Homecoming Week and Dance 1992

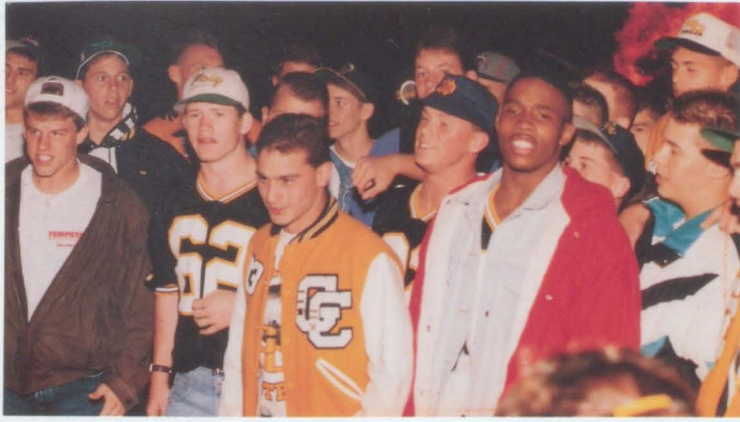

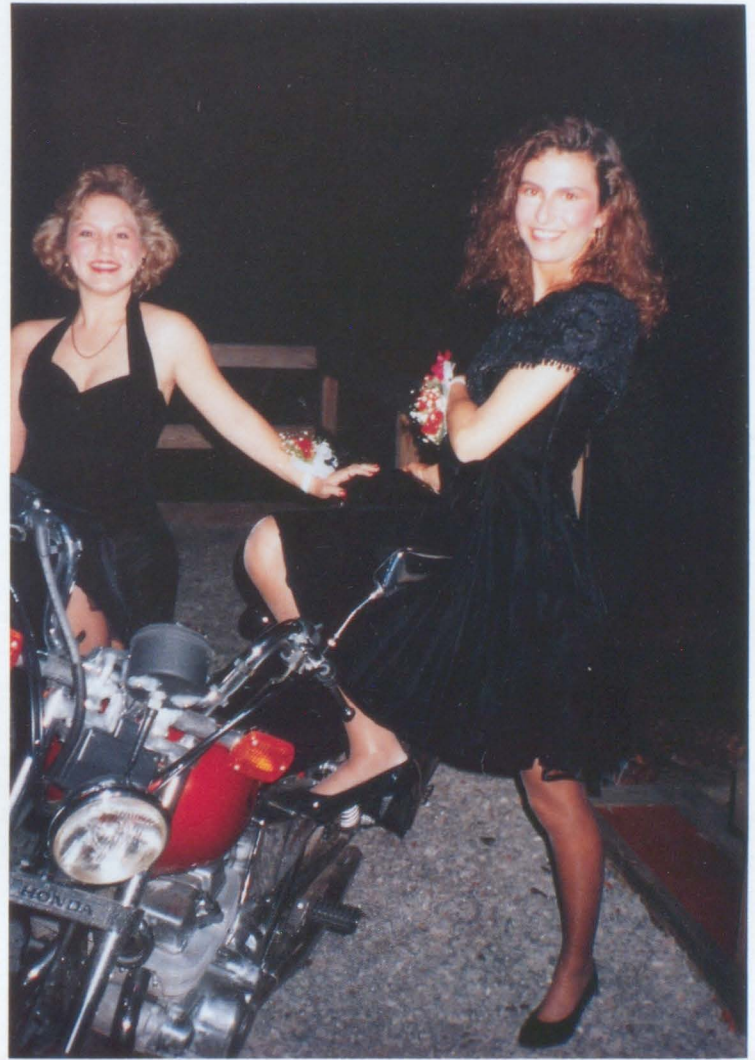

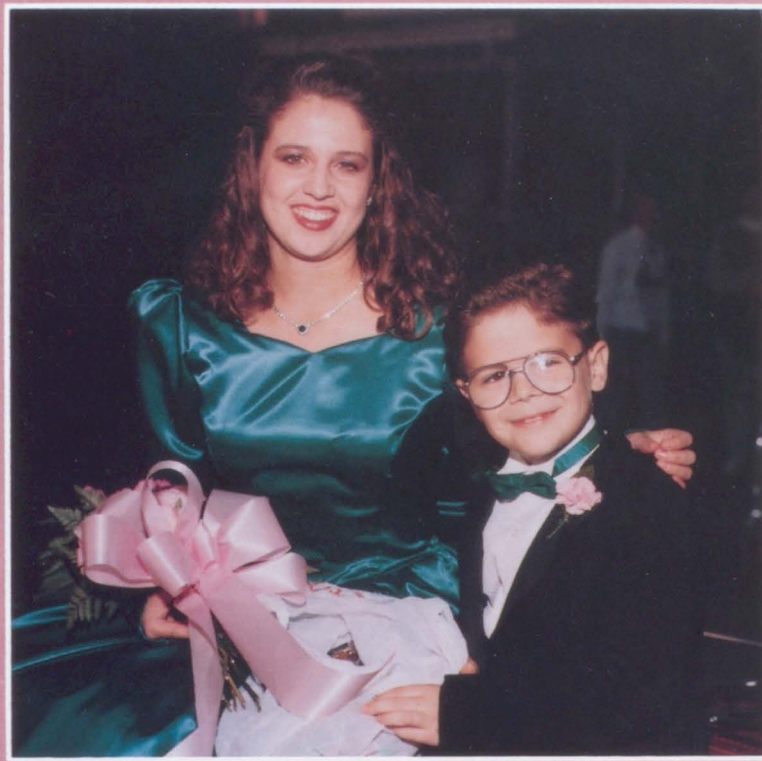

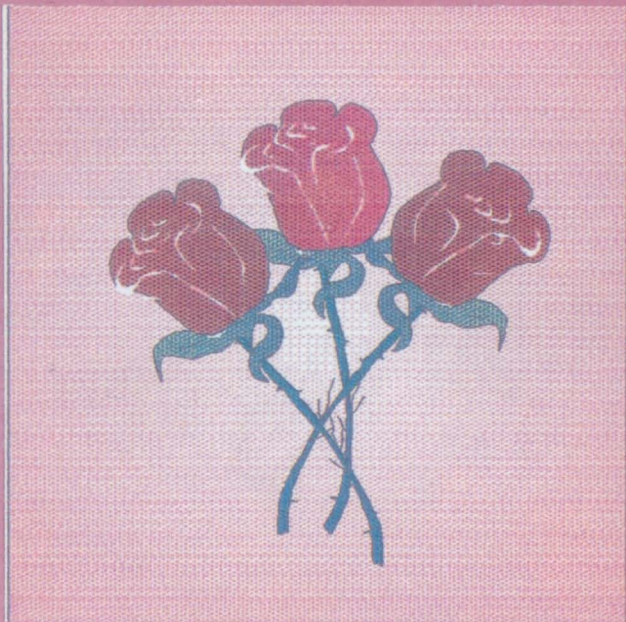

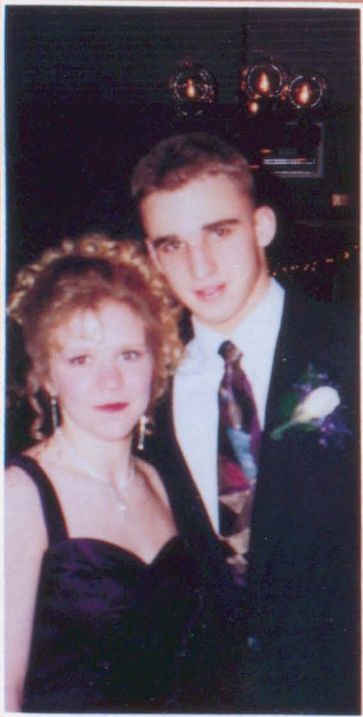

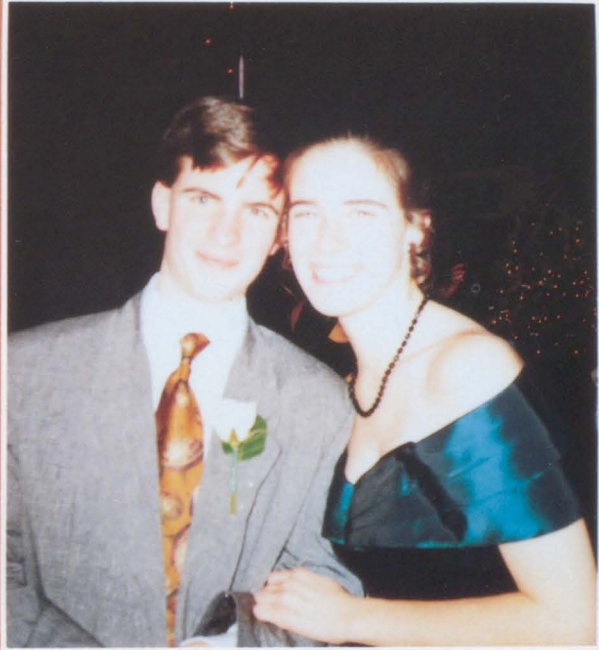

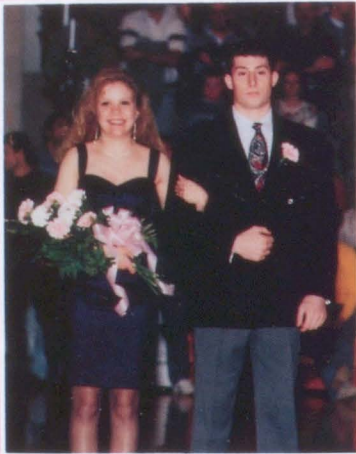

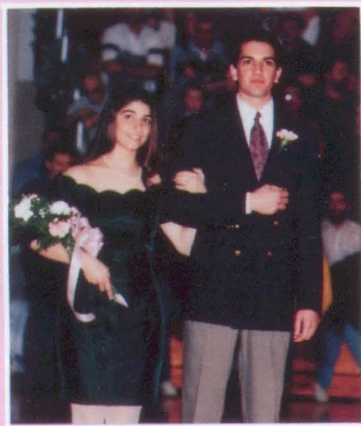

