The Junior Varsity team also finished with a record of 14-2.

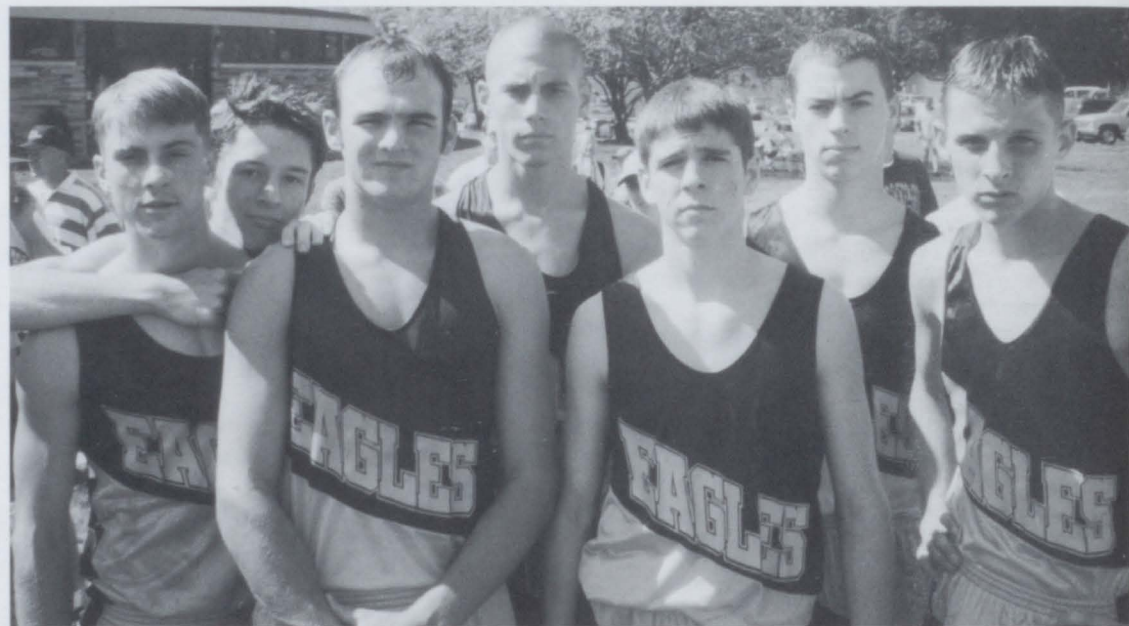

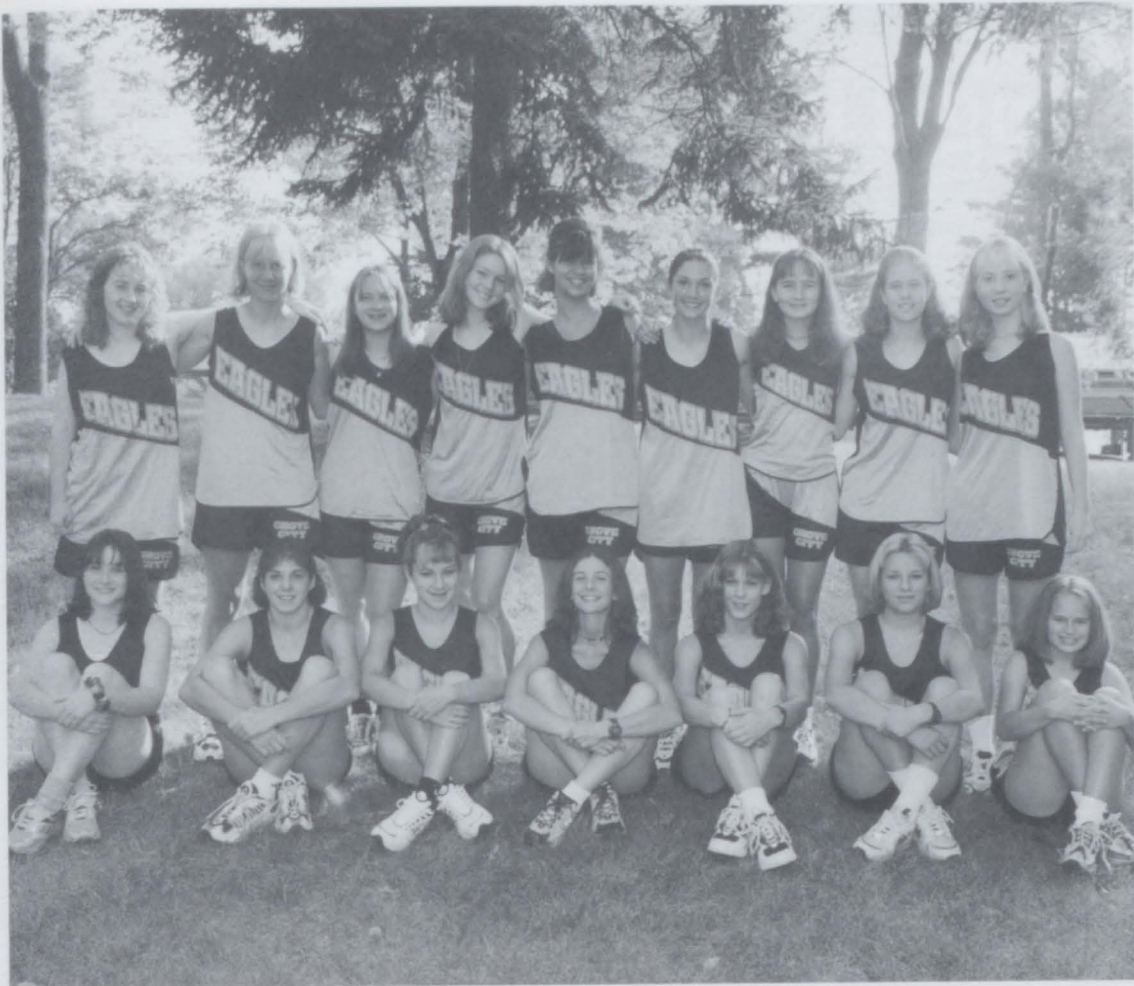

