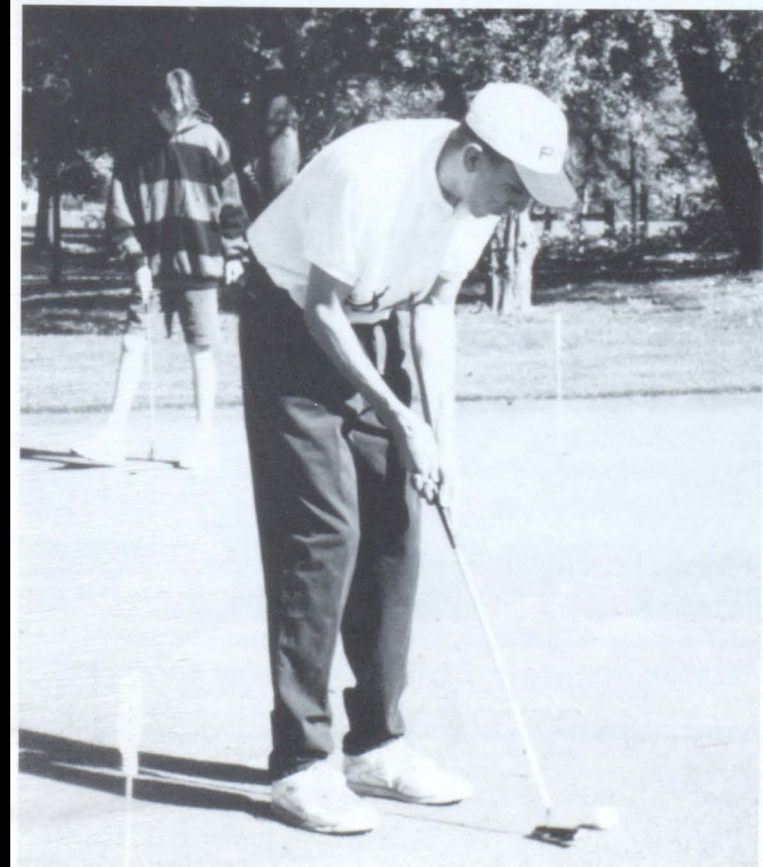

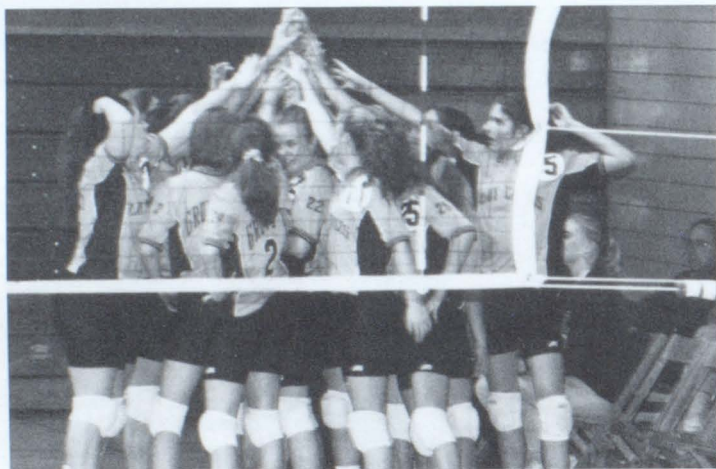
Fulfilling the Dream

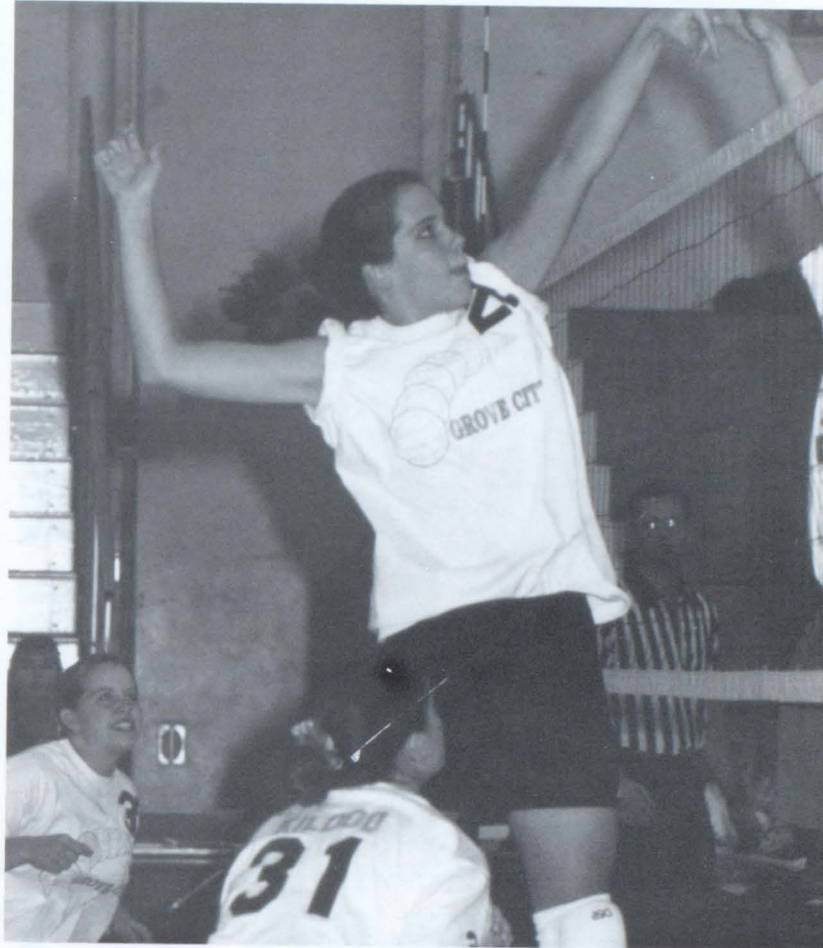

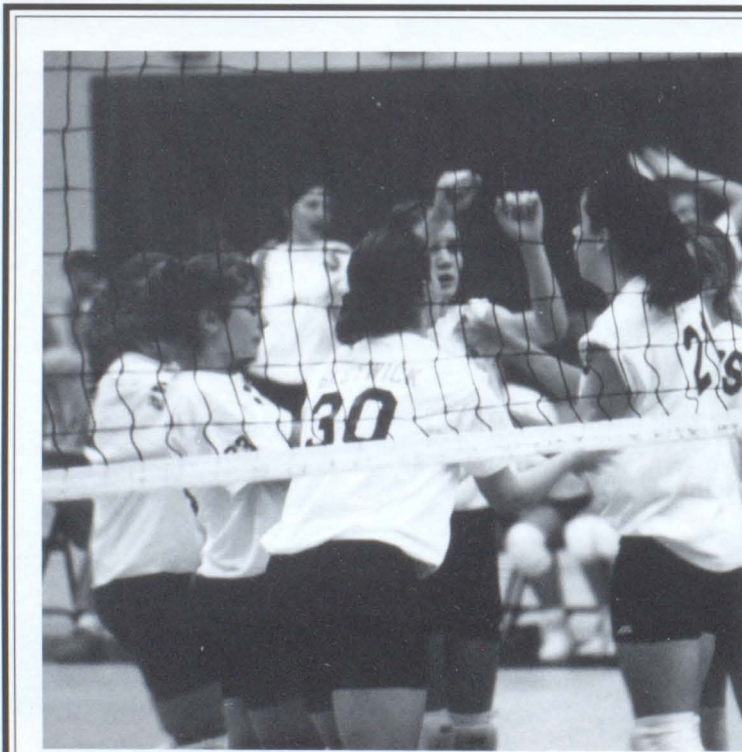