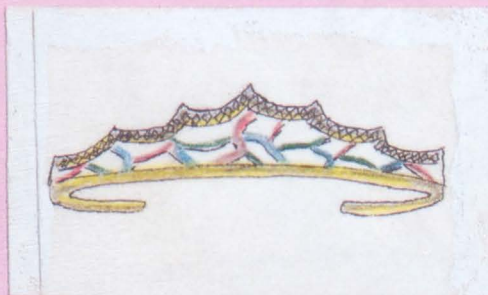

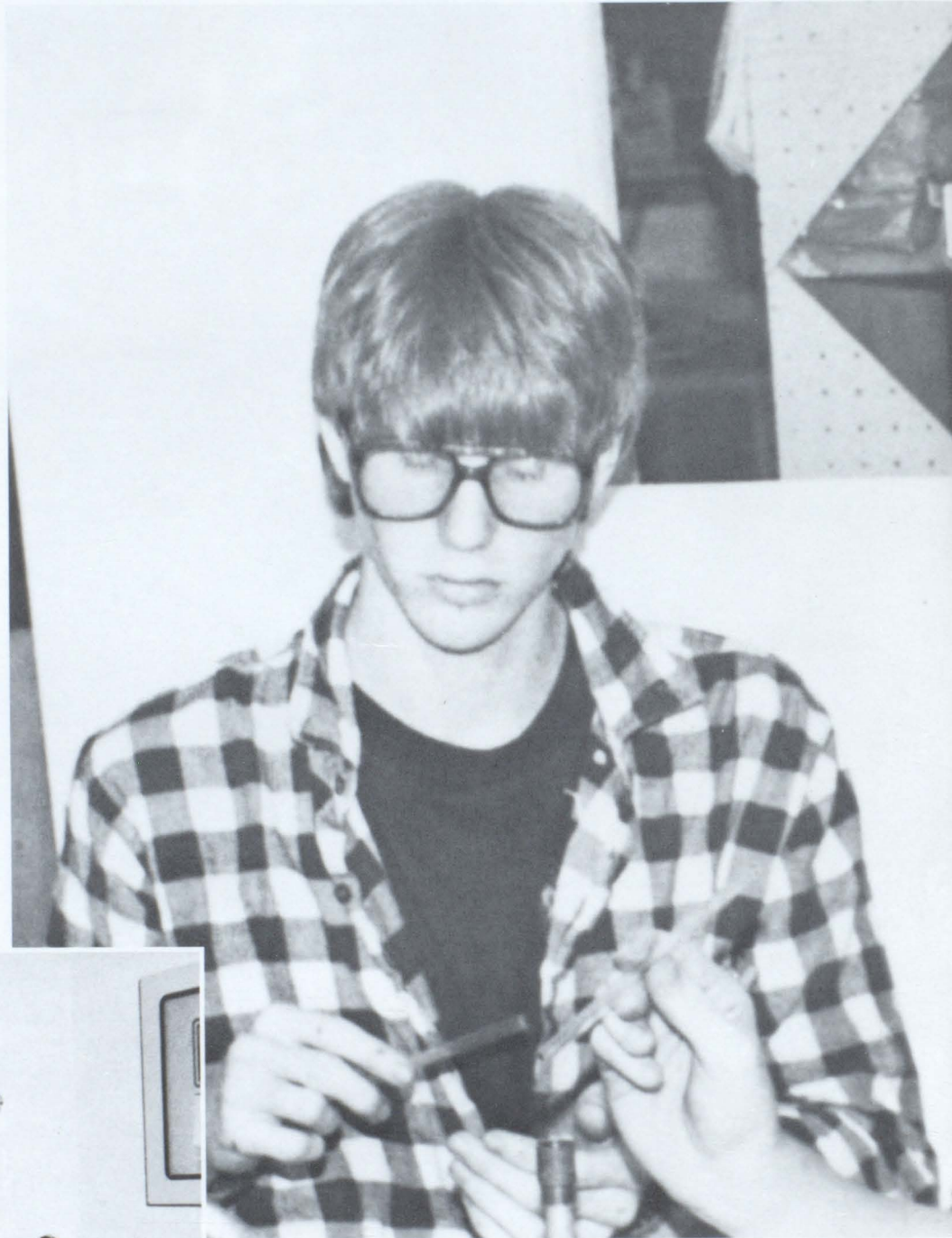

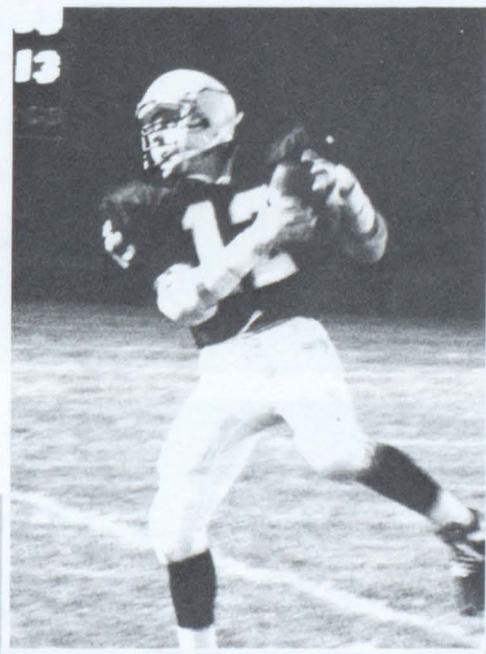

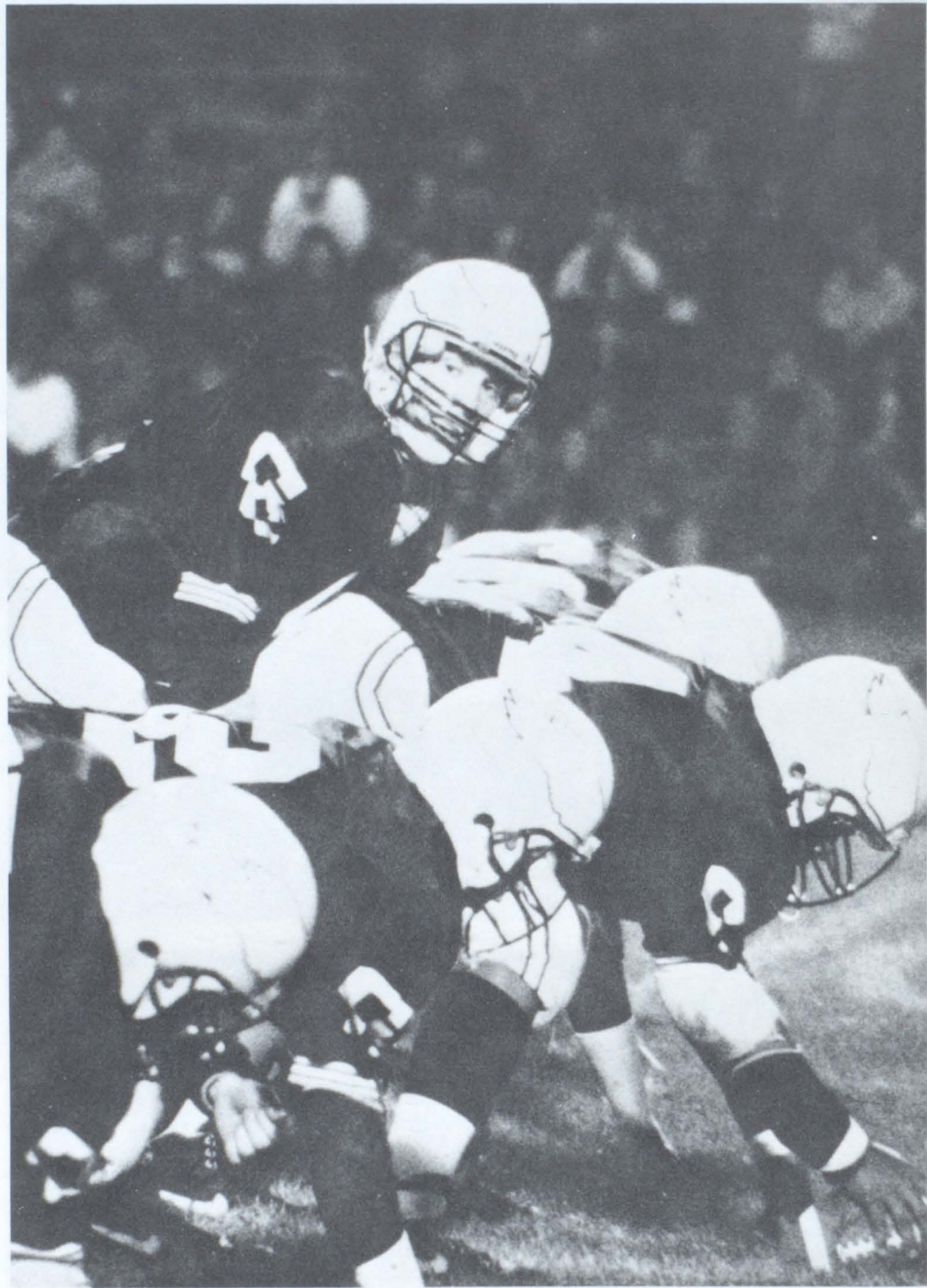

The 1992-93 Grove City Eagle Soccer team made history this season by accomplishing some amazing goals.

But this victory did not come without a price. From early August to early November they worked their hardest to become the champions they are this year. The season began in 85 degree heat and ended in 25 degree weather with icy winds (and just a touch of snow).

Pre-season practices and conditioning took their toll on all players. "The circuit" and Matt Dunkle torture sessions helped to get the team in shape for the challenge ahead.

Mid-season injuries plagued the team but Junior Varsity players rose to the occasion and filled the gaps.

Overall, the Eagles kicked an extremely impressive 12 and 6 in the regular season with a District X AA record of 4 and 0 and a Southern League record of 5 and 5.

The Eagles fought their way into new territory by making the District X play-offs where they played a brutal game against a tough Fairview team and lost 6-1.