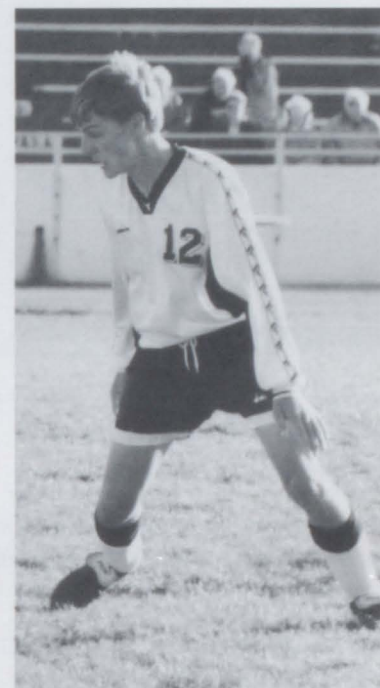

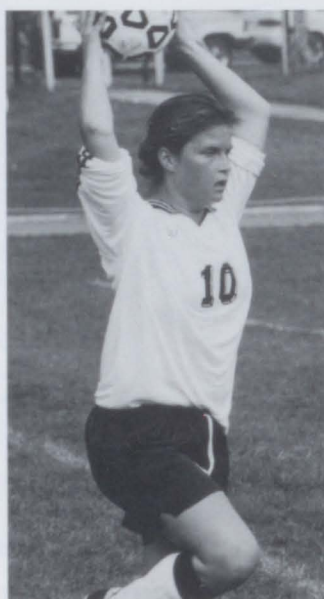

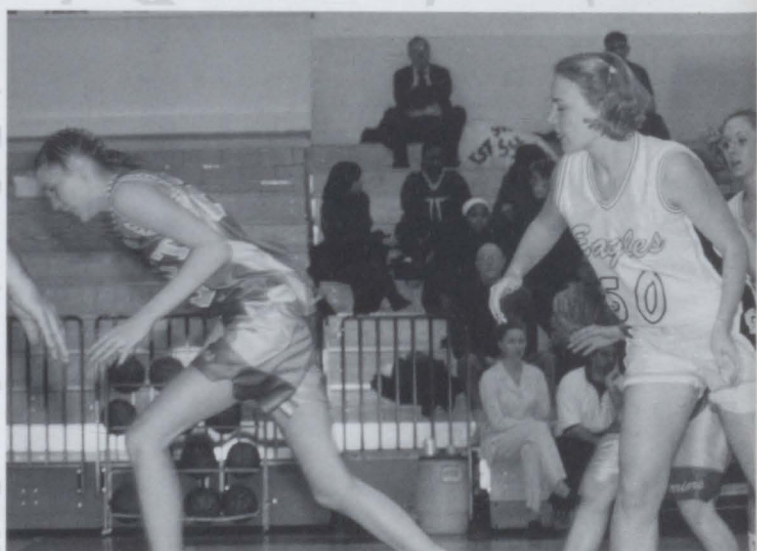

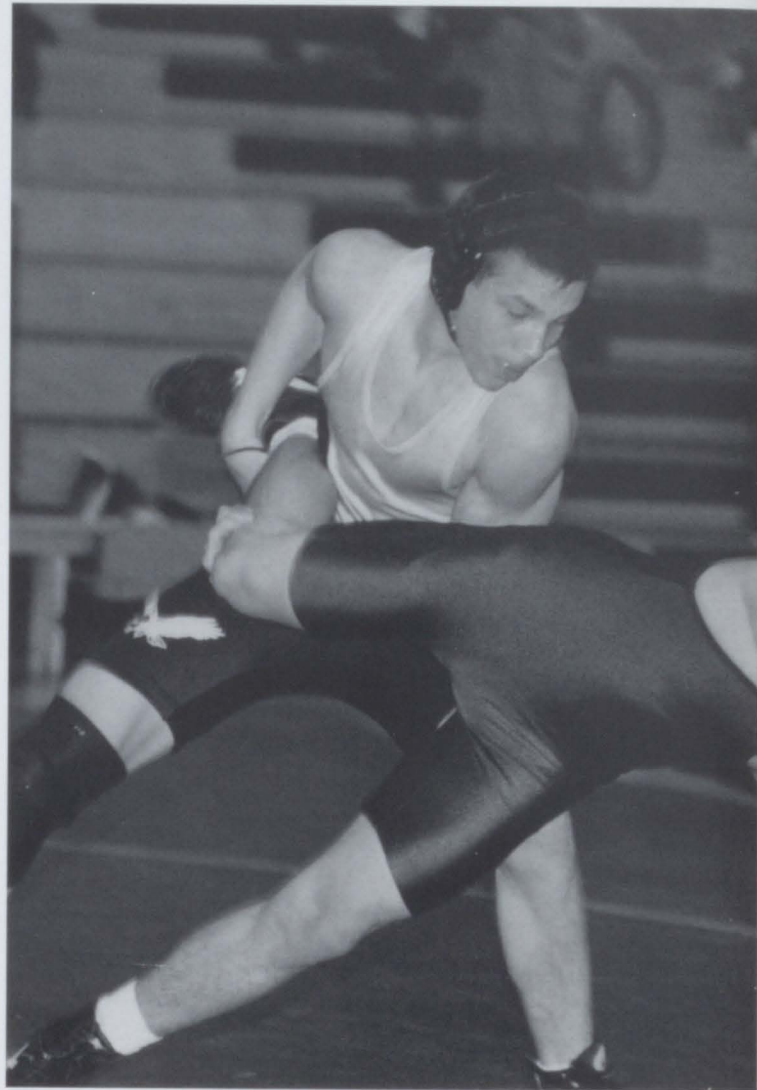

