Although the early dismissal

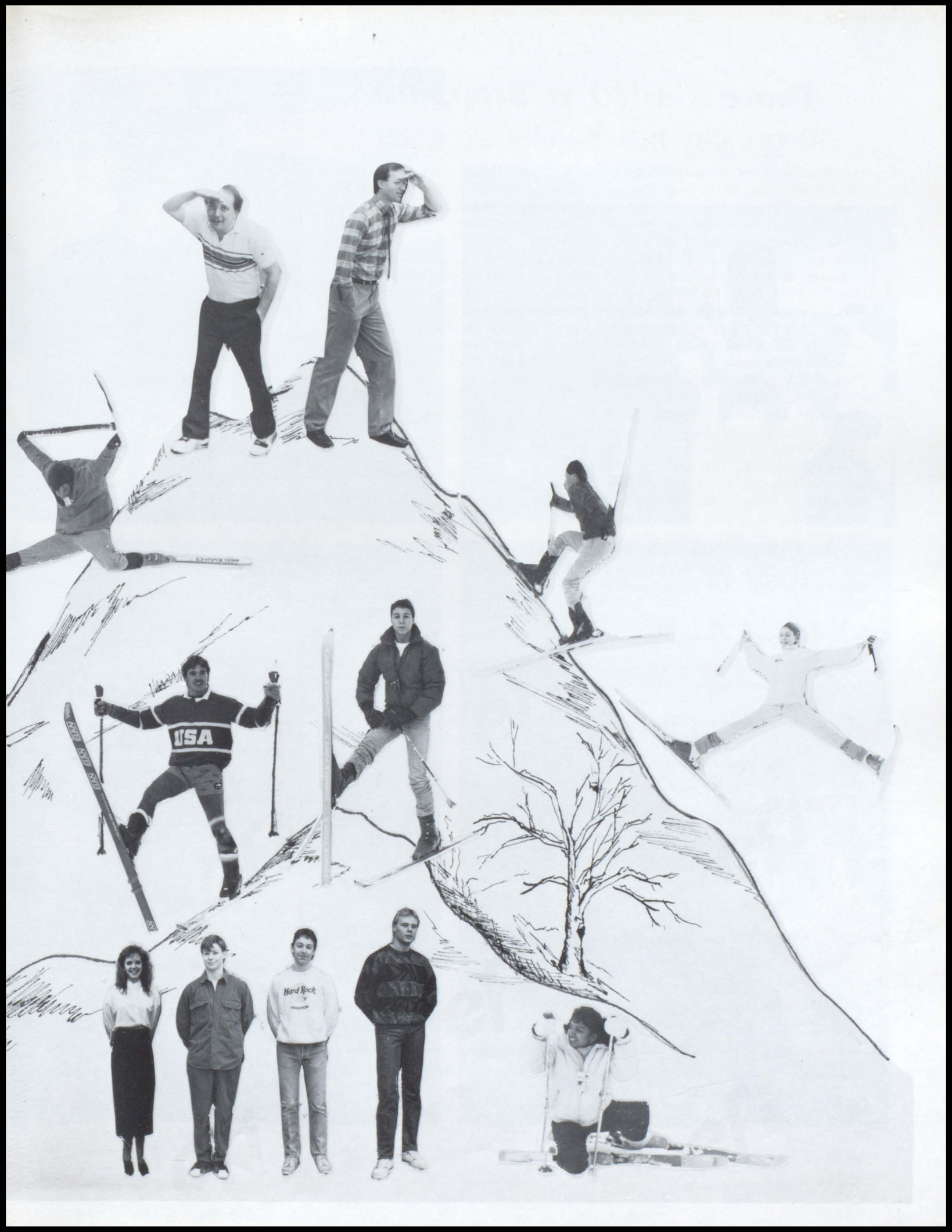

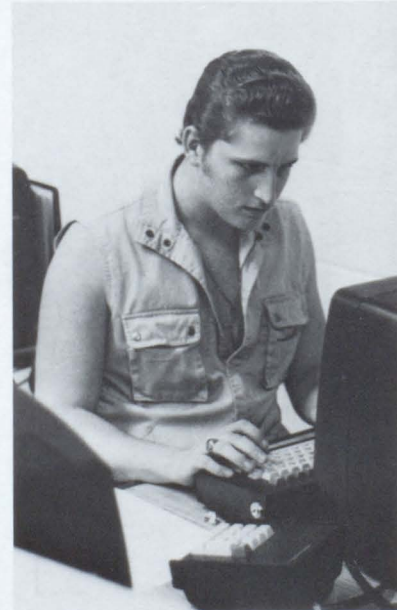

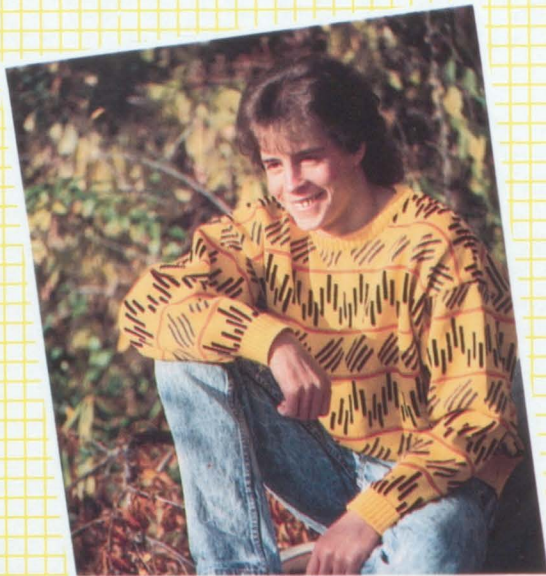

**HOW TO PLAY THE GAME:** It does