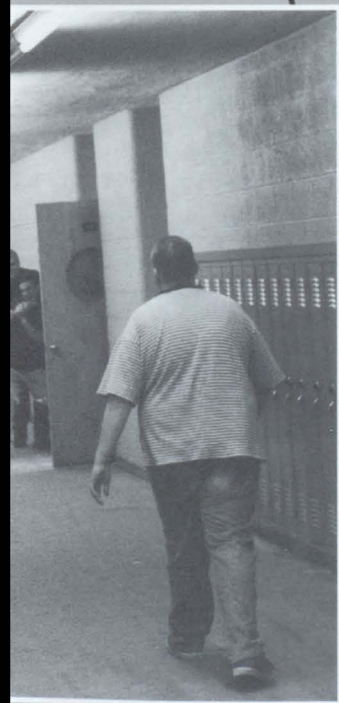




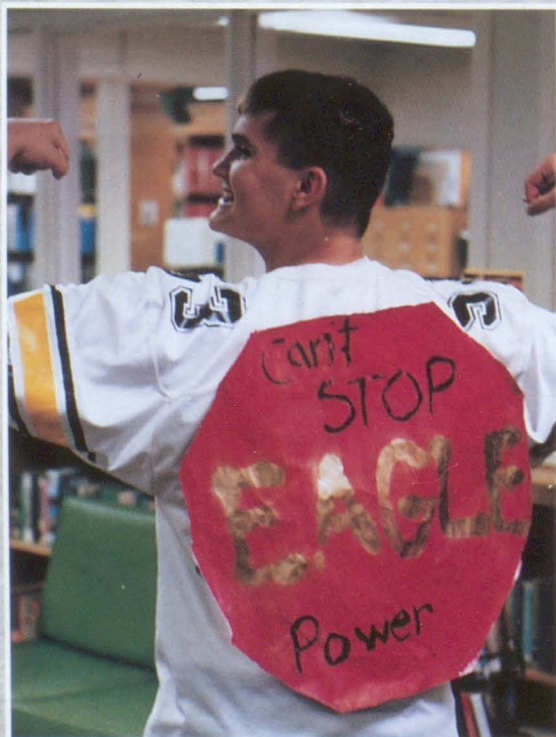