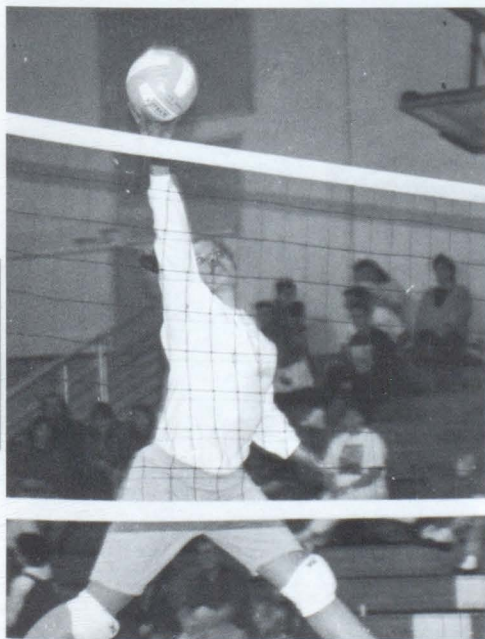

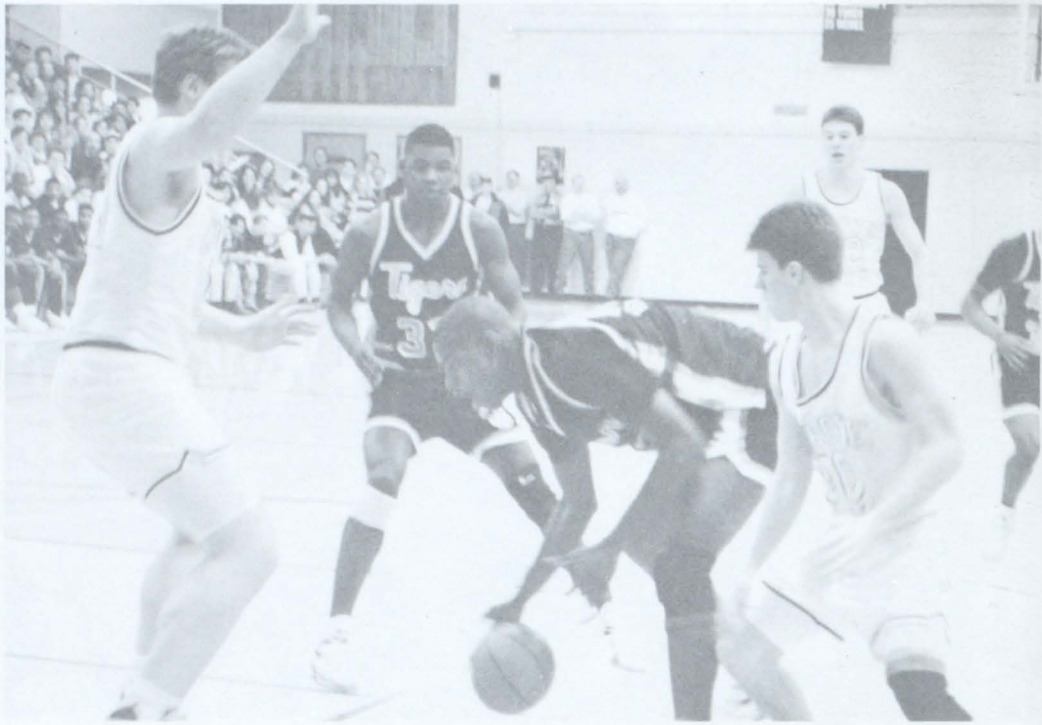

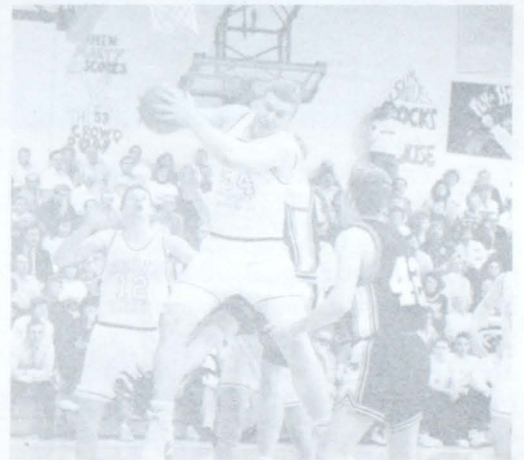

