- As you approach your fourth period class, you spot a substitute inside. What do you do?

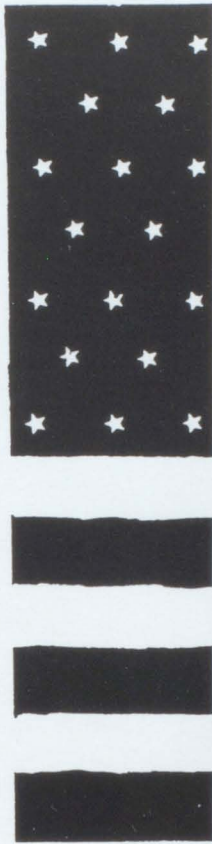
- Continue your conversation in the hall.

PART II-NORMAL NIGHT

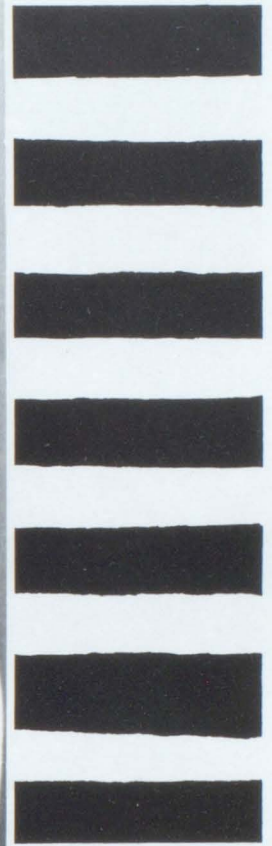
- You're on a Friday night date when you run out of gas. What do you do?