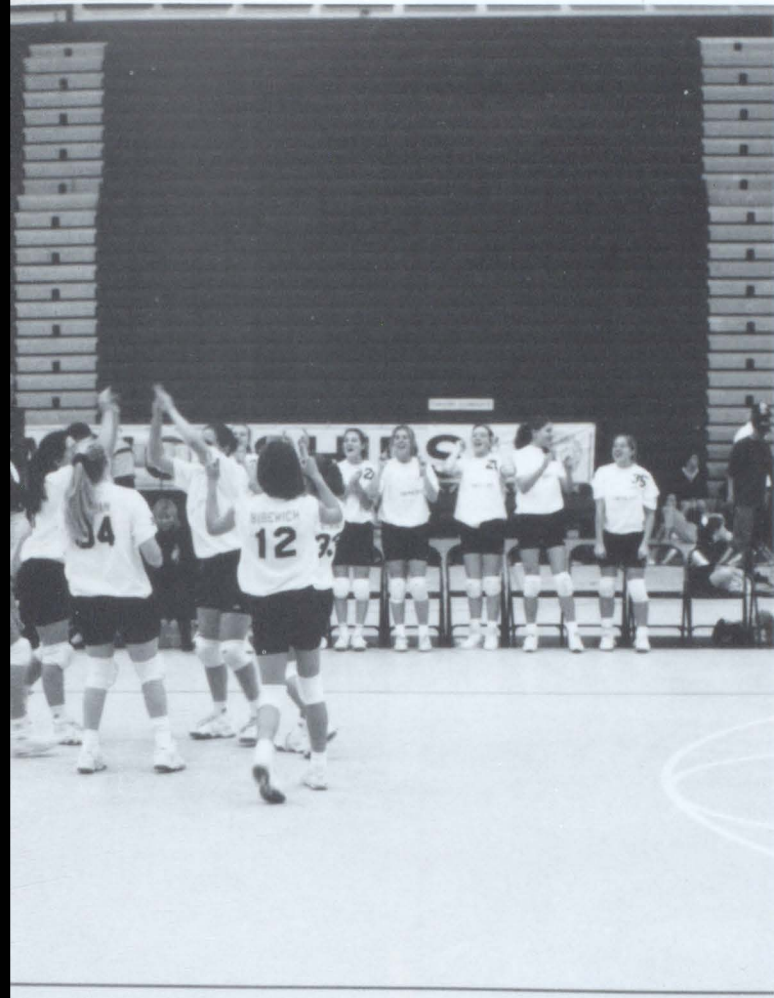

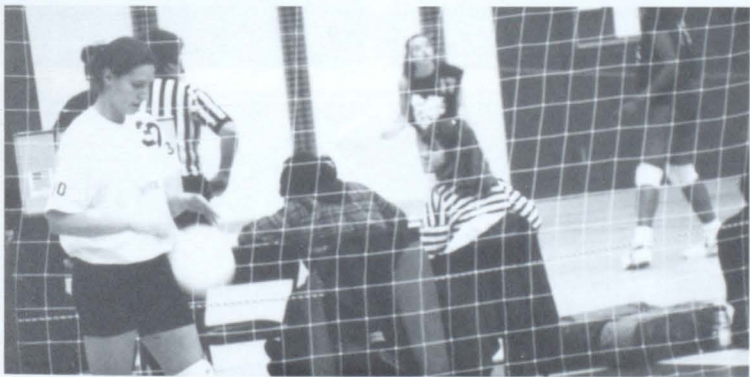

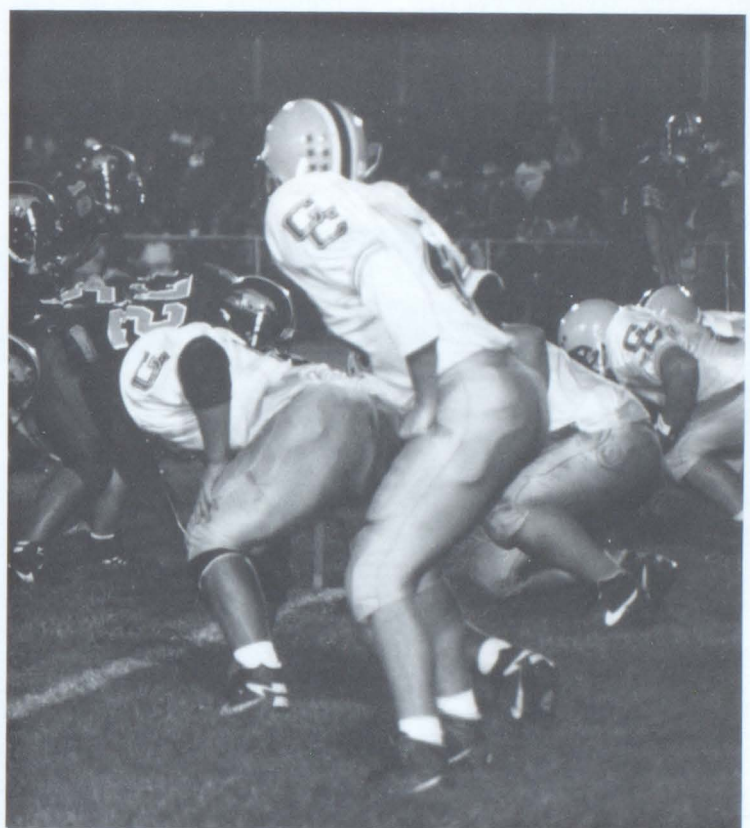

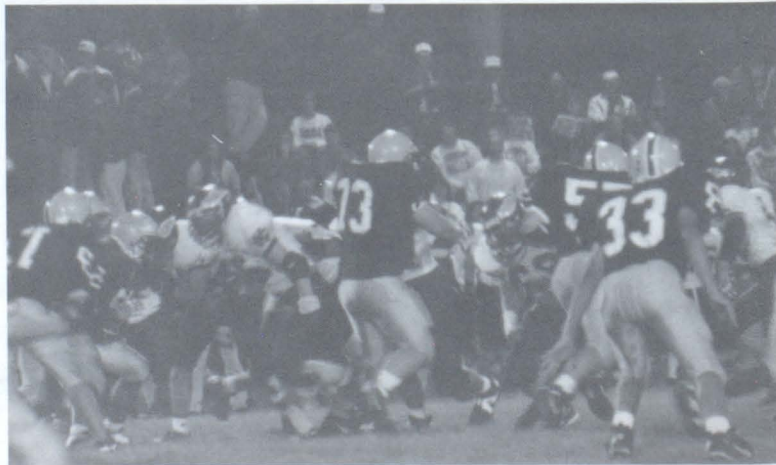