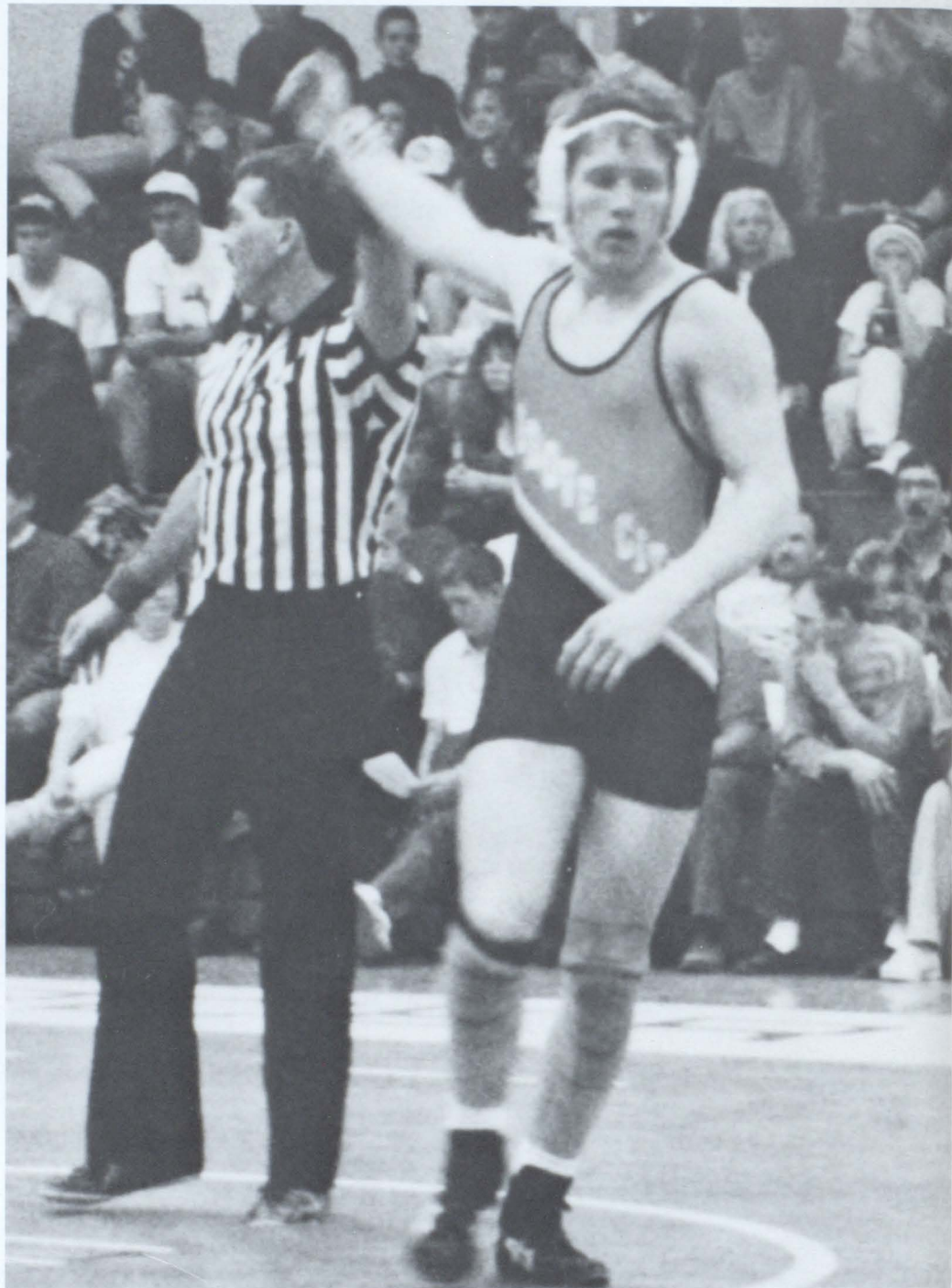

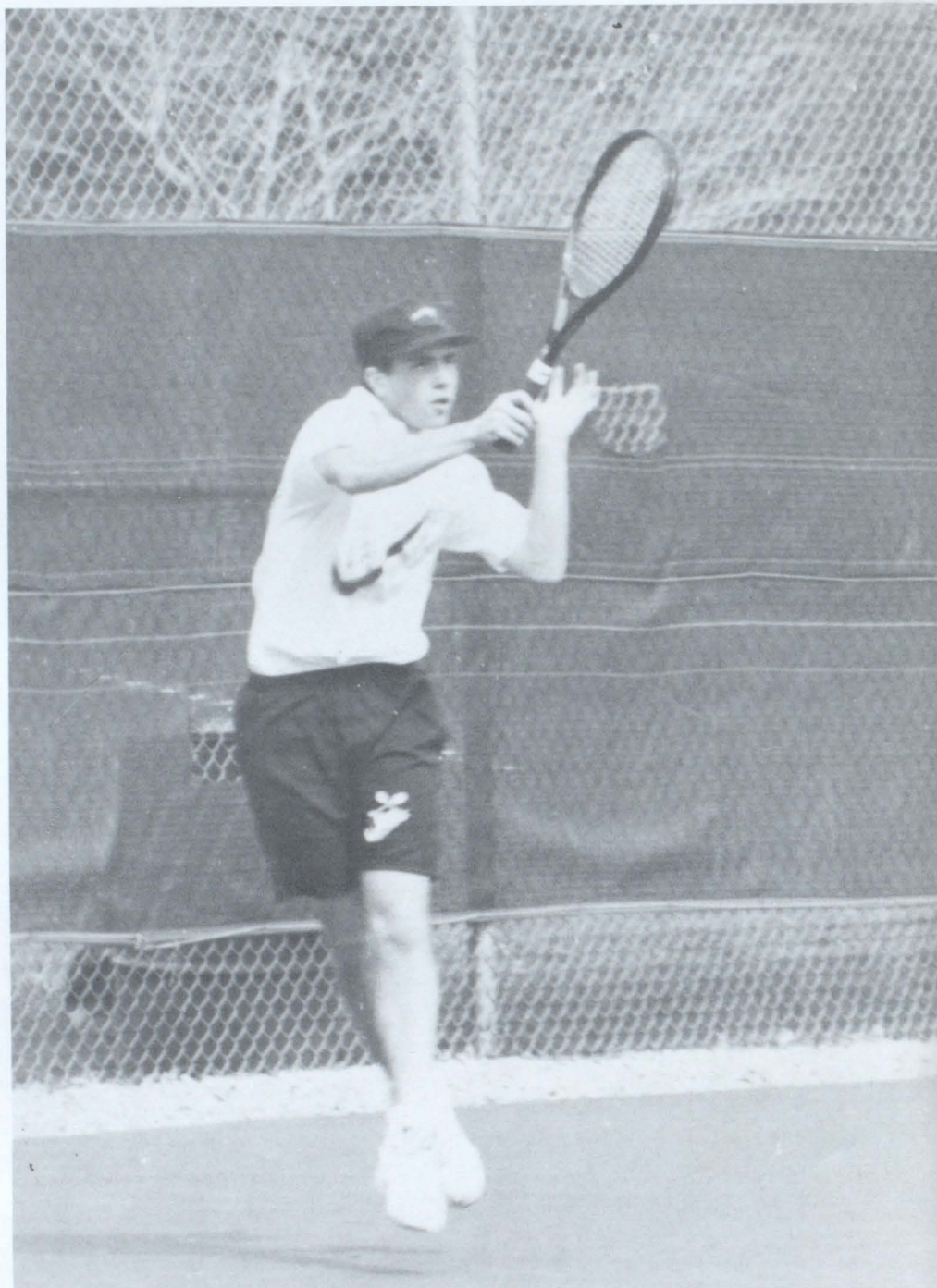