not matter who makes the first move, as long as the other

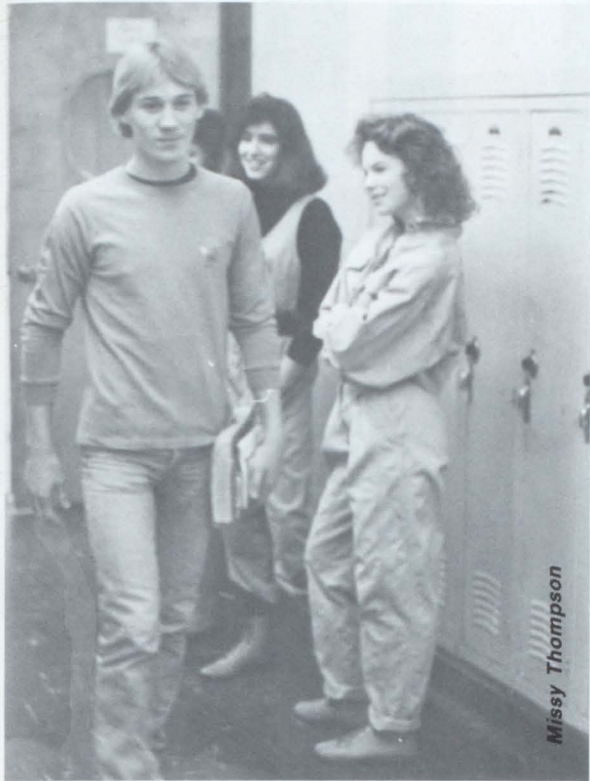

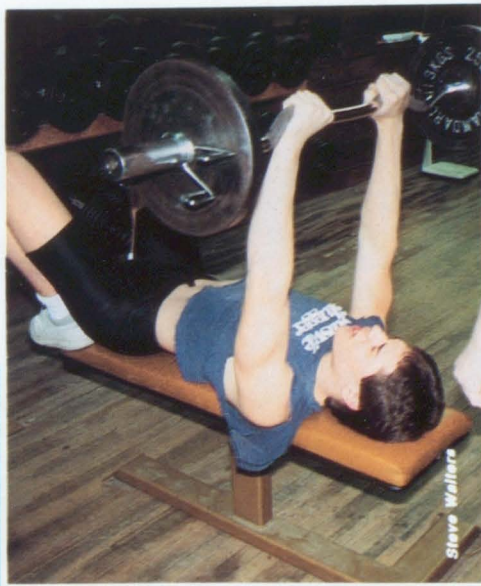

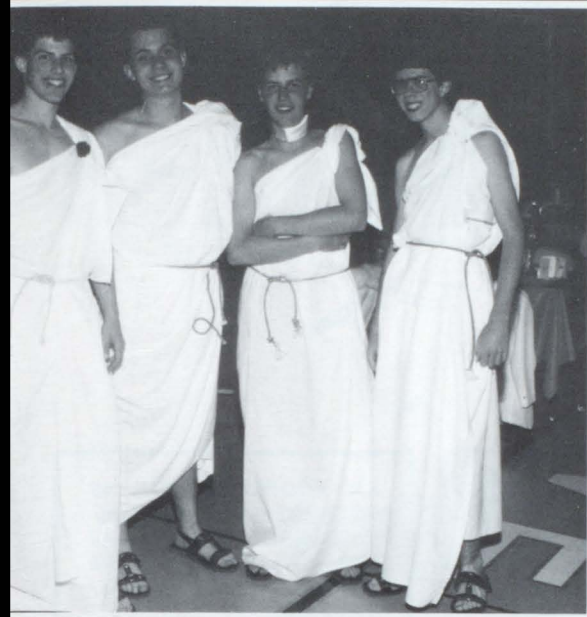