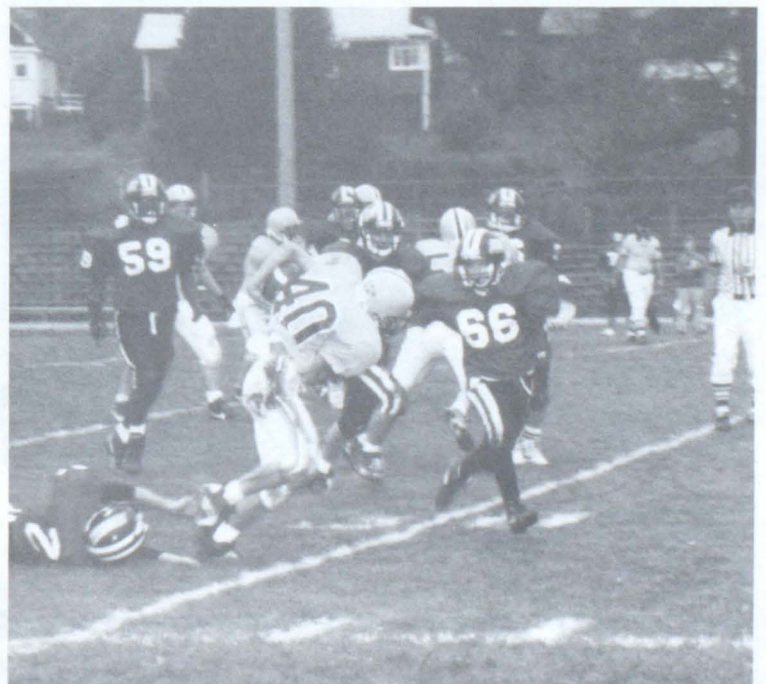

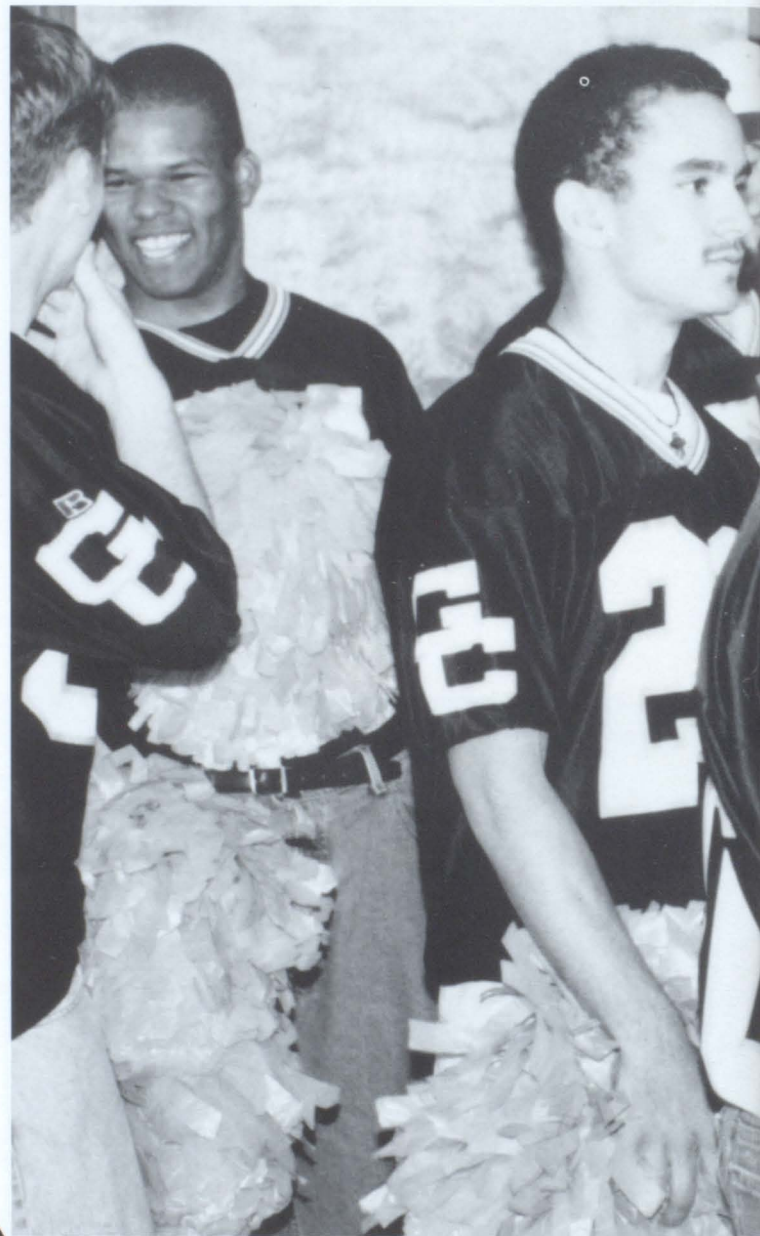

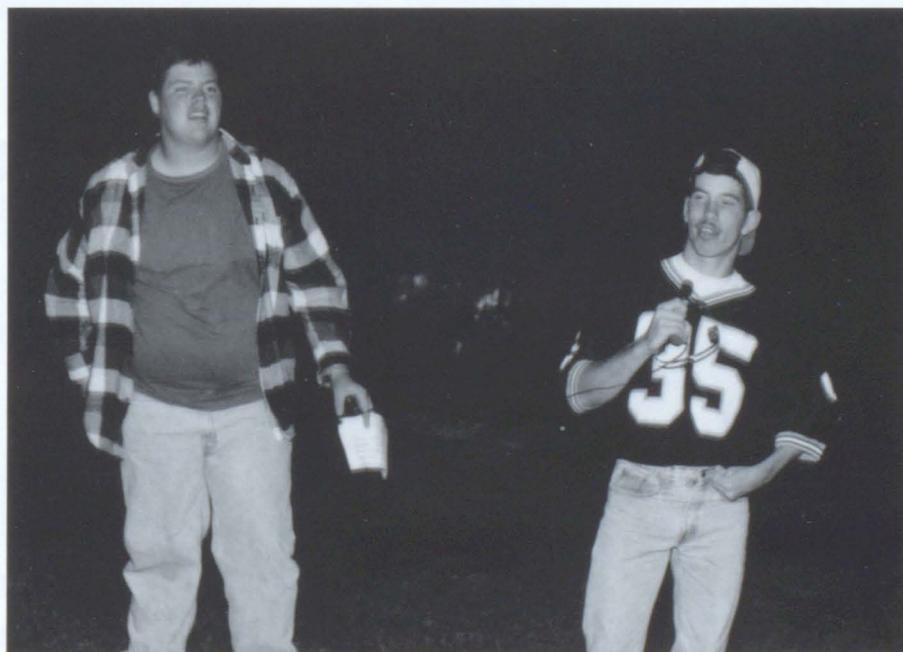

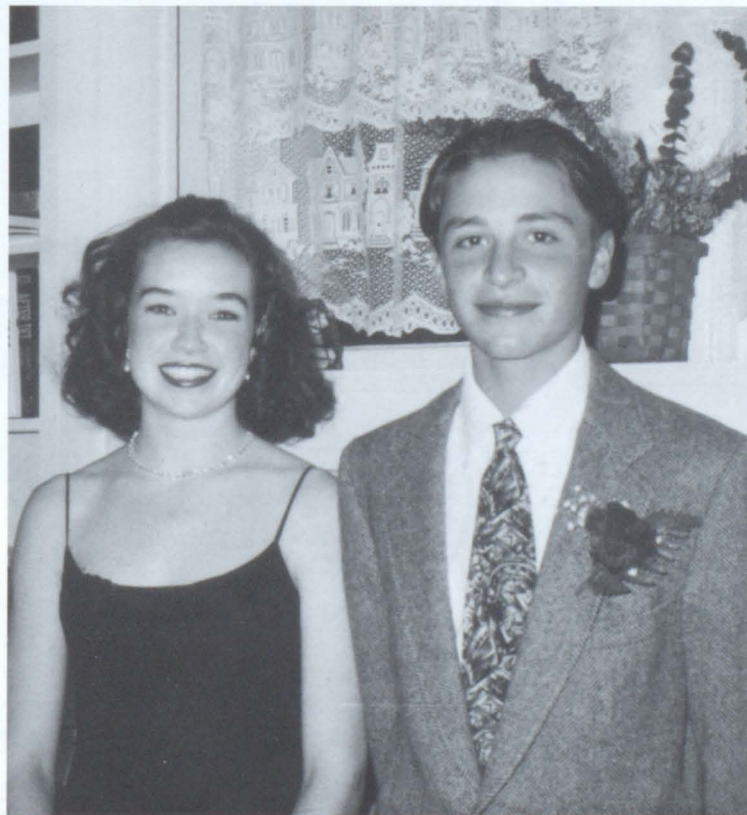