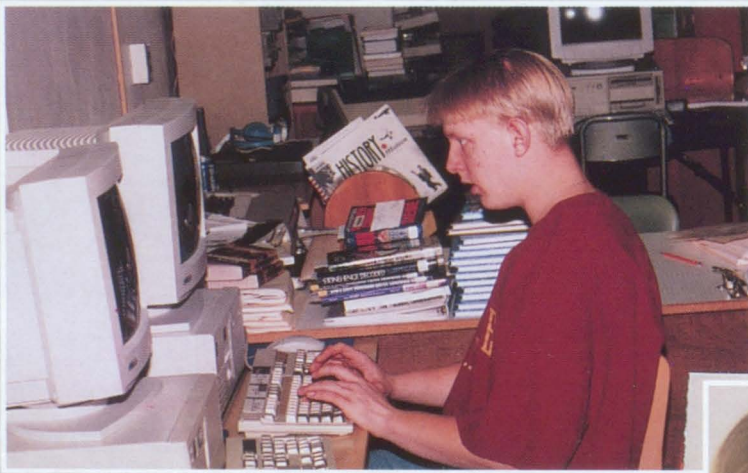
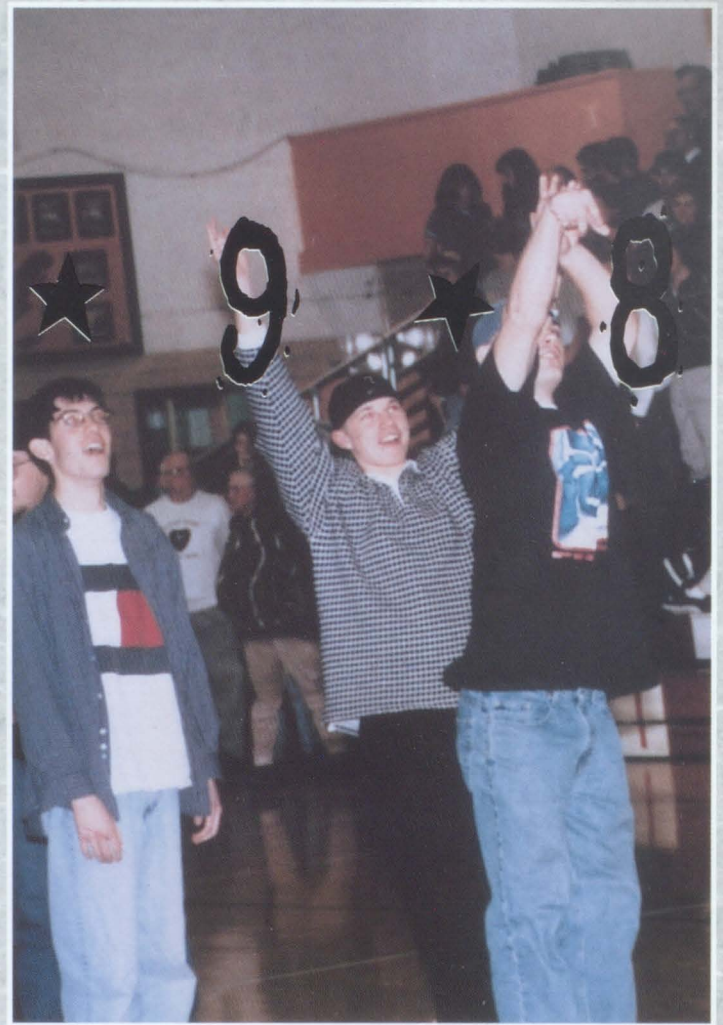
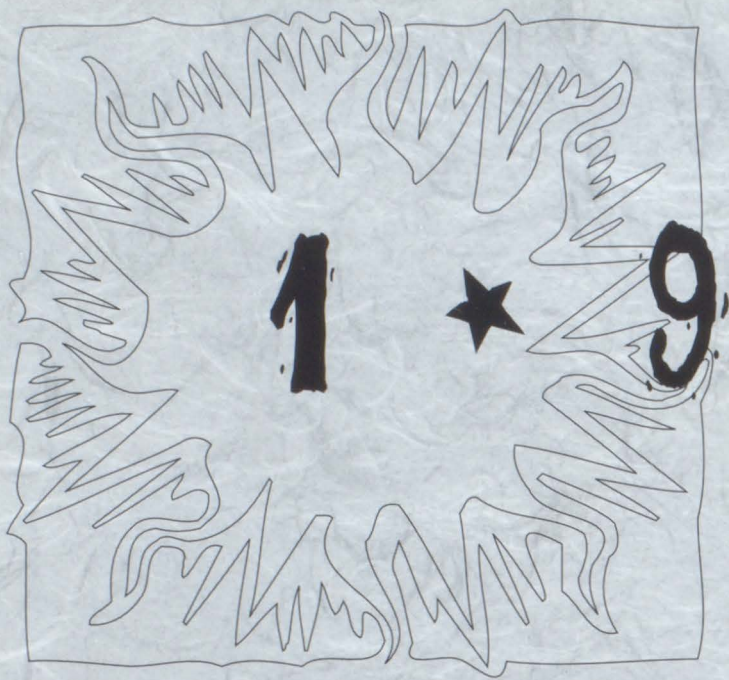