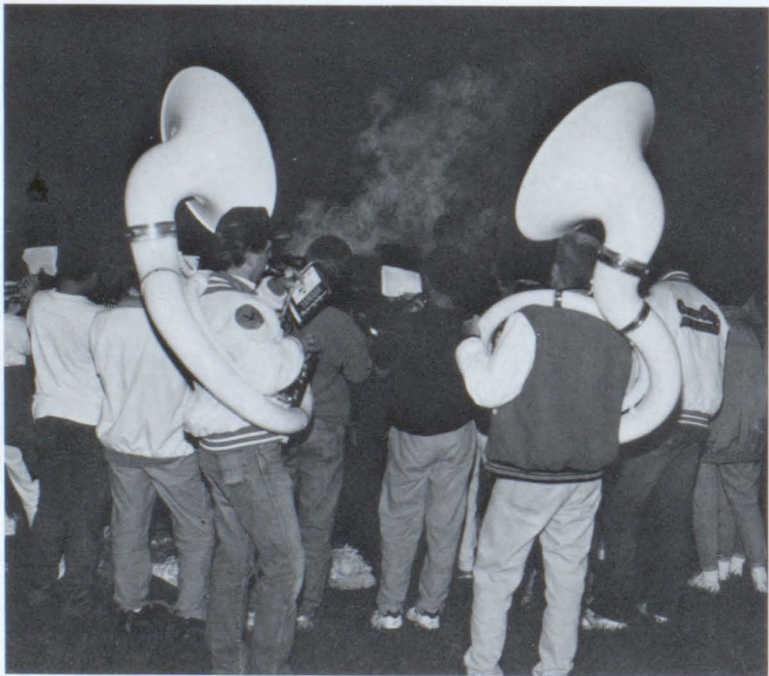

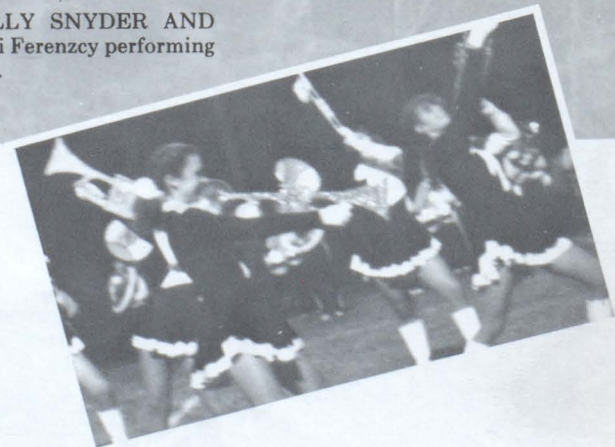