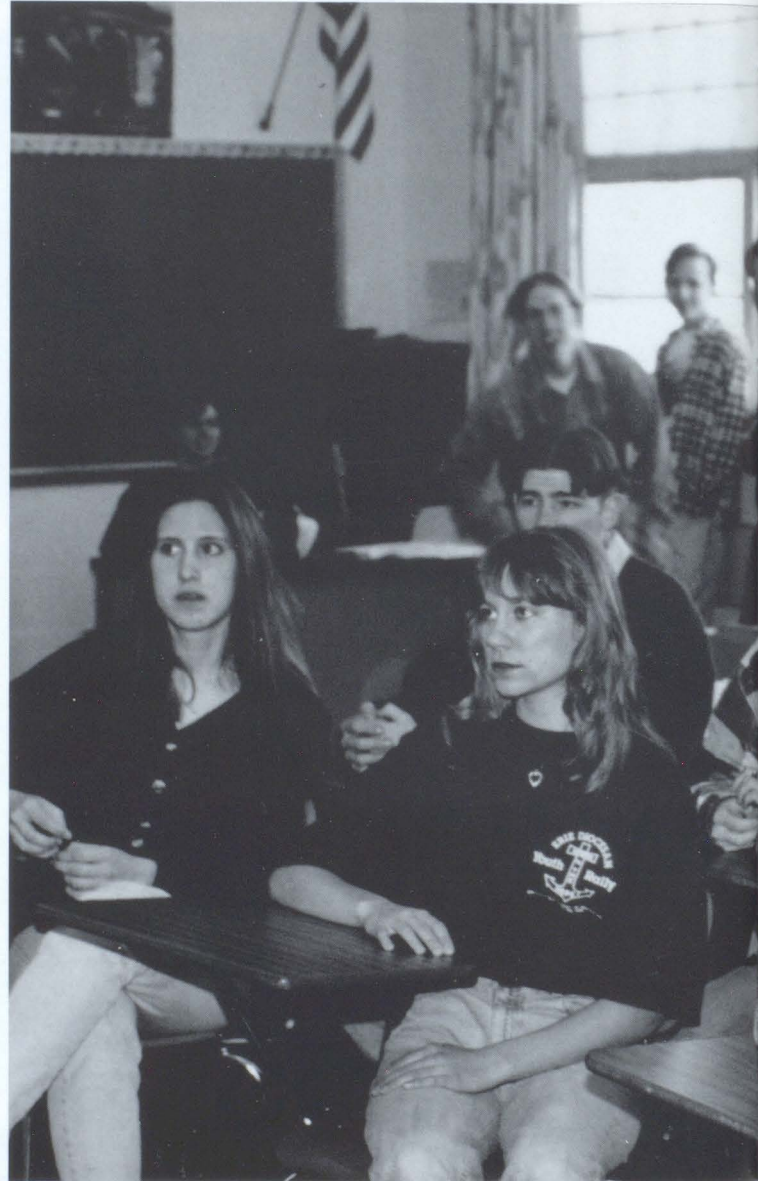

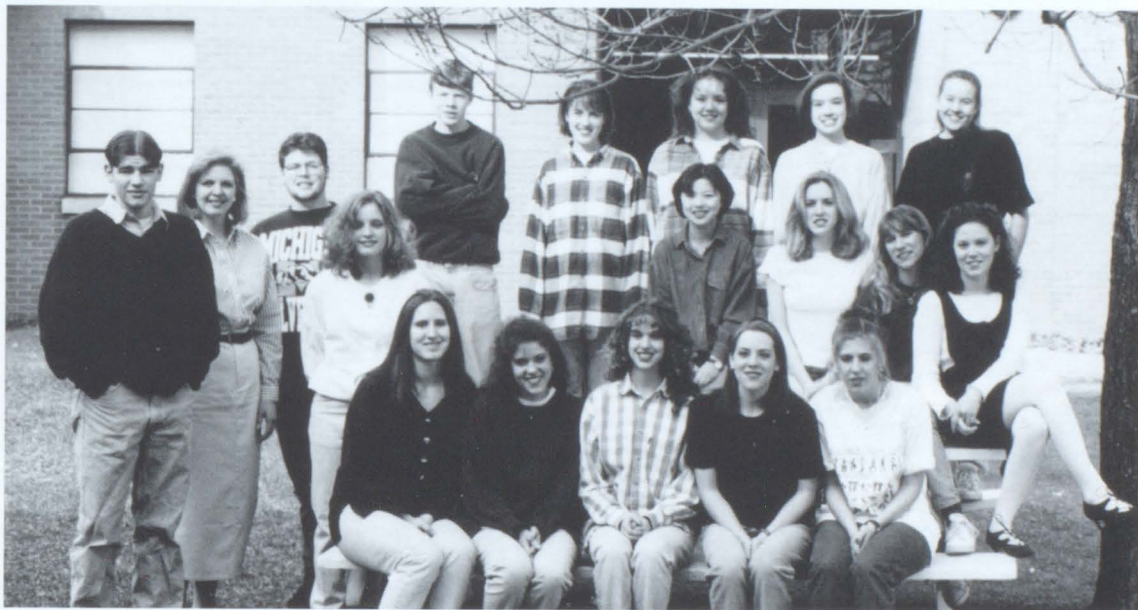

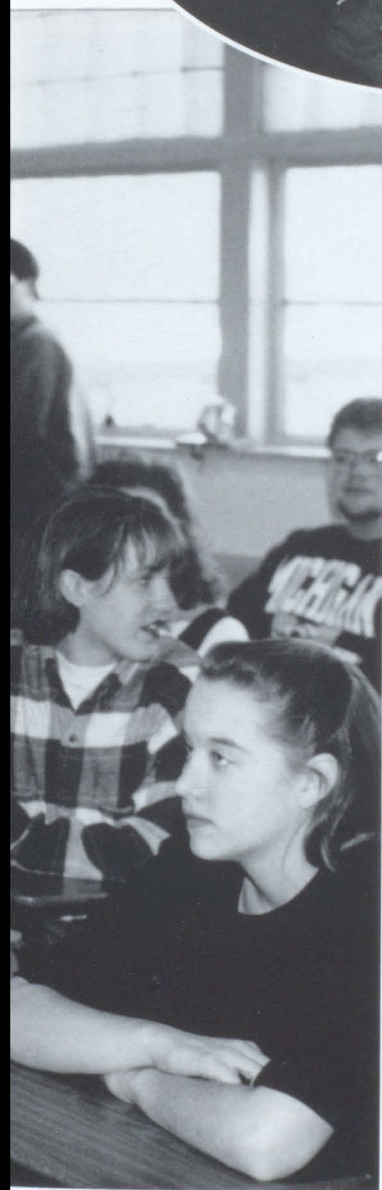

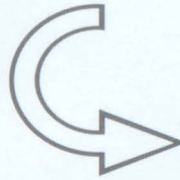