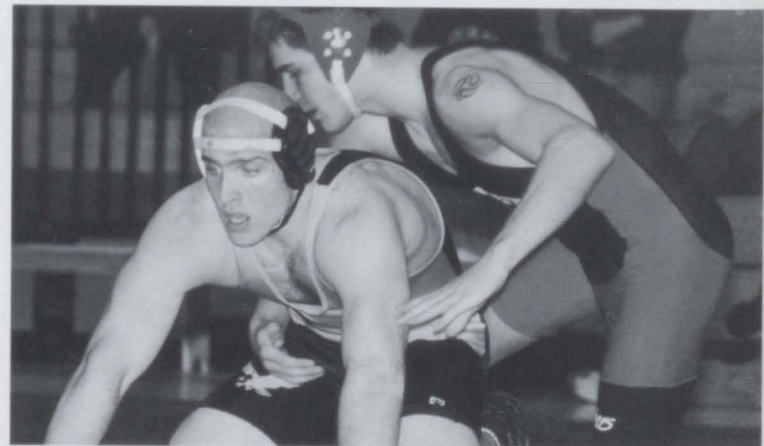

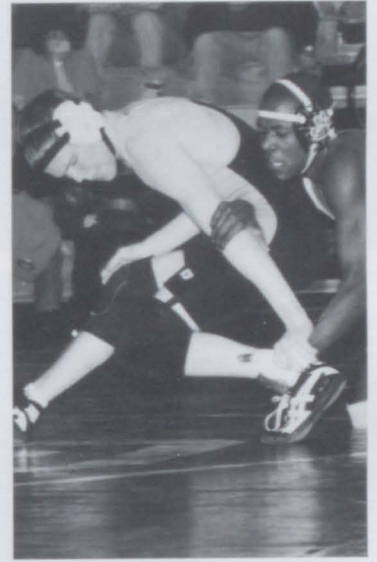

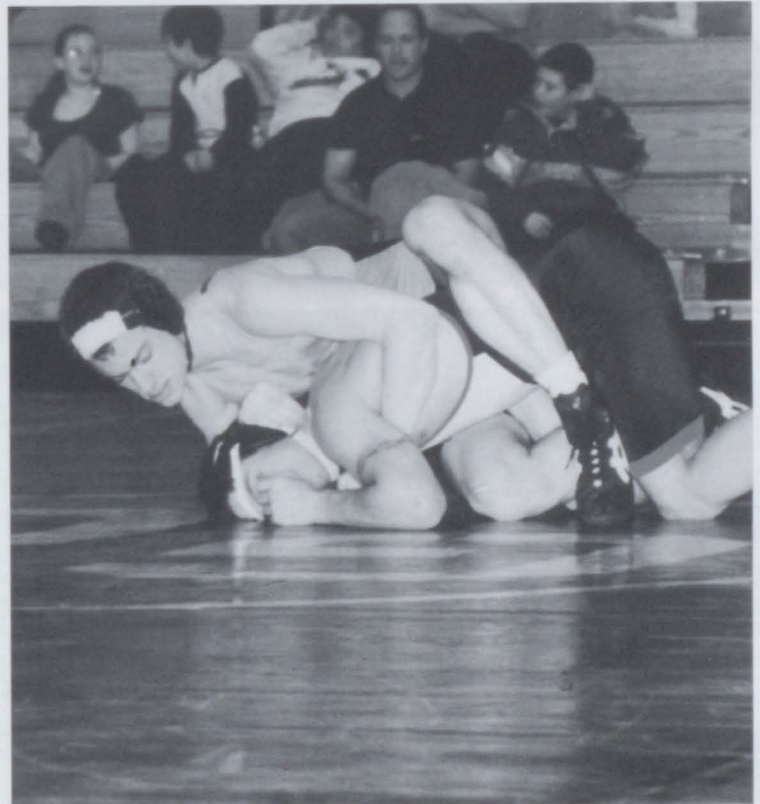

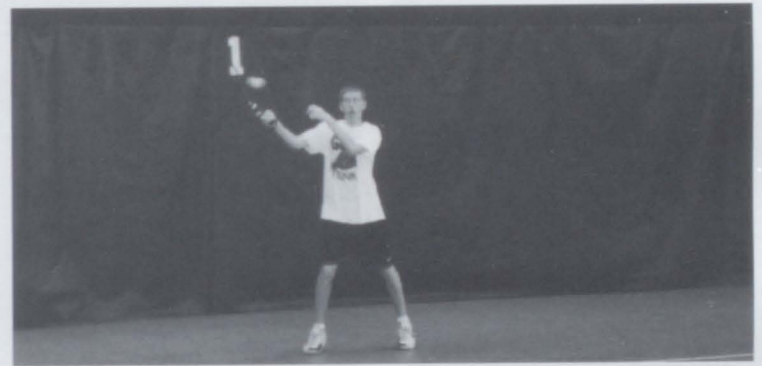