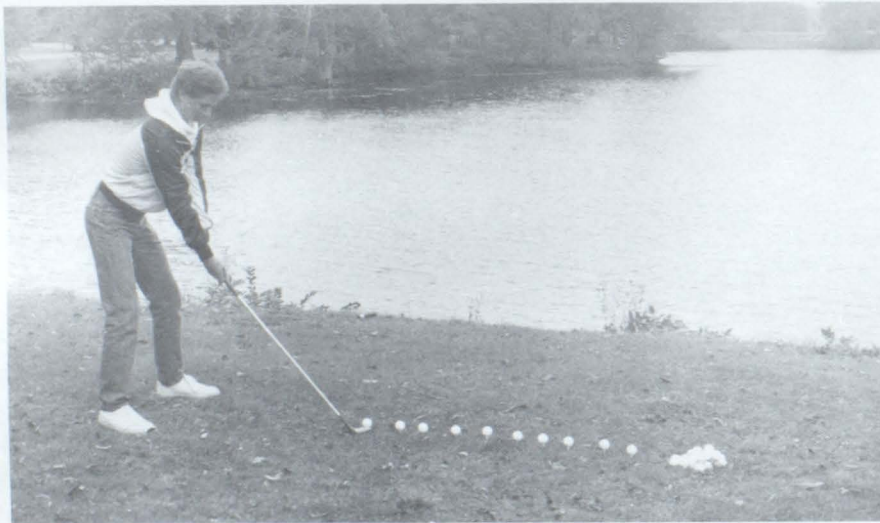
The only regret Coach Lenny Clarke had was the loss of four seniors. "We will be losing several valuable seniors. They will be hard to replace," he lamented.