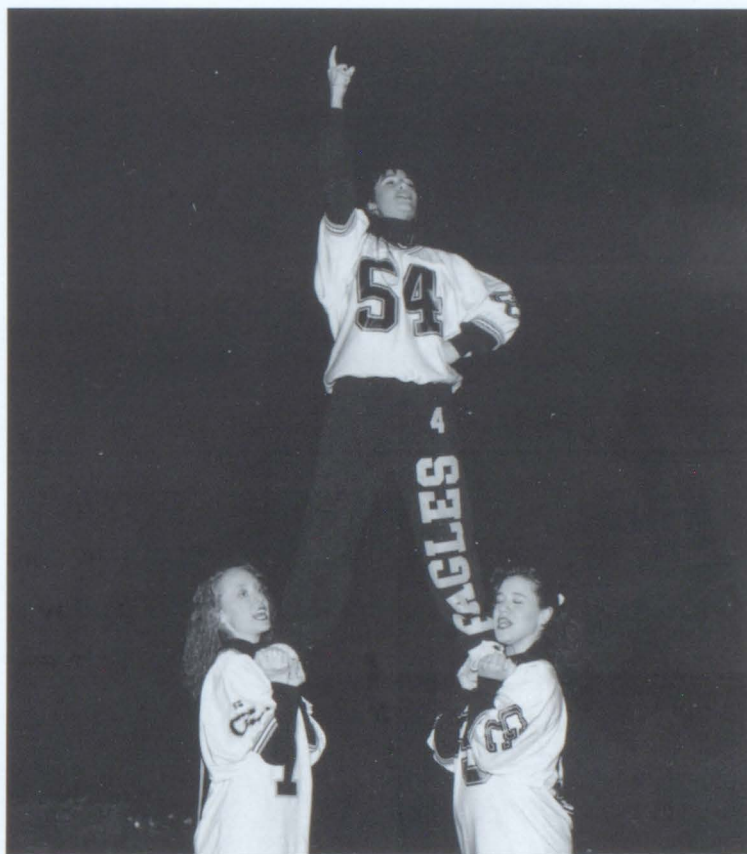

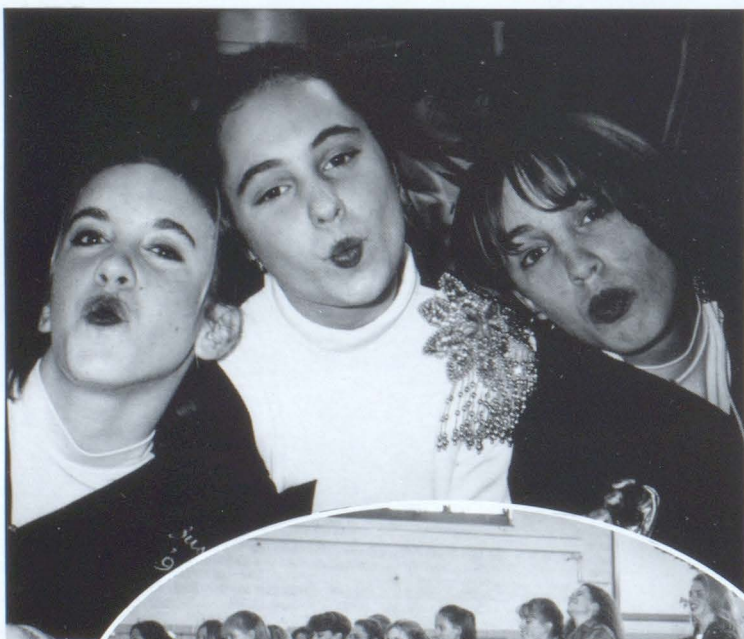

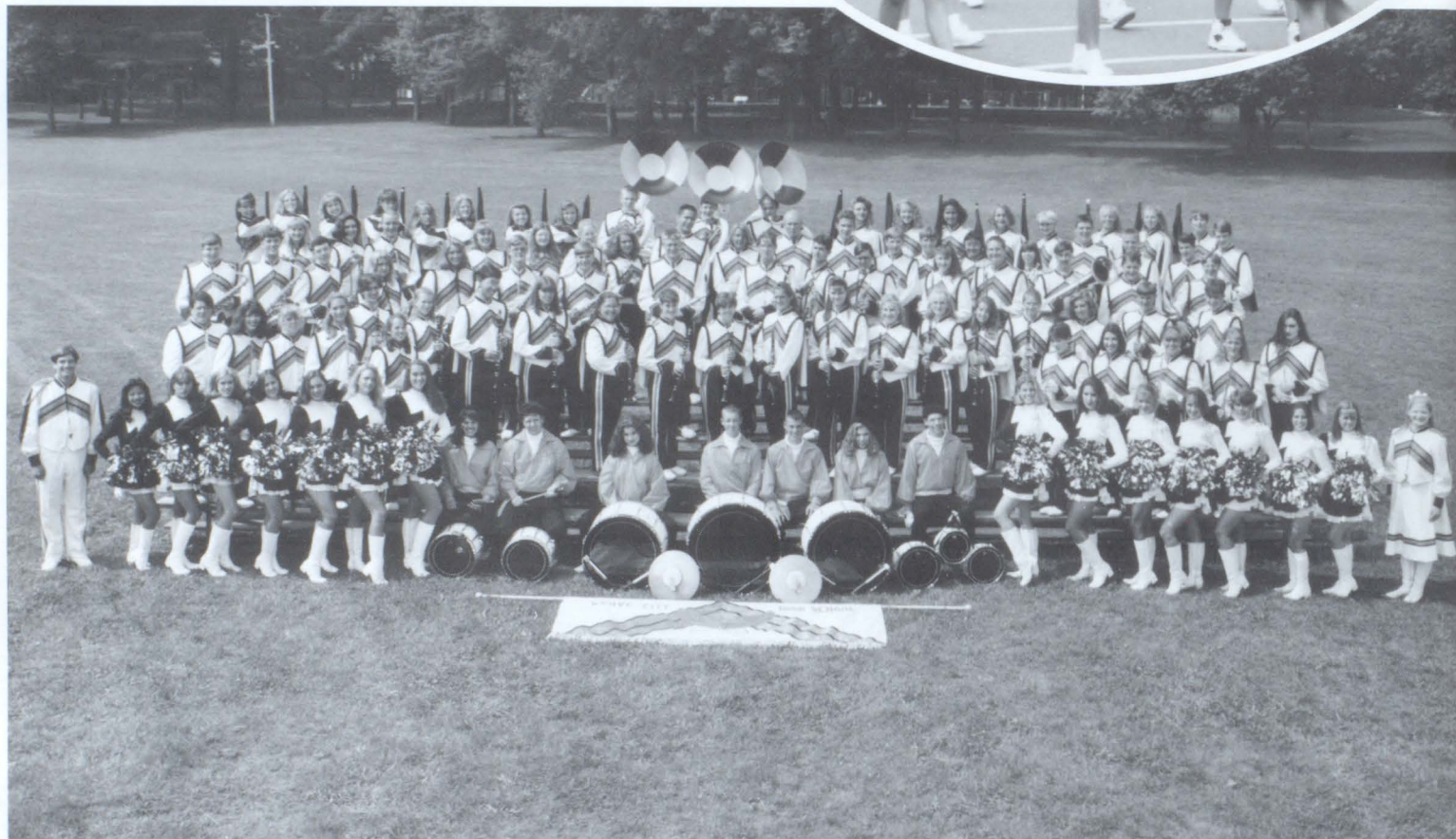

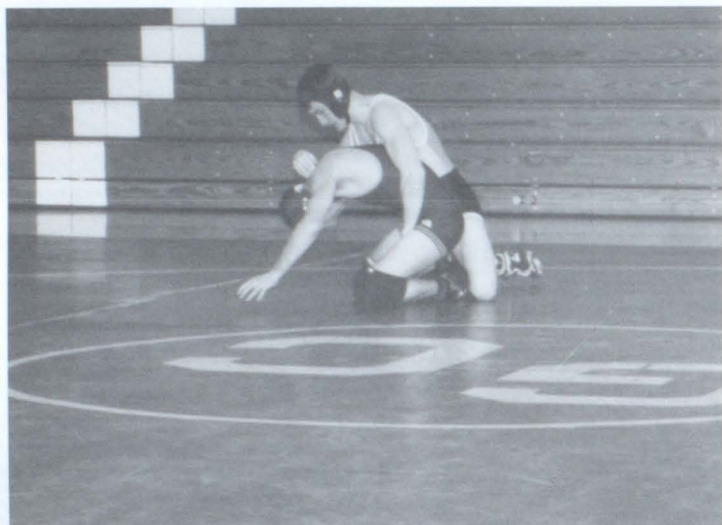
The Eagle Matmen were a young team this year led by Jason Krest, the only senior. The team gained a lot of experience. "We started five freshman most of the year and now we're looking for a