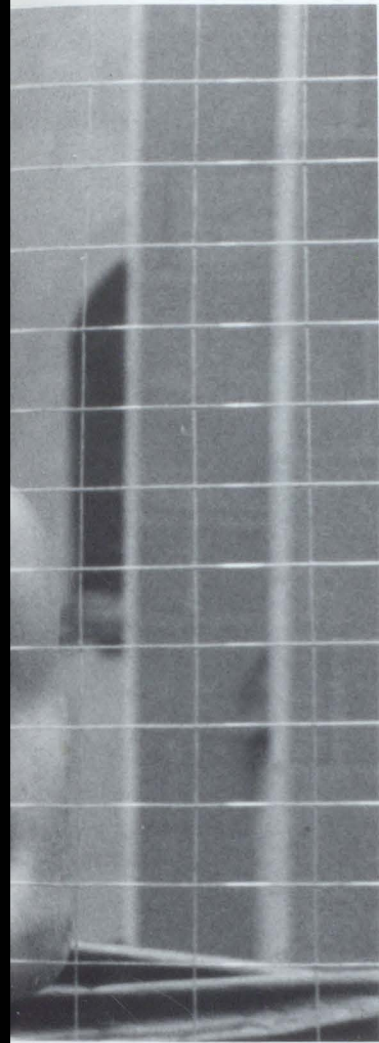

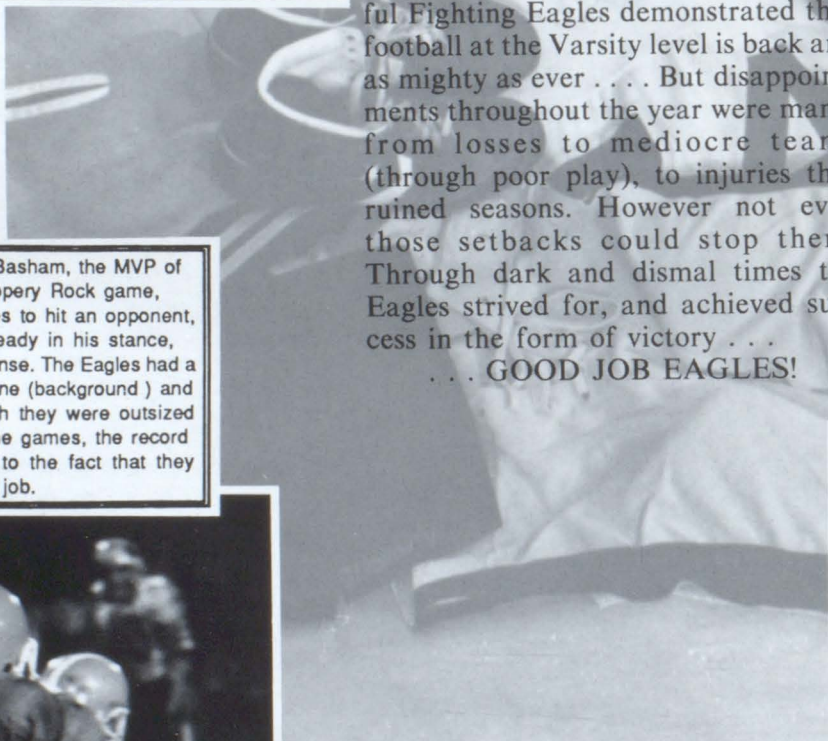

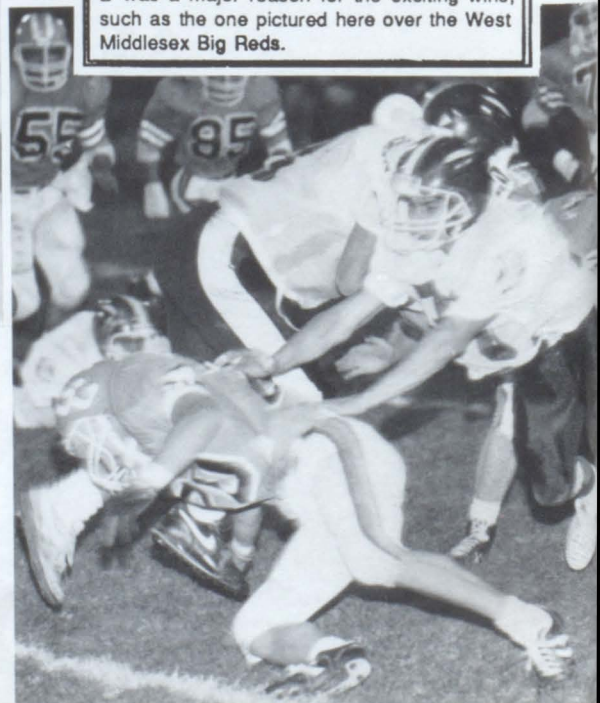

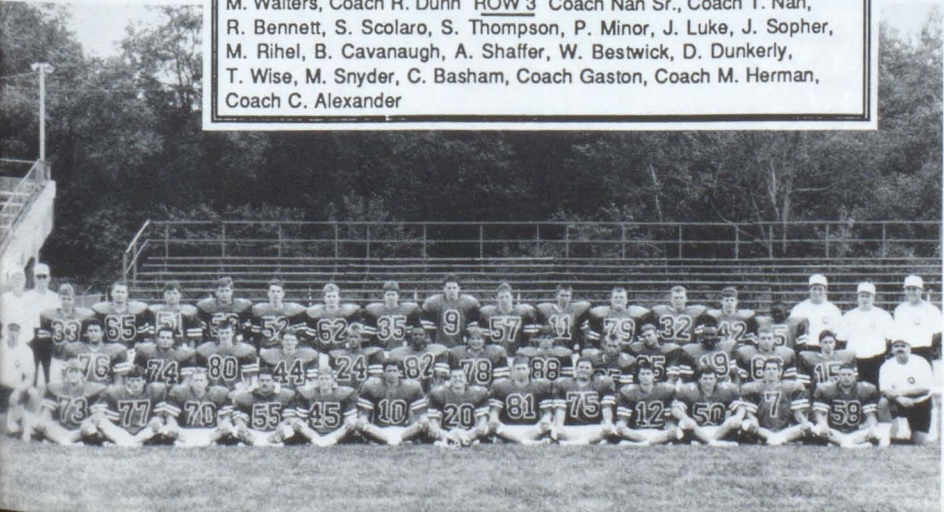

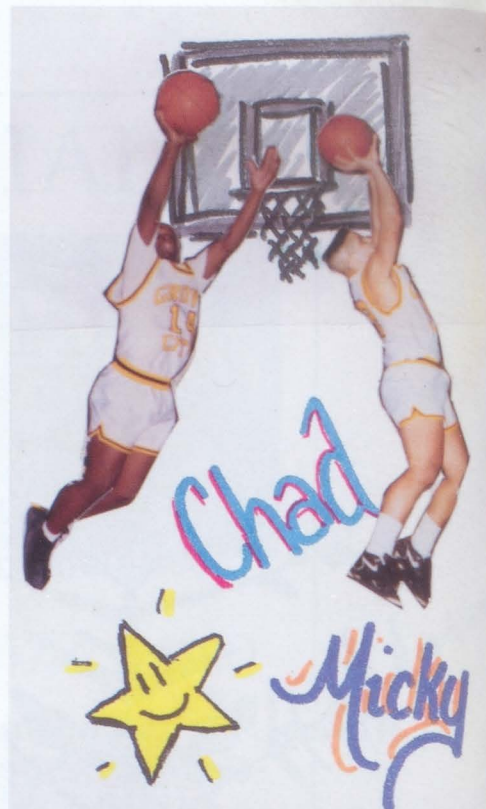
This year's team under the direction of new head coach Don Fee ended the season with 10 wins and 14 losses. Even though the team's record does not show it, many of their losses were by less than six points.