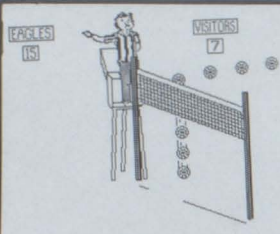

## Hard Fought Success

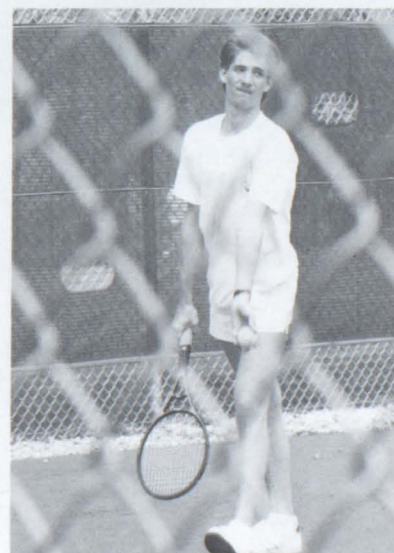
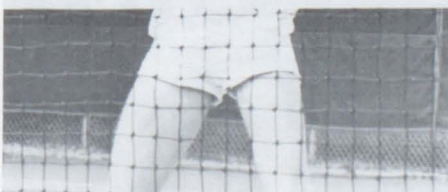
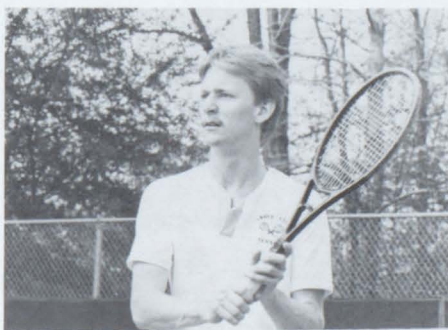

