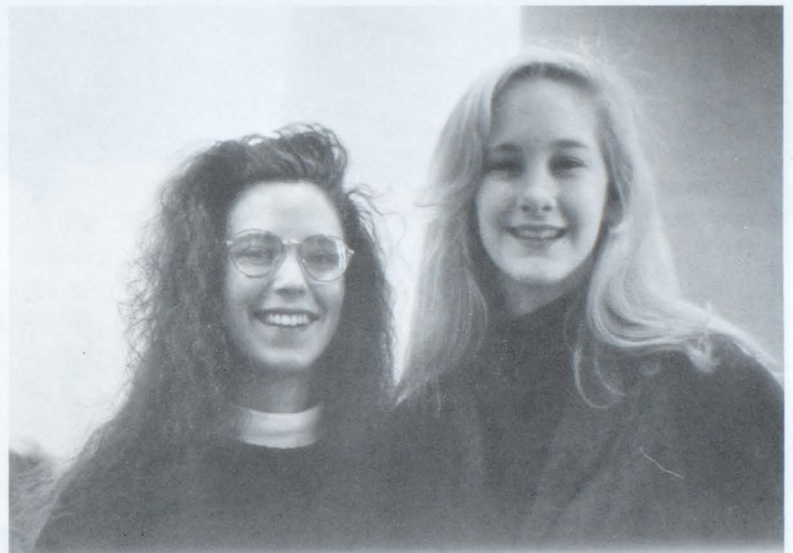

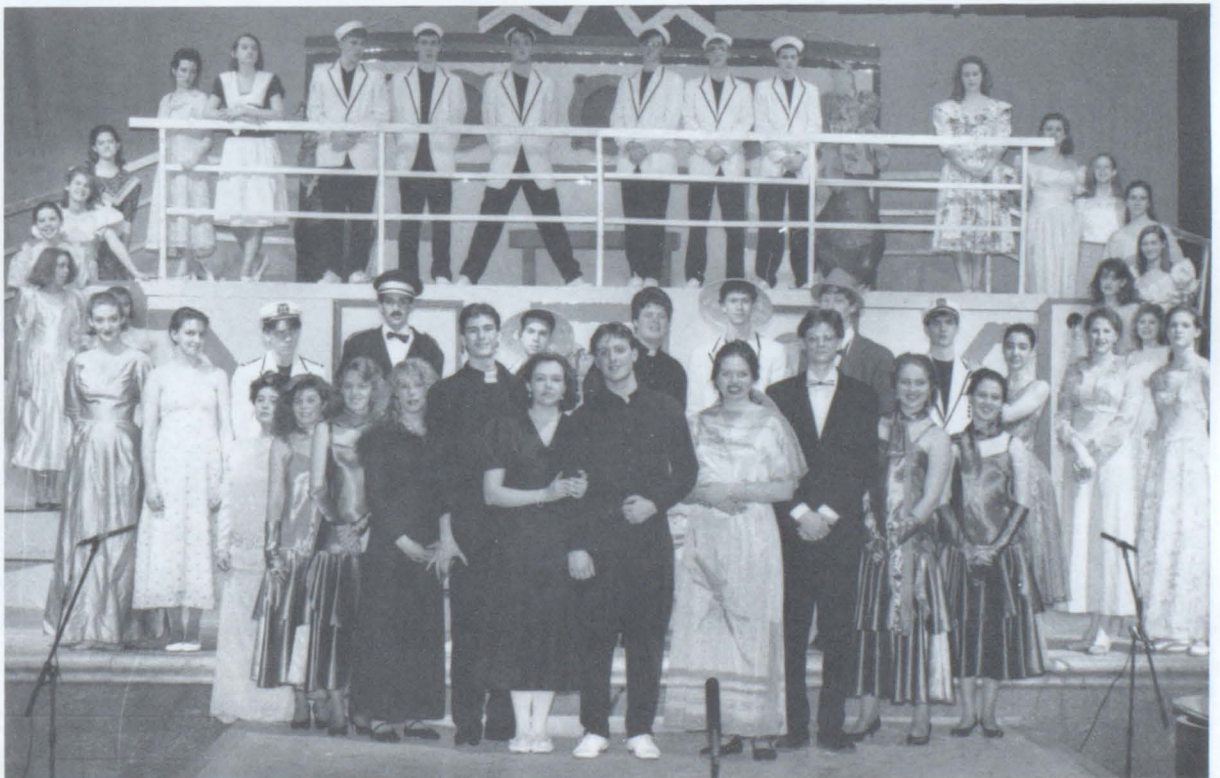

Saturday Science is a very popular activity among the Freshmen. The hours of sleep sacrificed were worth the learning experience.

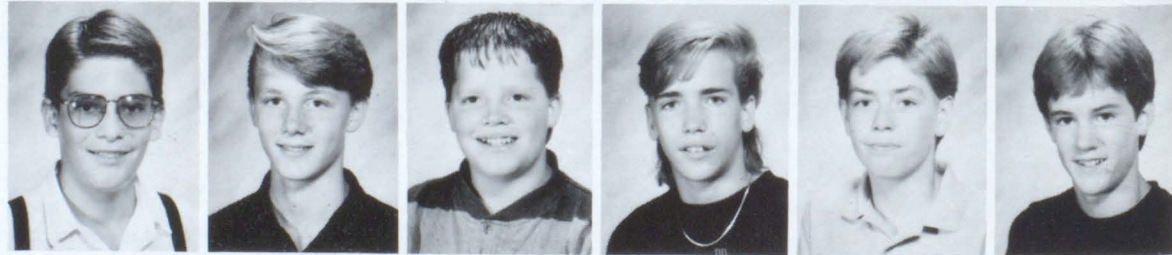

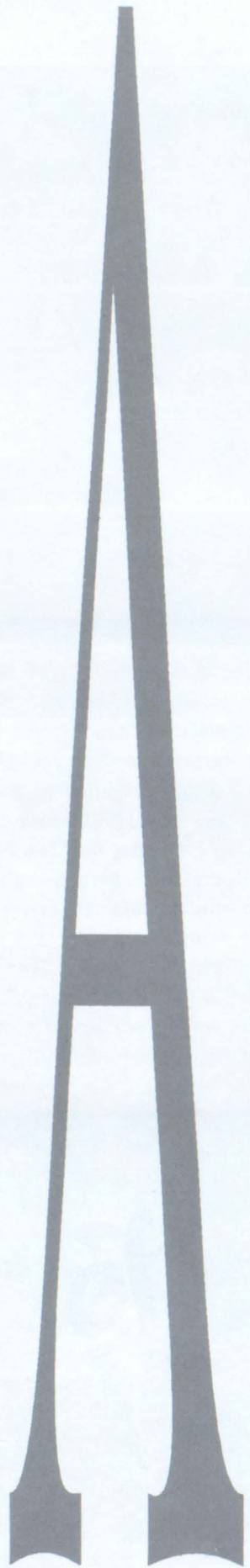
# Teachers's