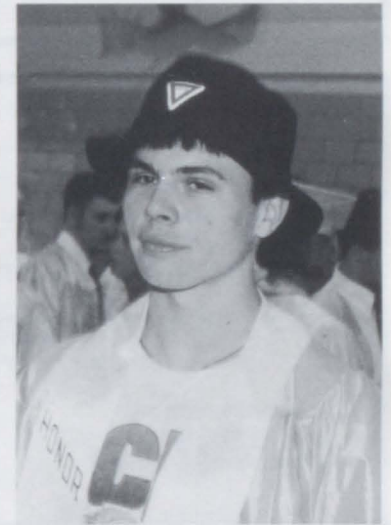

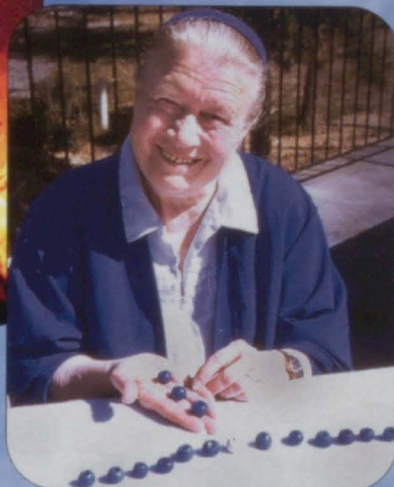

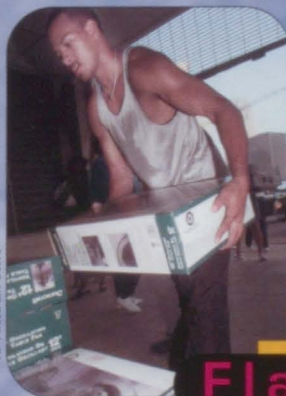