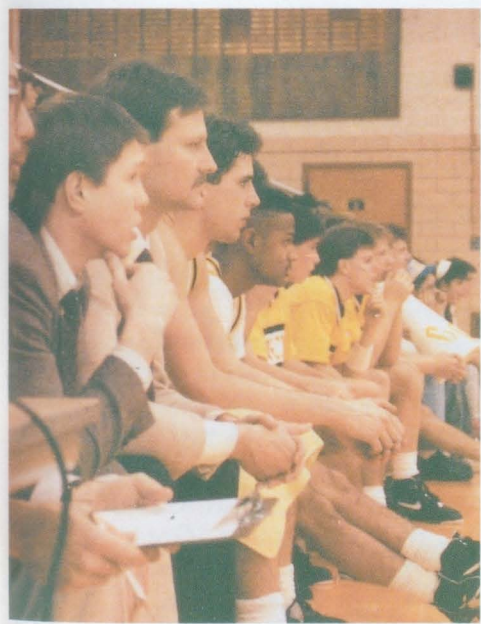

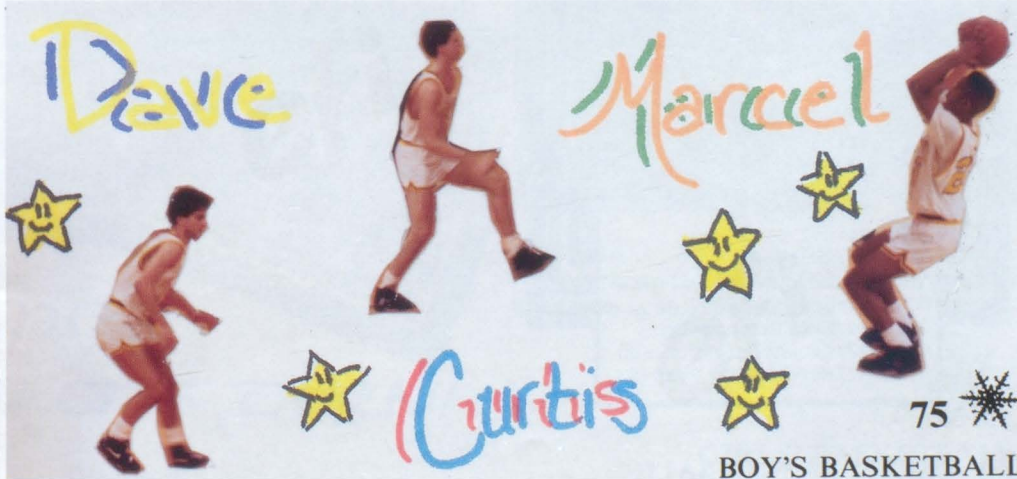

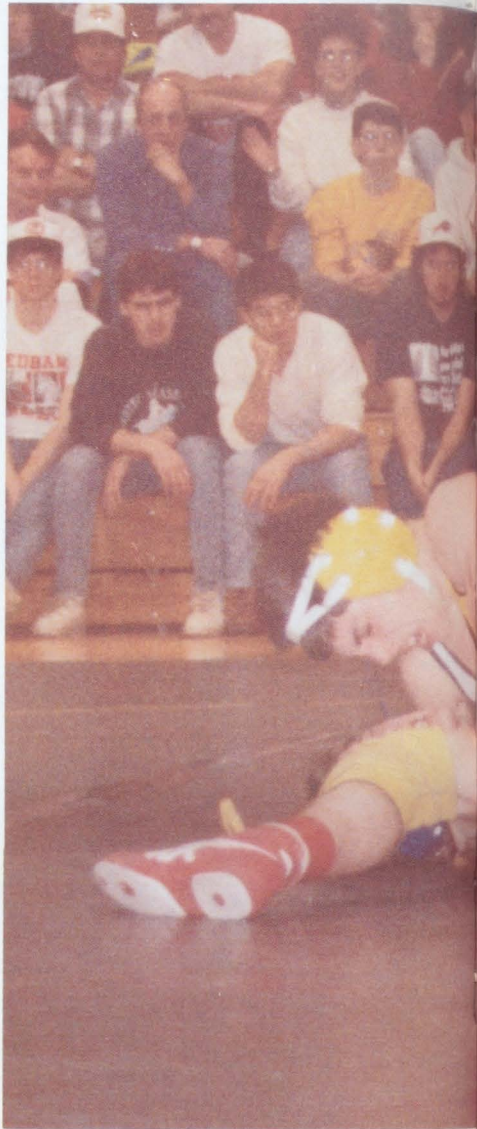
PIN TO WIN

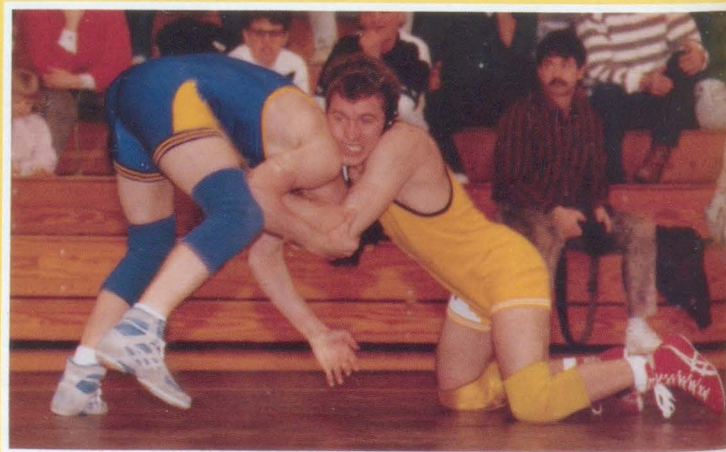
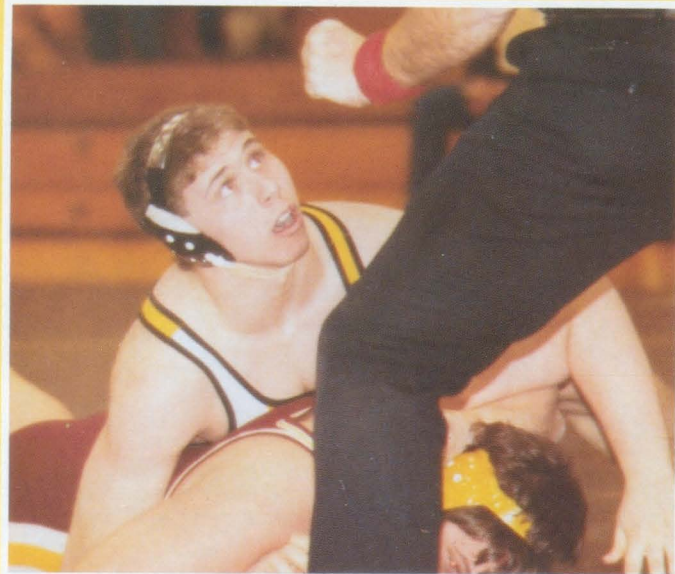