# Going to pieces...

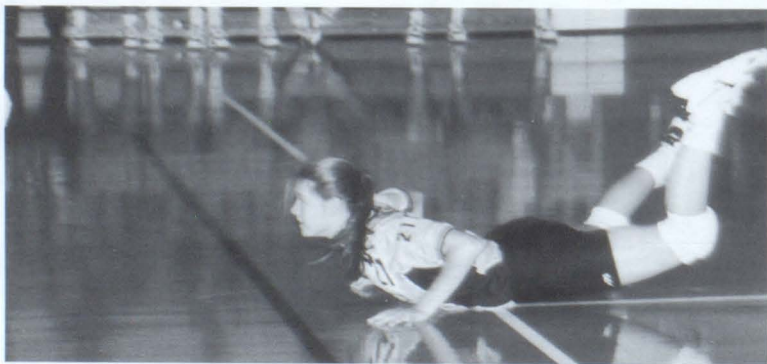


# VOLLEYBALL

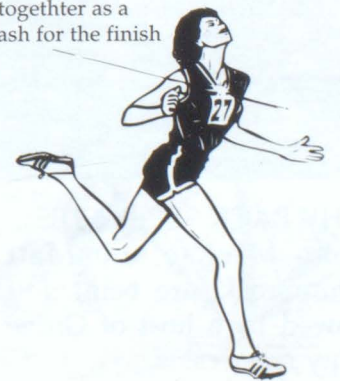

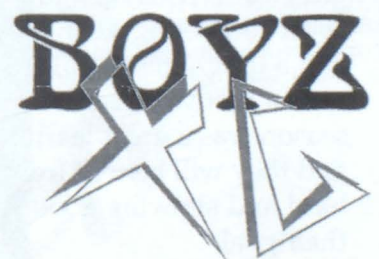

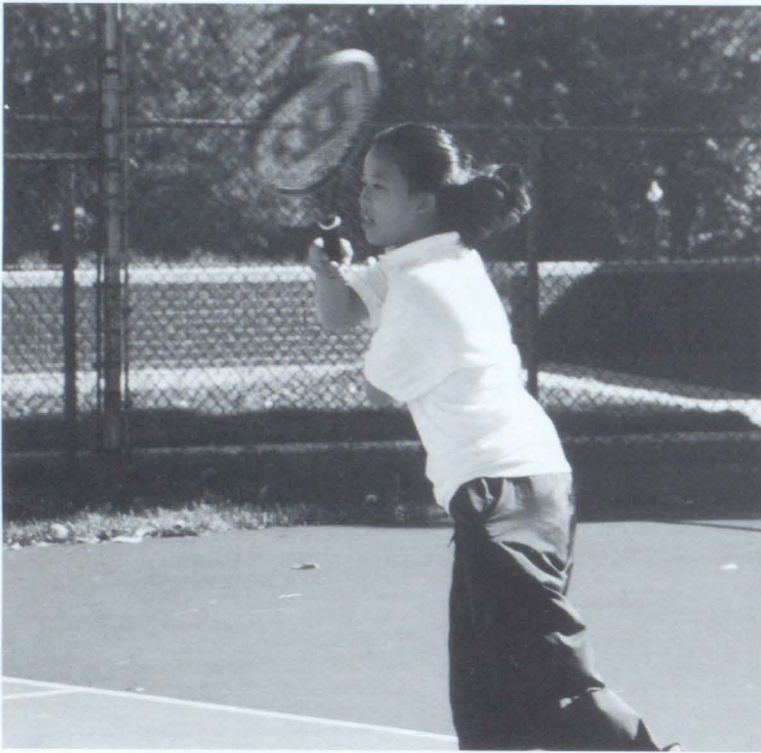