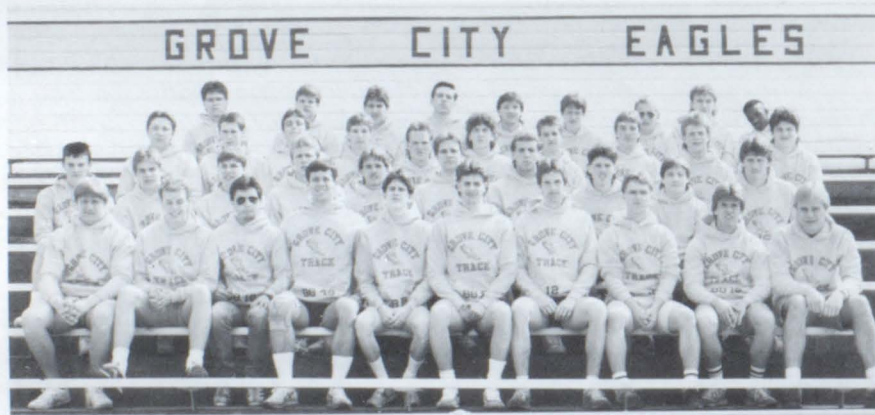

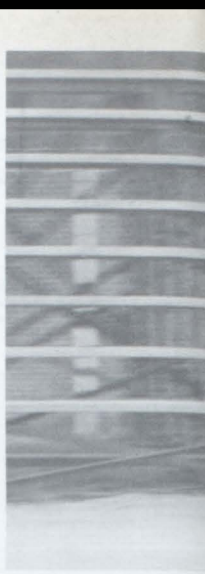

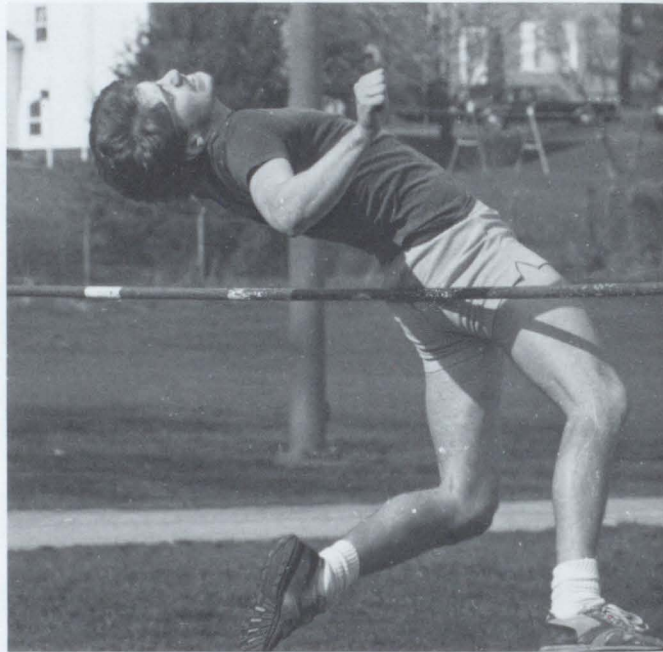

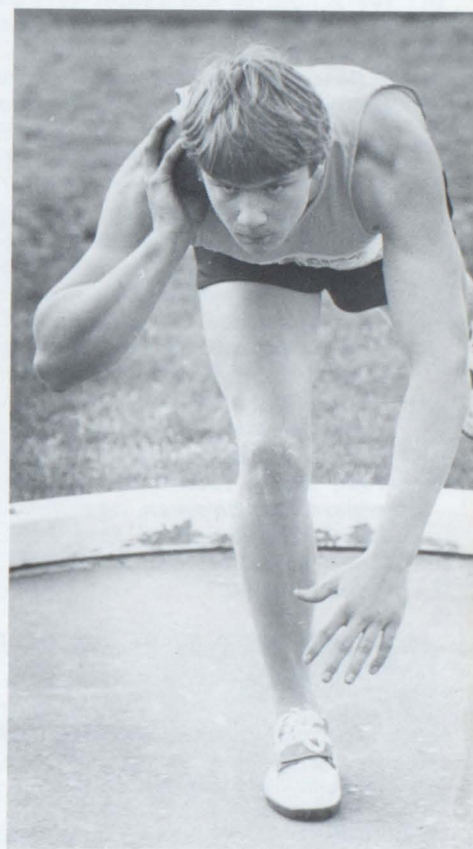

Faced with obstacles all the way and yet Eagle wrestlers came out on top!



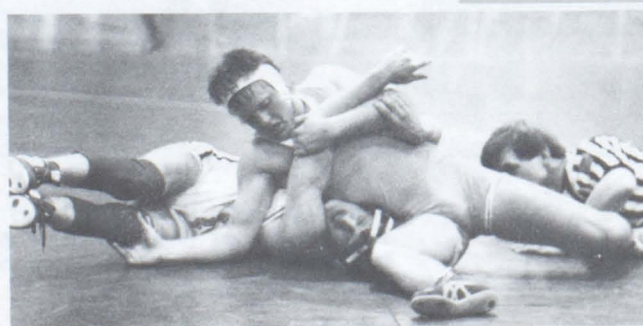
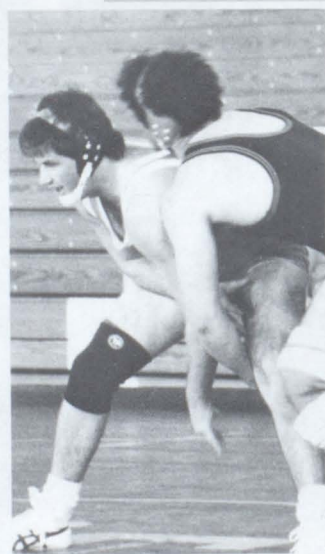