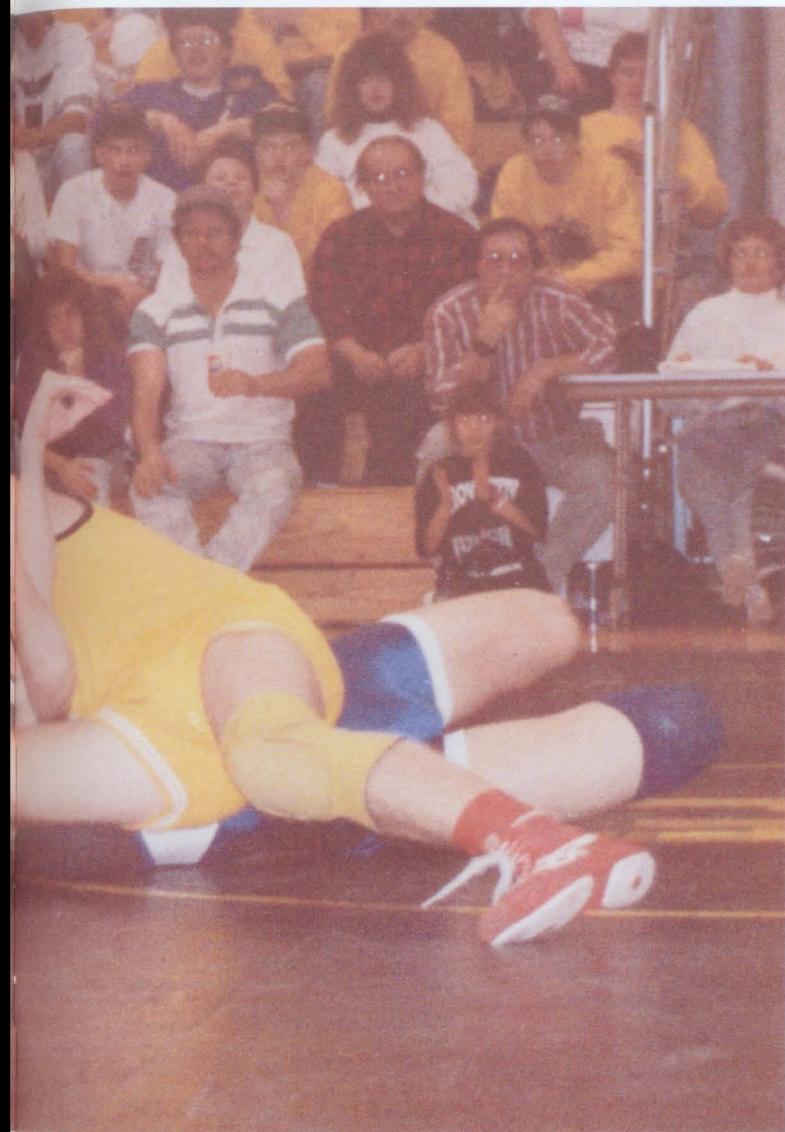

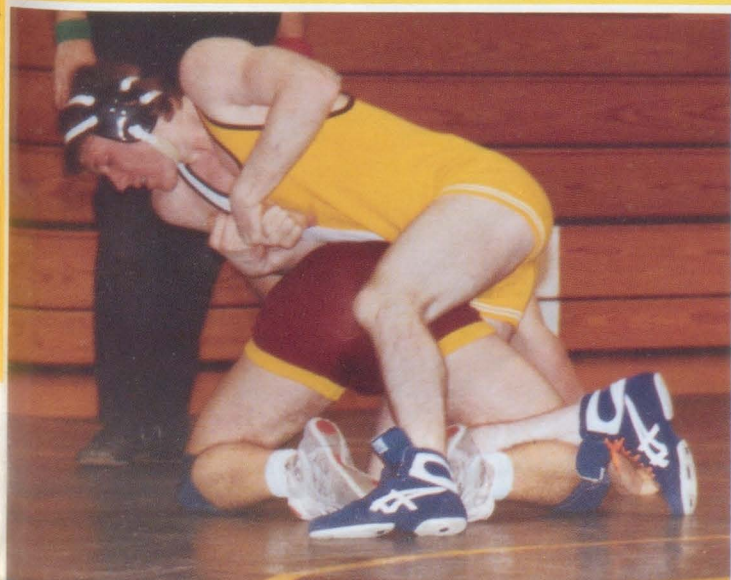

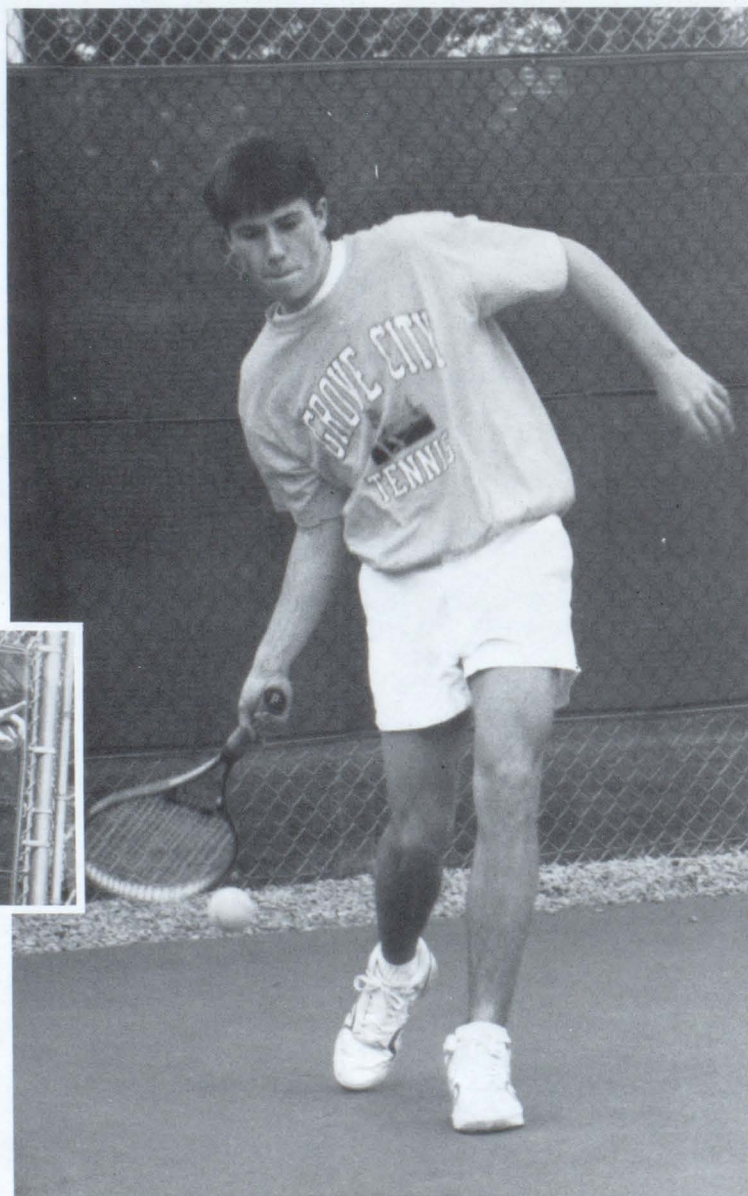