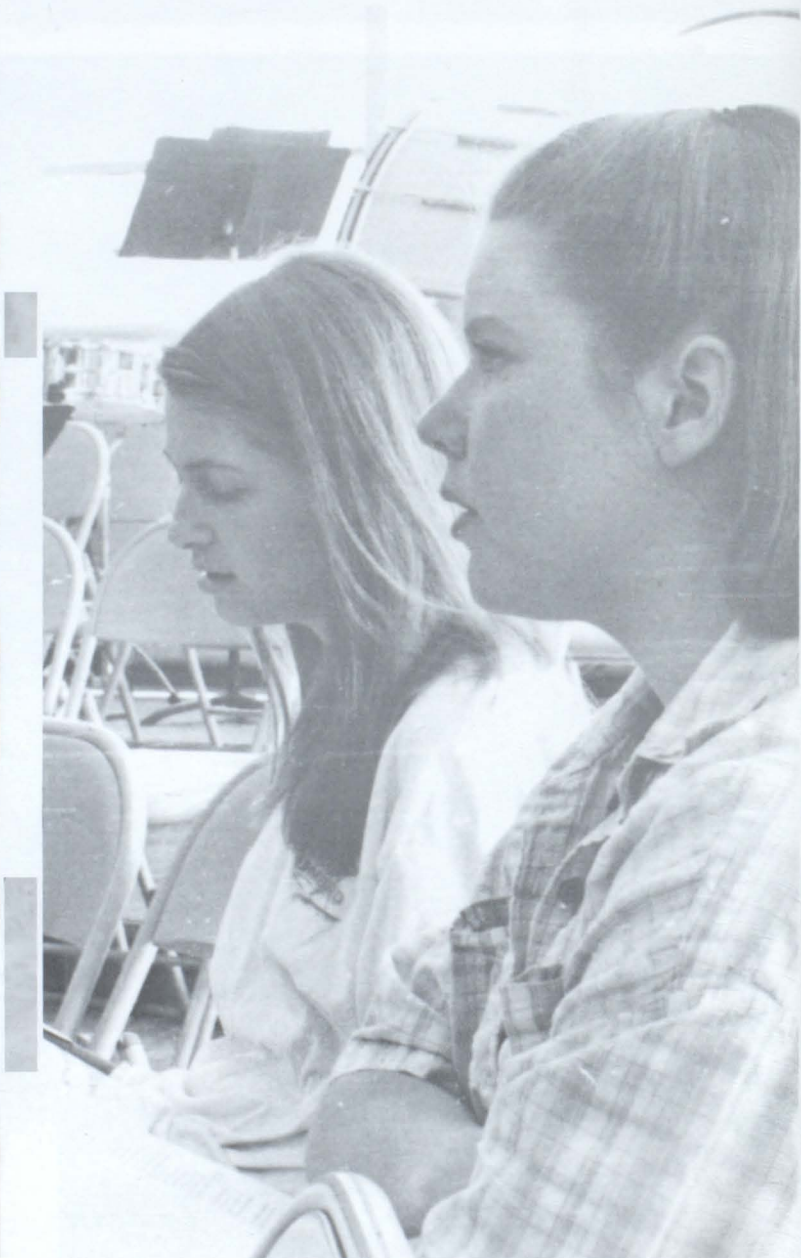

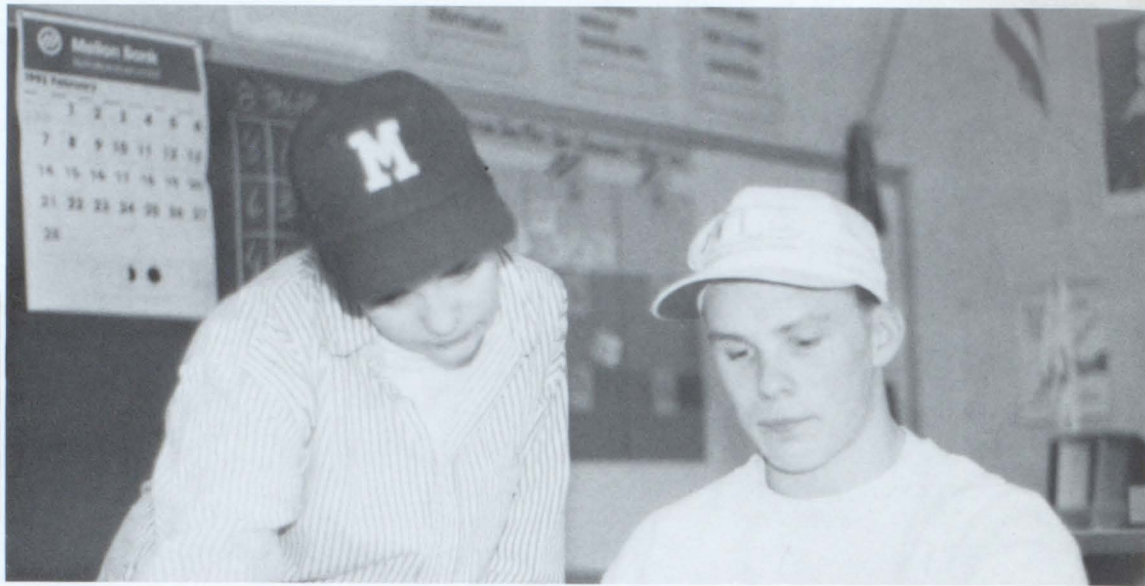

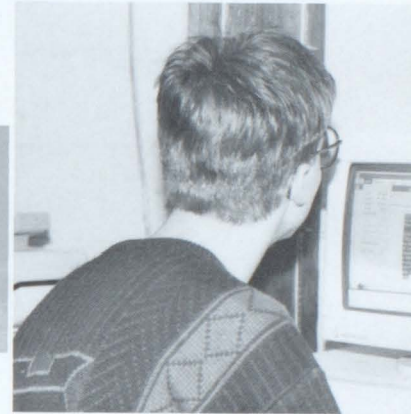