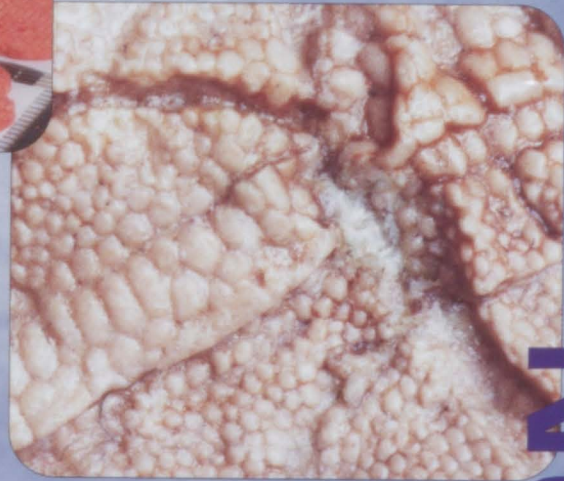

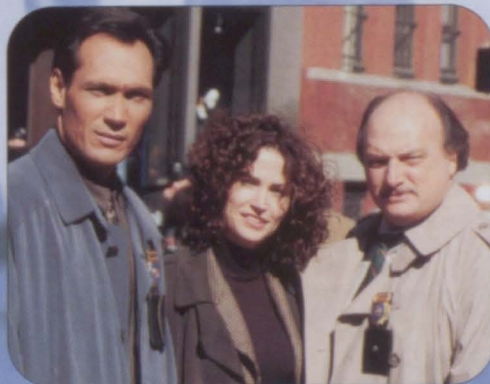

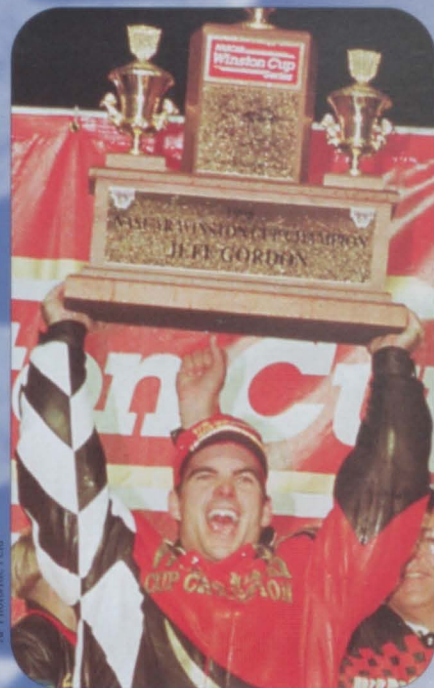

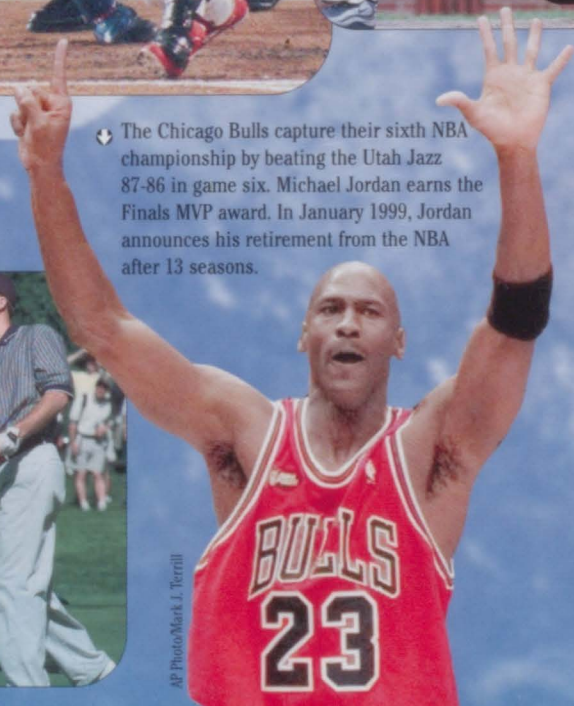