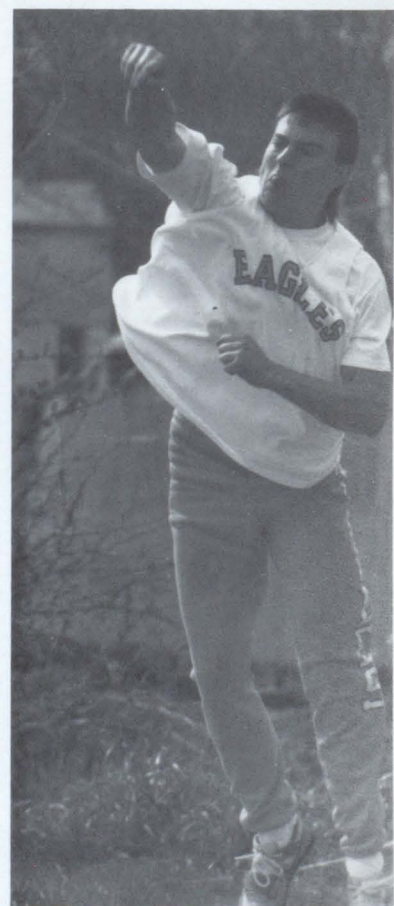

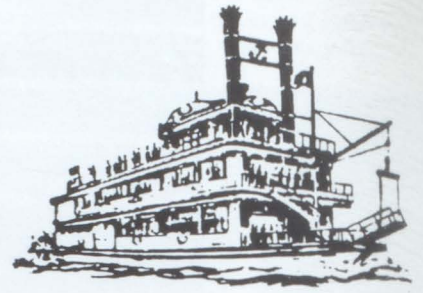

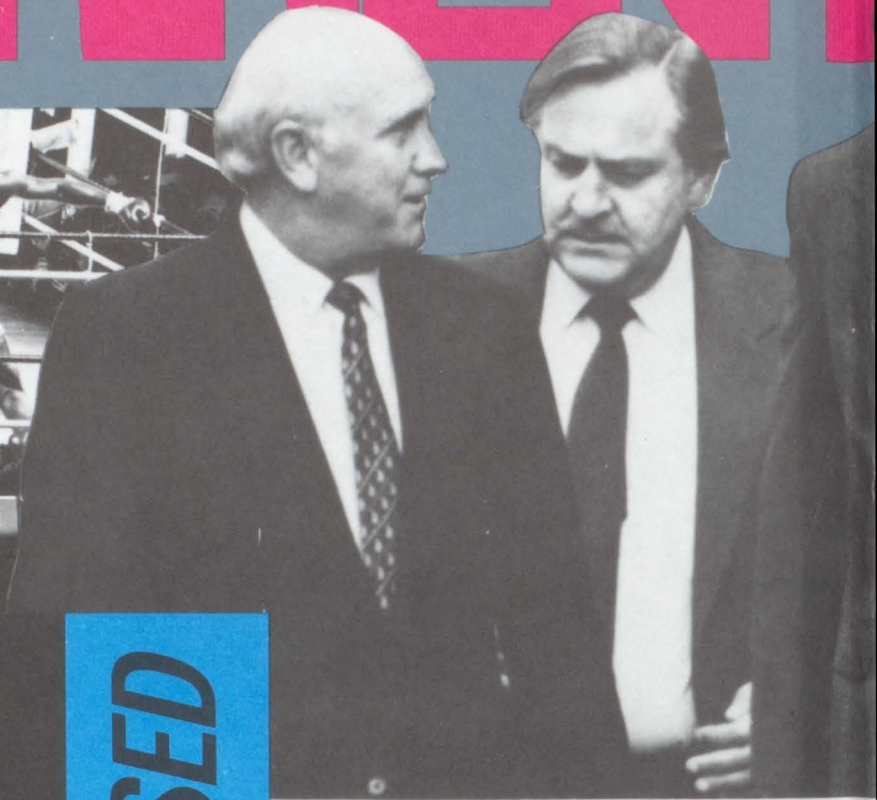