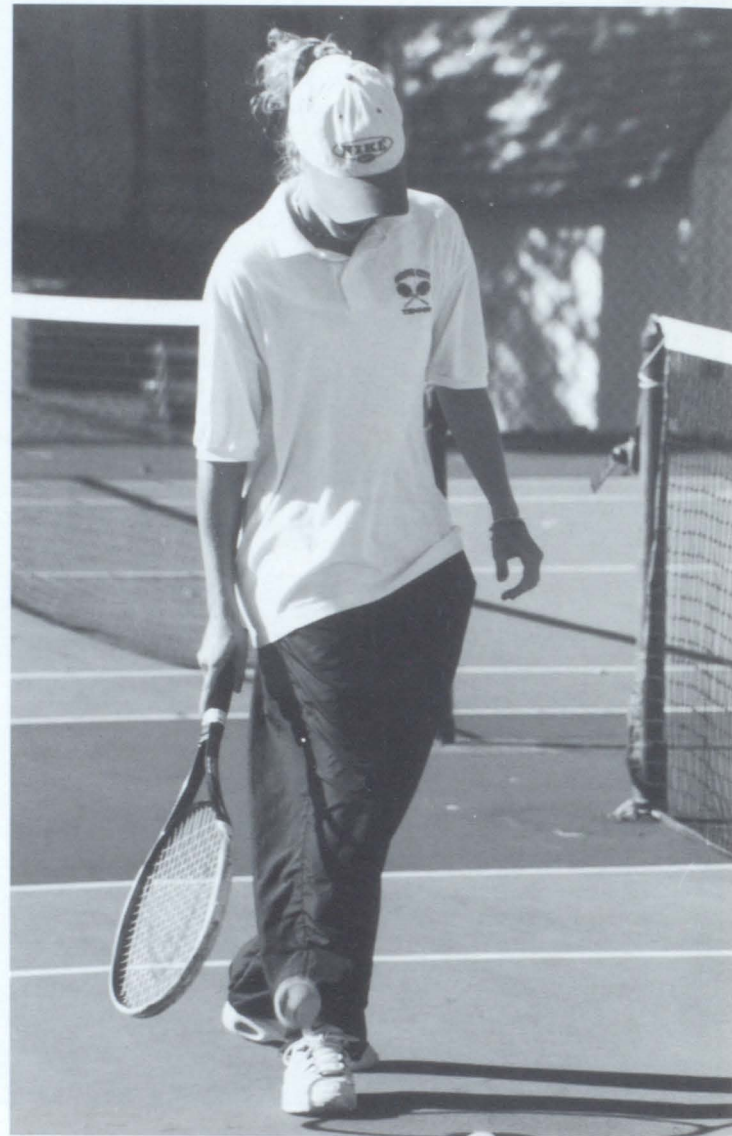

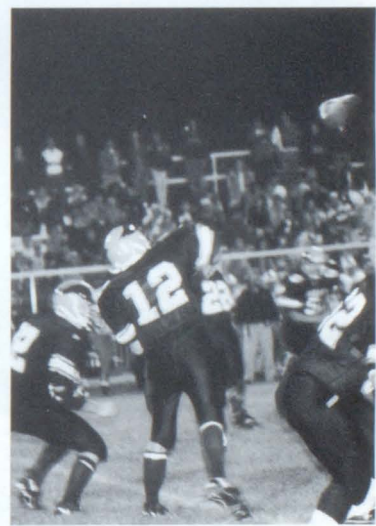

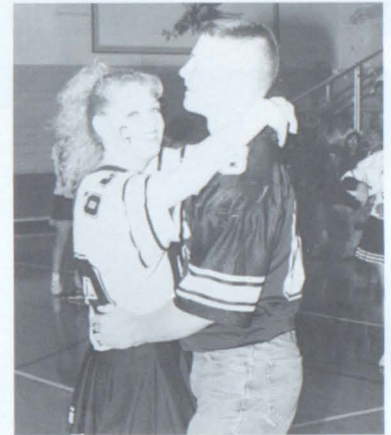

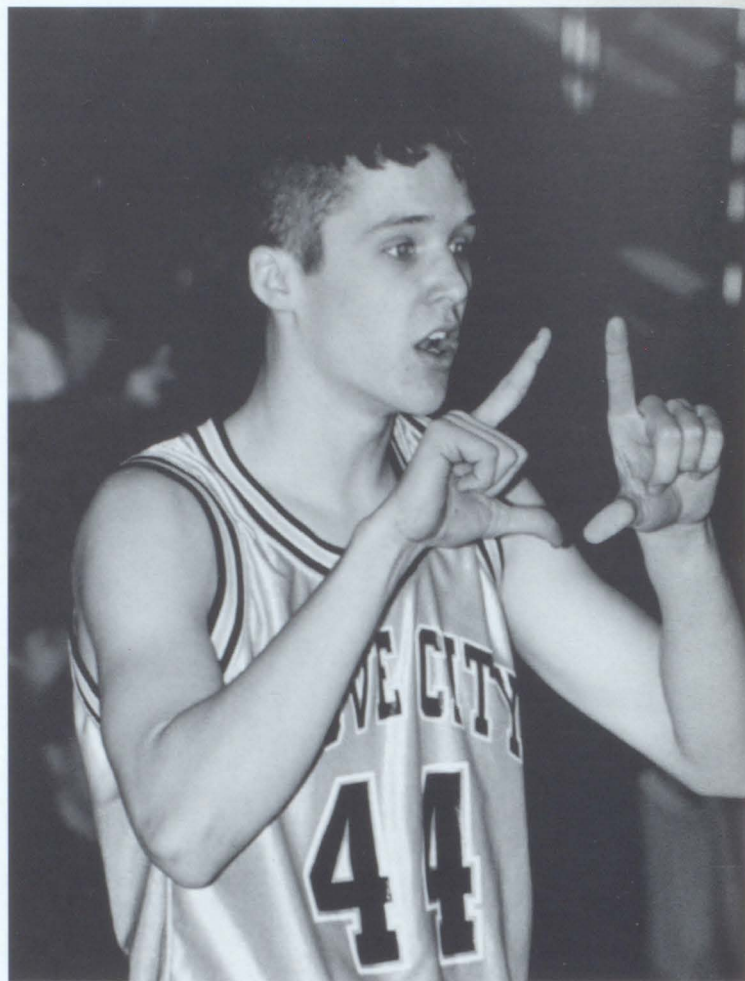

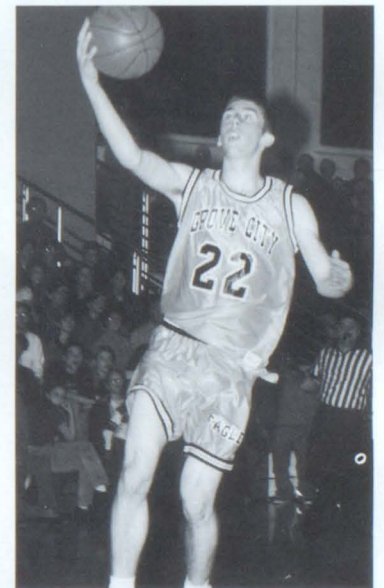

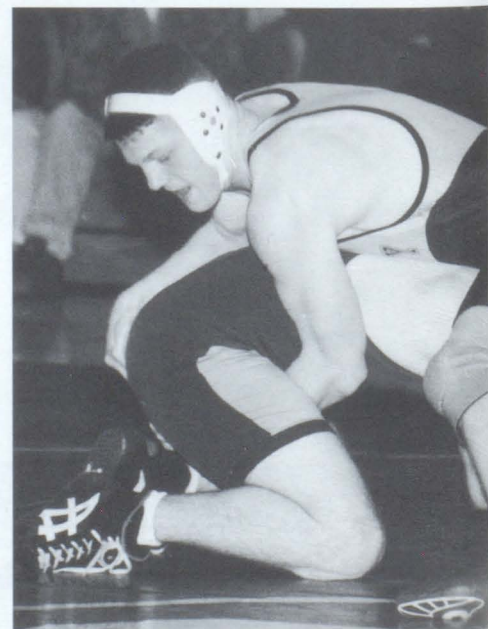