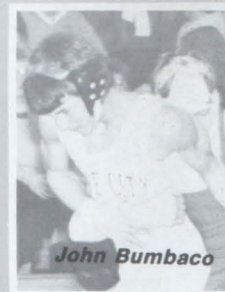

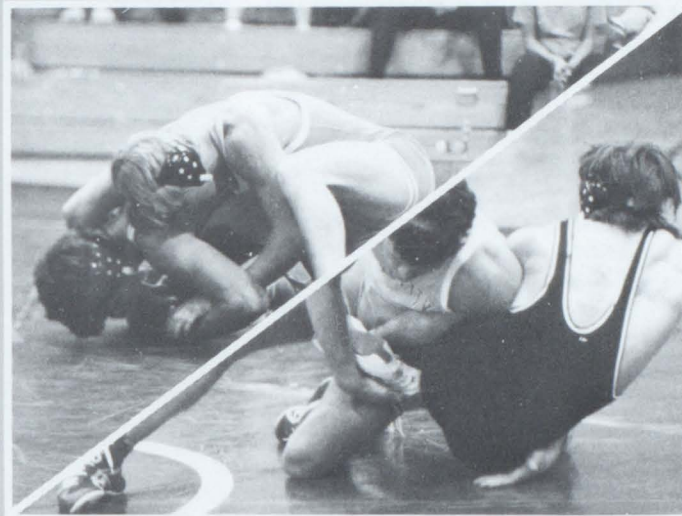

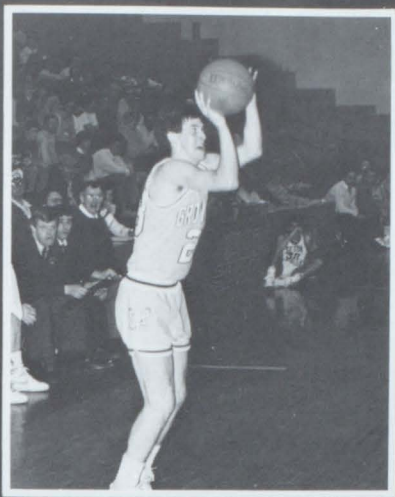

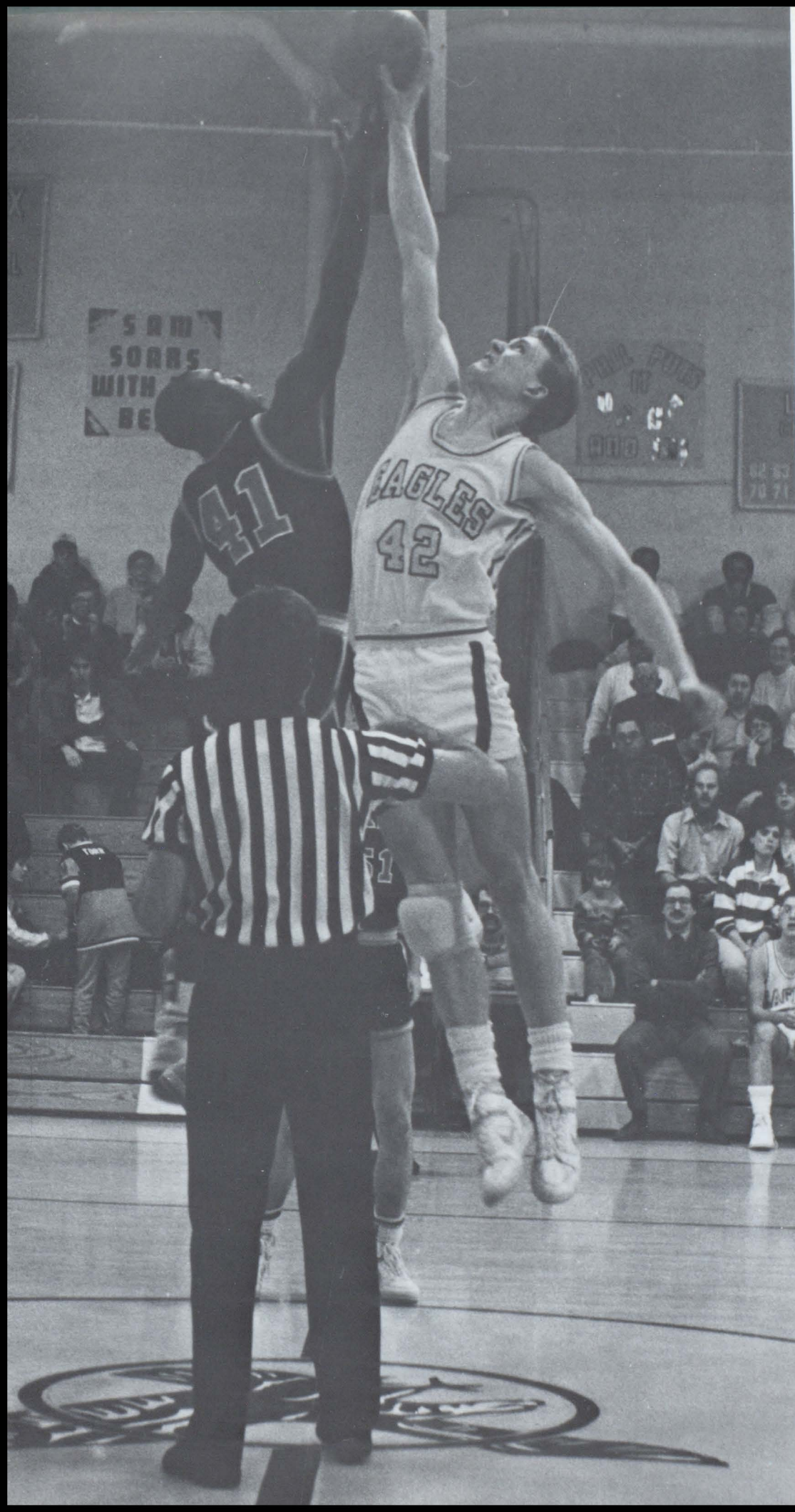

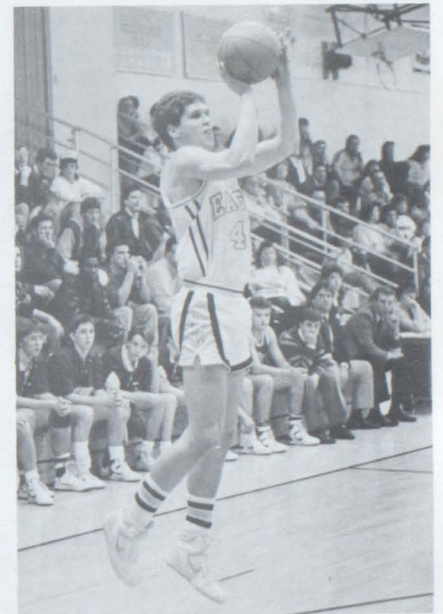