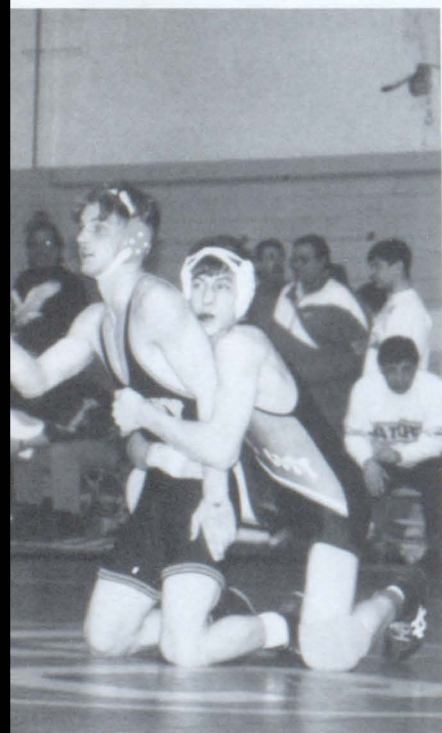

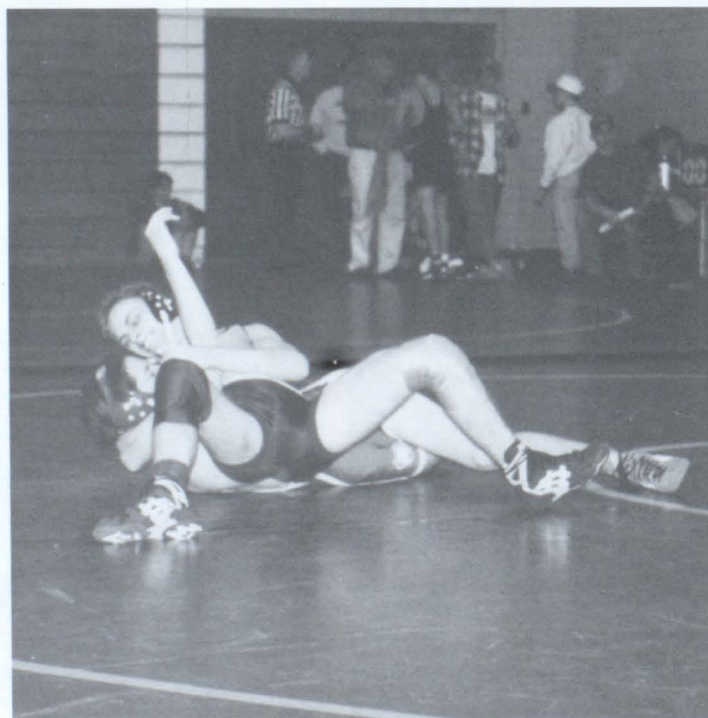

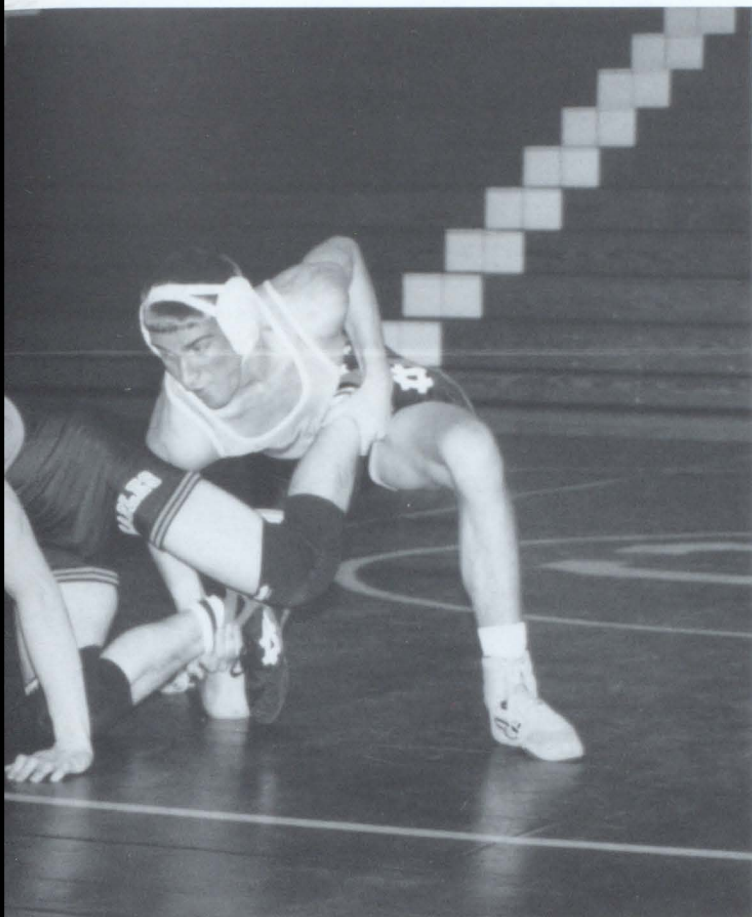

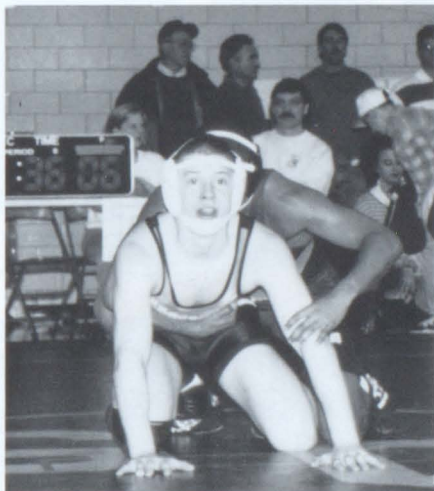

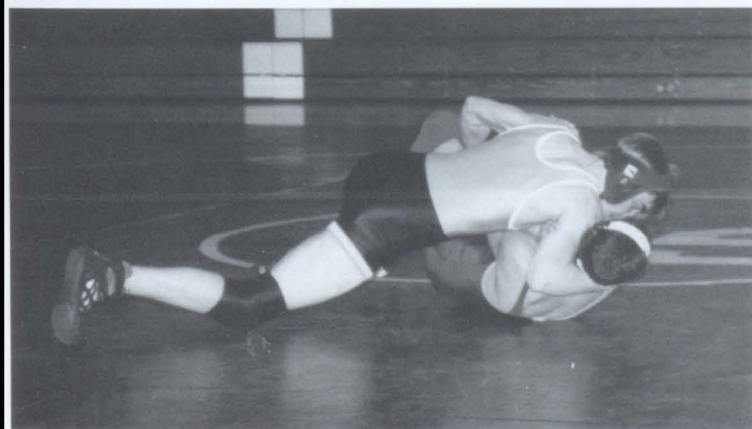

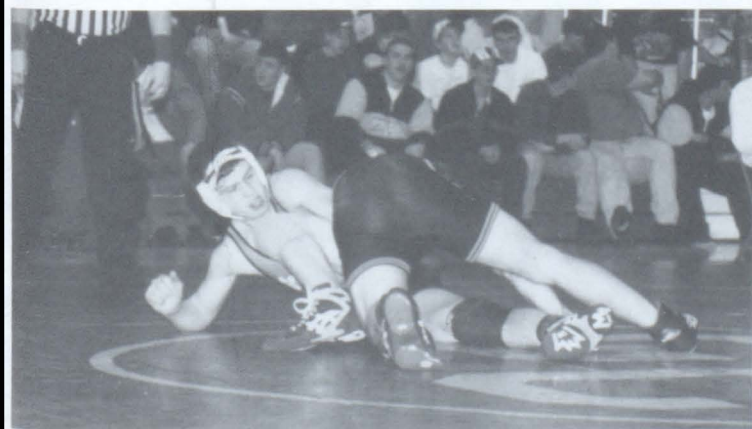