# GROVE CITY WRESTLING

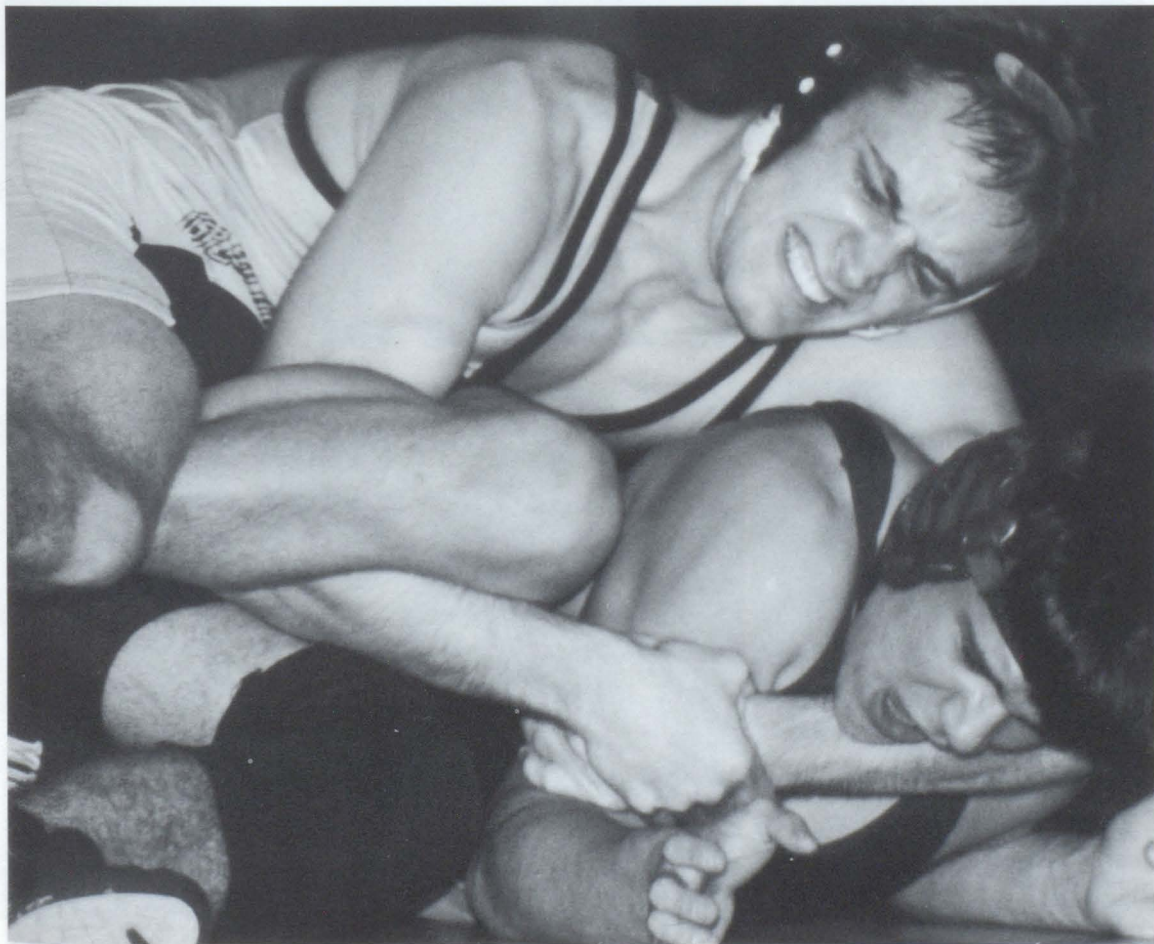

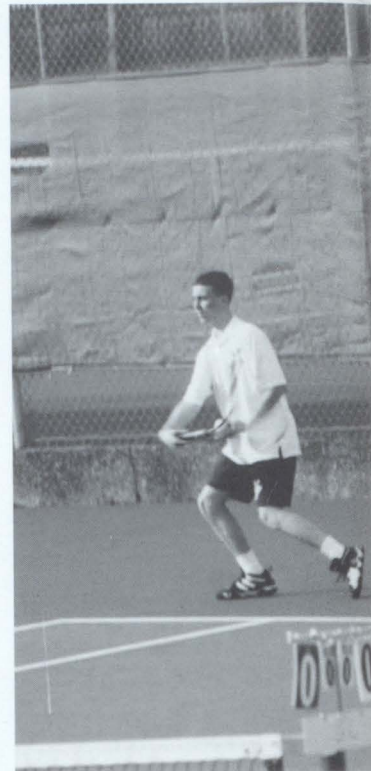

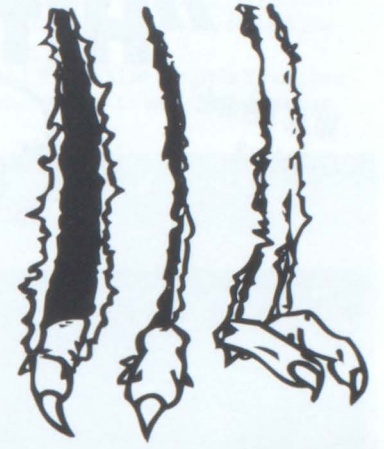

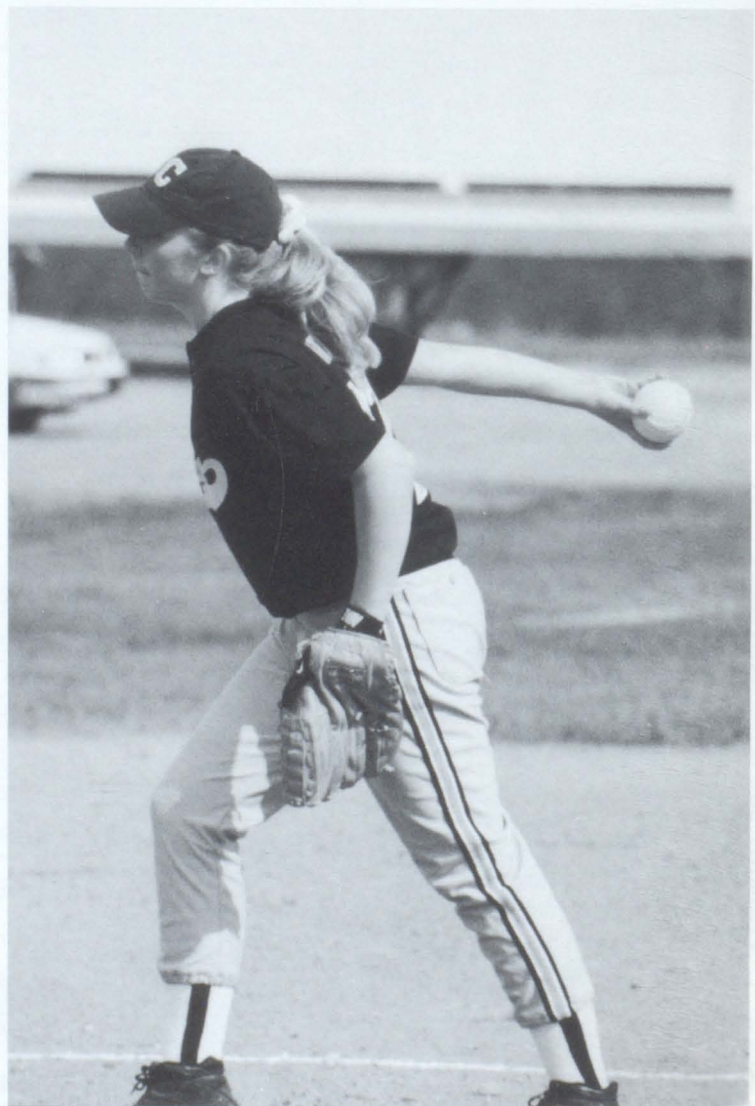