Team members of the 1988 Grove City Sr. High School Baseball Team will forget most of the details of their season, but they will never forget they were the "first" team.

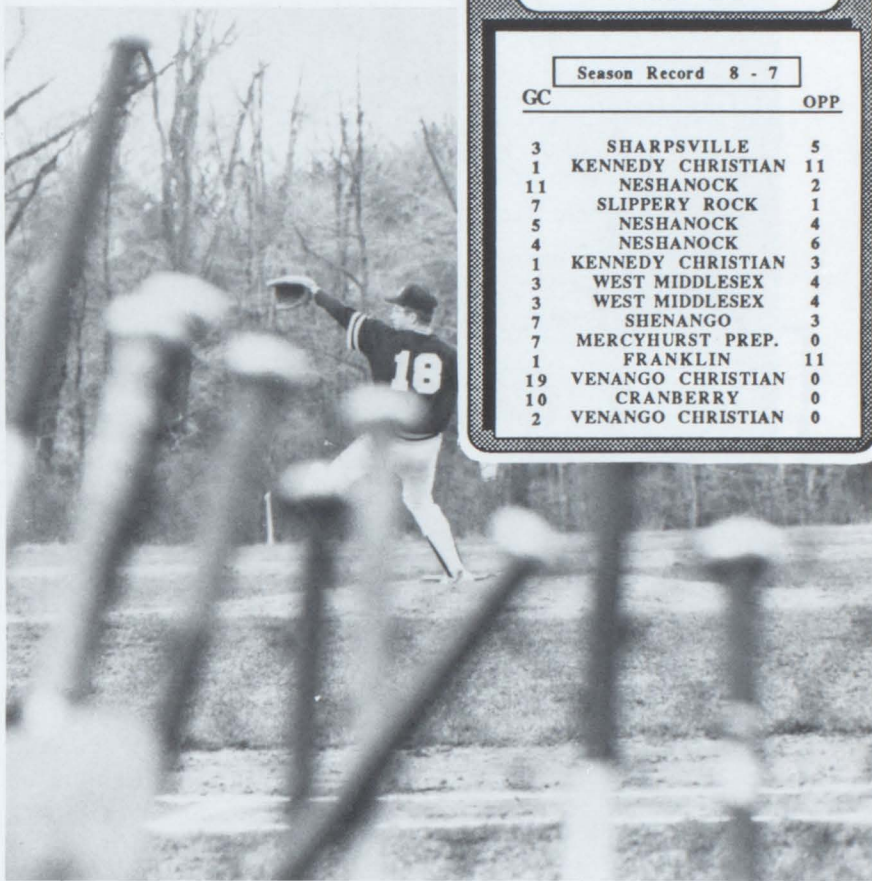