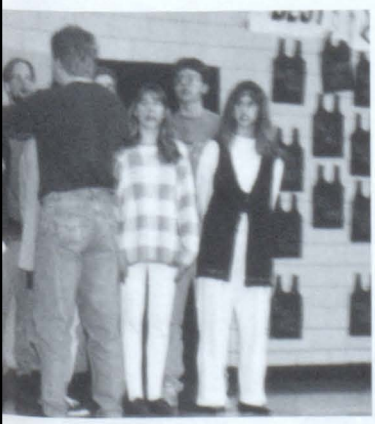

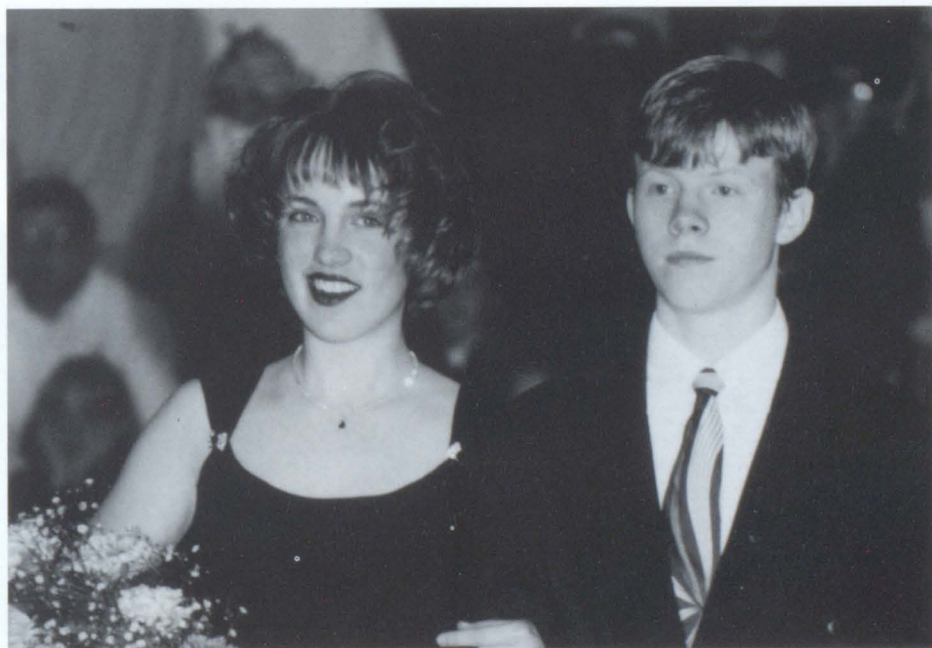

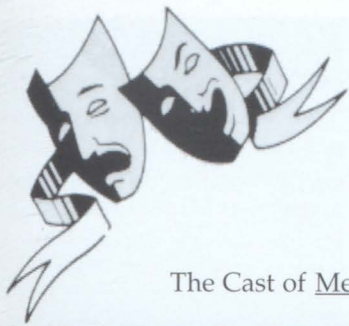

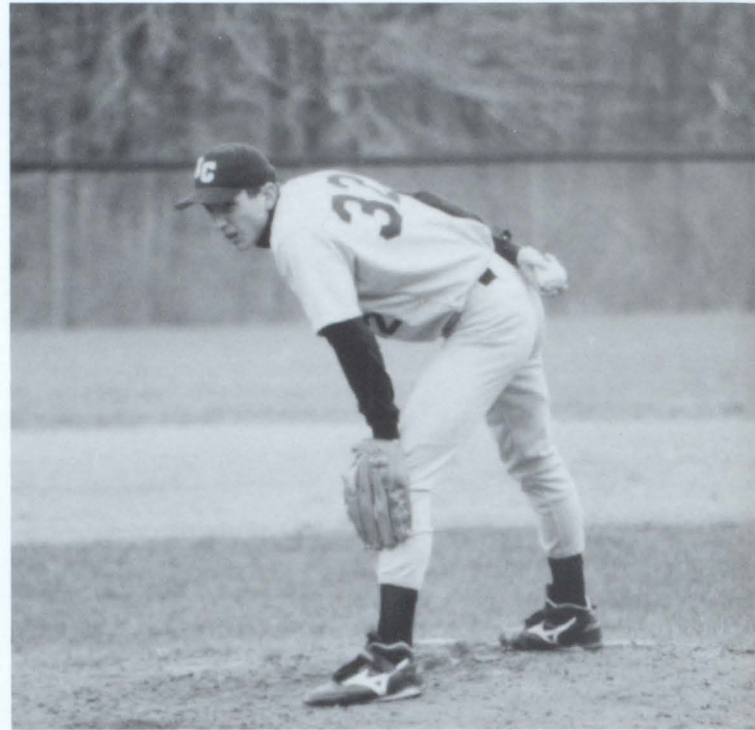

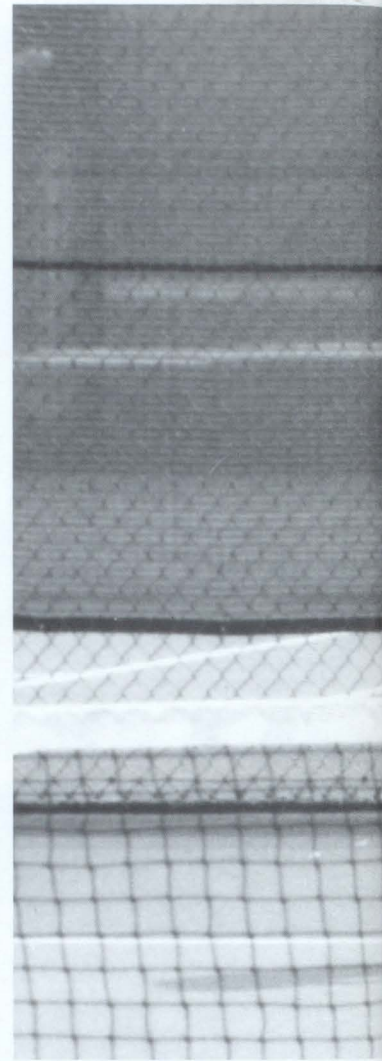

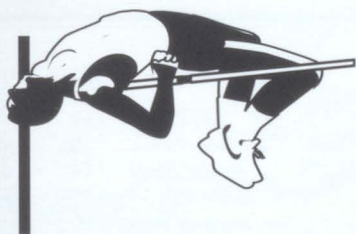