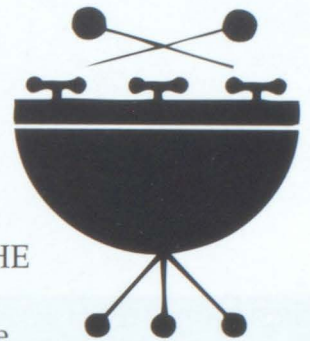

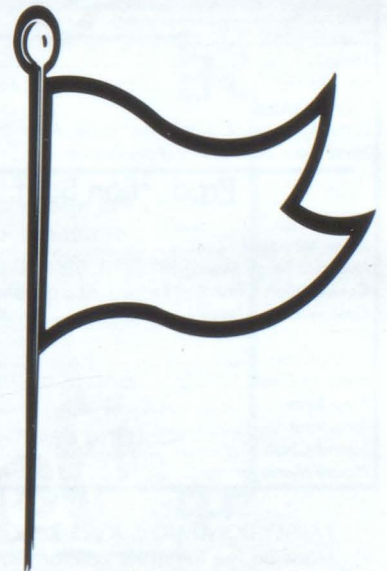

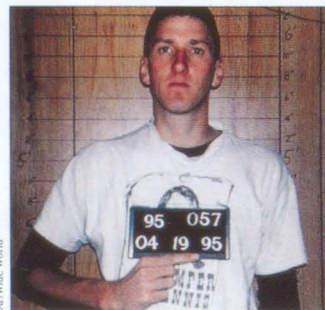

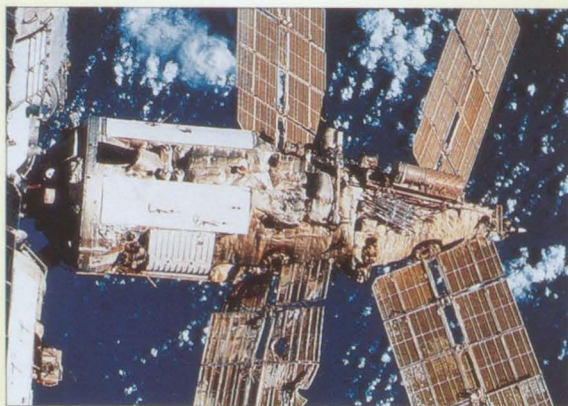

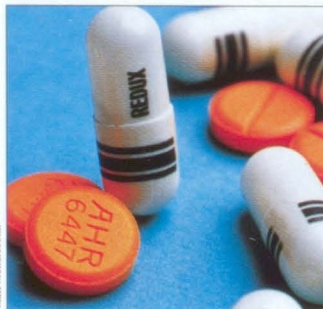