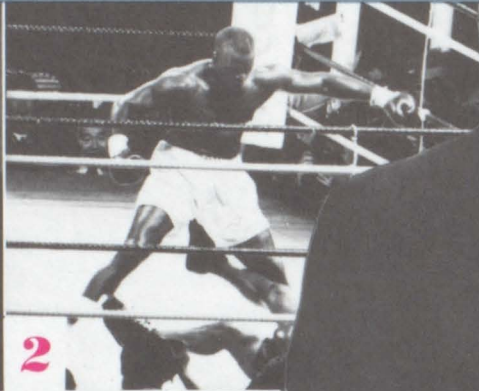
... The Final Season

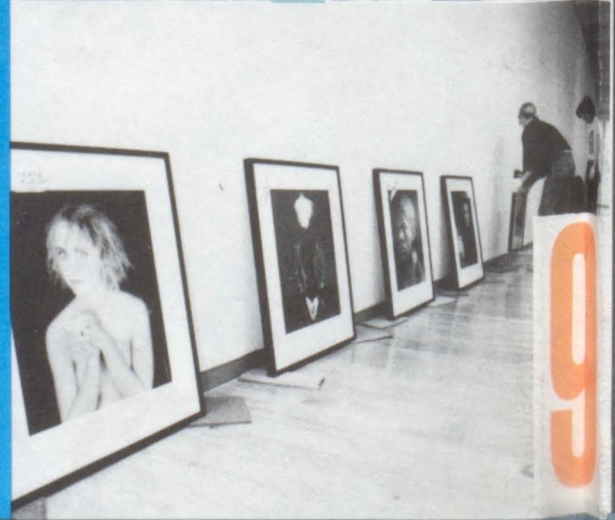

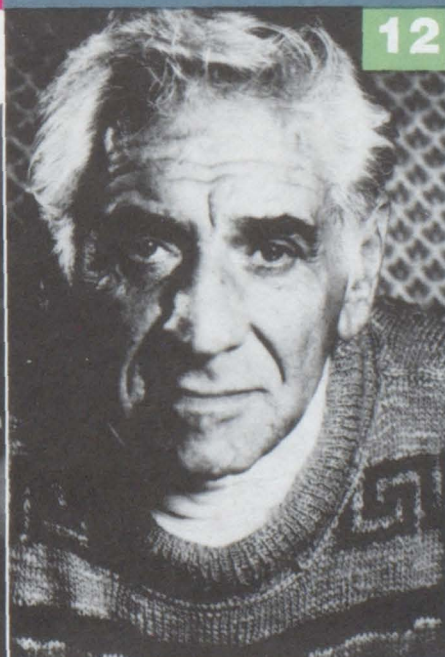