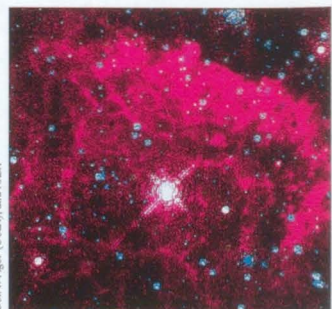

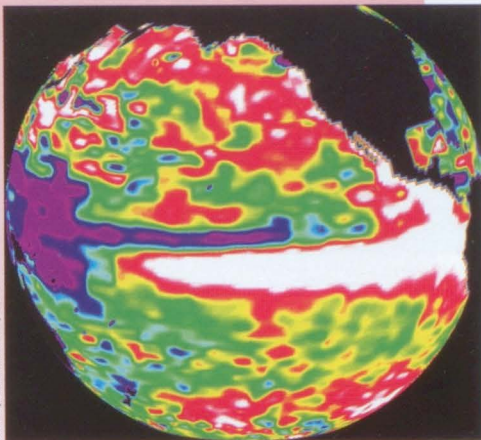

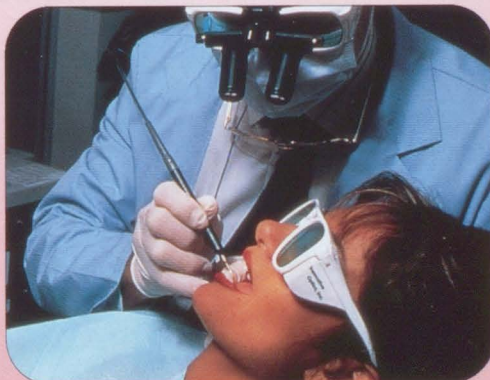

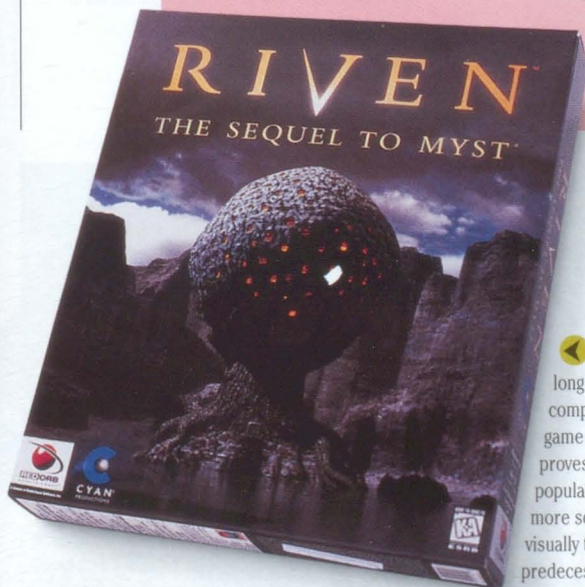

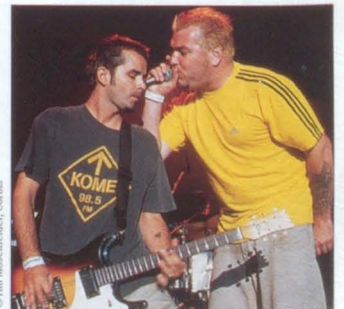

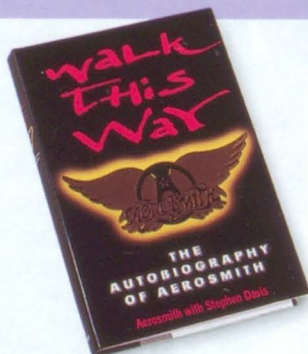

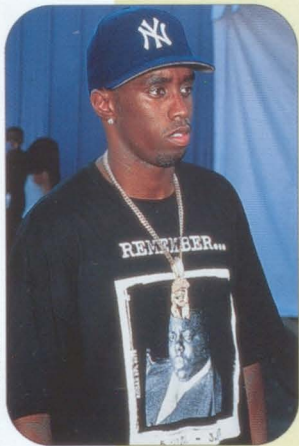

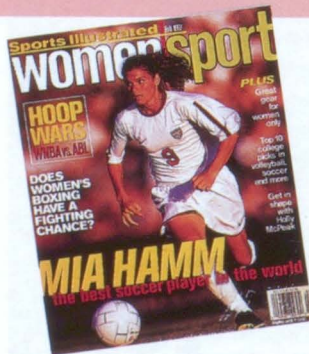

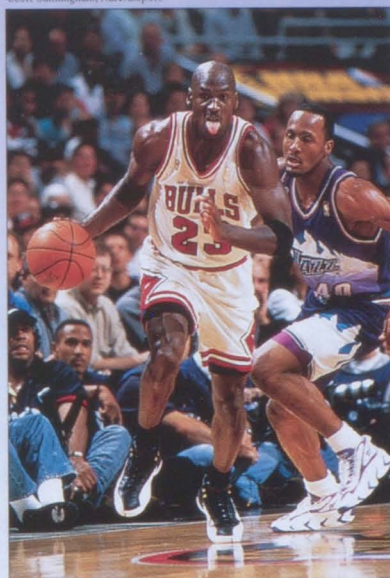

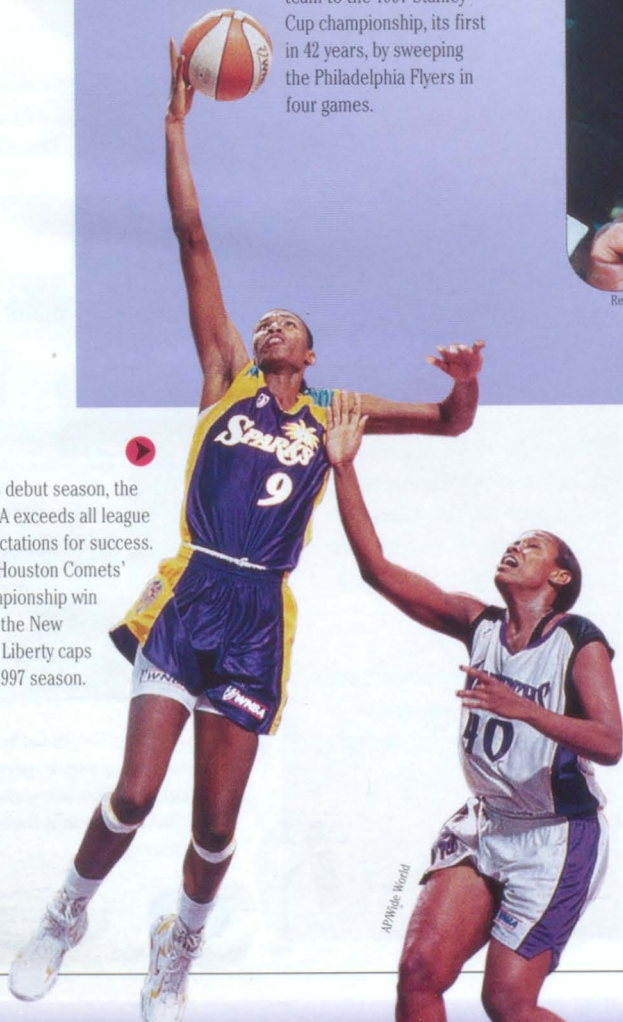

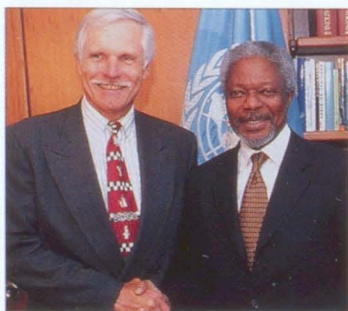
